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- 1 PROCEEDINGS
- 2 JUDGE JORDAN: And there we are. We are on the
- 3 record, and we are recording now. Missouri Public Service
- 4 Commission is calling Case Number SC-2008-0409, Scrivner
- 5 versus House Springs Sewer Company. The parties --
- 6 counsel make their entry of appearance, please?
- 7 MR. MILLER: Danny Miller for House Springs
- 8 Sewer Company.
- 9 MR. HAAS: William K. Haas, appearing for the
- 10 Staff of the Public Service Commission.
- 11 JUDGE JORDAN: And for the record, who else is
- 12 present, Counsel?
- 13 MR. MILLER: Pat Fribis on behalf of House
- 14 Springs Sewer Company.
- MR. HAAS: And we have three Staff members
- 16 present, Jim Busch, Jim Merciel and Steve Loethen.
- 17 JUDGE JORDAN: Well, Counselors, I don't see our
- 18 Petitioners present. Have you seen them in the building?
- 19 MR. MILLER: I have not.
- 20 JUDGE JORDAN: Have you had any communications
- 21 from them as to whether they will appear?
- MR. HAAS: We have not.
- JUDGE JORDAN: I haven't either. We have waited
- 24 until 10:15.
- MR. MILLER: Well, I think we may have --

- 1 JUDGE JORDAN: No. No. That's the Commission's
- 2 advisor.
- 3 MR. MILLER: Oh, okay.
- 4 MR. SMITH: Hello. Everything good?
- 5 JUDGE JORDAN: As far as I know. I didn't mute
- 6 it and we're recording.
- 7 MR. SMITH: We're streaming, recording. We're
- 8 good.
- 9 JUDGE VOSS: Who are you looking for?
- 10 JUDGE JORDAN: We're looking for the
- 11 Petitioners, and they have not appeared. So I will ask
- 12 Counsel how you wish to proceed.
- MR. MILLER: One, Judge, we can either -- I
- 14 mean, I'm happy to either take a default -- you know your
- 15 procedures here better than I do. I mean, I'm happy to
- 16 request that it be dismissed, or if you want to hear the
- 17 evidence and make a decision based upon that, I'm happy to
- 18 do that, too.
- 19 JUDGE JORDAN: Okay. Counsel for Staff?
- 20 MR. HAAS: We don't have a position. Thank you.
- 21 JUDGE JORDAN: So you don't have any preference
- 22 as to whether you want to make a record today on this or
- 23 simply dismiss for failure to prosecute?
- MR. HAAS: We don't have a position on that.
- 25 We're a neutral party in this.

- JUDGE JORDAN: All right. Right. And,
- 2 Counselor, you're happy either way?
- 3 MR. MILLER: I'm happy either way, Judge.
- 4 JUDGE JORDAN: All right.
- 5 JUDGE VOSS: Are you on the record?
- 6 JUDGE JORDAN: I'm sorry?
- 7 JUDGE VOSS: Are you on the record?
- 8 JUDGE JORDAN: We are on the record. We are on
- 9 the record. Yes.
- 10 MR. MILLER: I see no need to do the evidence
- 11 unless there's a possibility if you would consider if they
- 12 showed up later going, Well, gee, set the default aside
- 13 and -- and re-do it. If that's not a possibility, then it
- 14 would be an additional waste of time to sit and present
- 15 evidence.
- 16 JUDGE JORDAN: Well, and I'm -- I'm mindful of
- 17 the party's resources. So what I will do, if someone is
- 18 inclined to make one, is entertain a Motion to Dismiss for
- 19 failure to prosecute. And that will go -- that will have
- 20 to go to a session. The Commission's -- dismissals occur
- 21 through the Commission's action. And unless the
- 22 Petitioners make some kind of communication with the
- 23 Commission before that happens, then the Commission will
- 24 very likely dismiss the case for failure to prosecute.
- MR. MILLER: Judge, let's do that.

JUDGE JORDAN: All right. Okay. Let's take a five minute recess, if you please. (Break in proceedings.) JUDGE JORDAN: And we will go back on the record now. And we are back on the record in the case of Scrivner versus House Springs Sewer Company. We have a Motion to Dismiss for failure to prosecute pending. MR. MILLER: Correct. JUDGE JORDAN: Petitioners still have not appeared or made any communication. And so with that, I will adjourn this hearing, unless there's anything else. Then this hearing is adjourned.
