NOTICE AND ORDER SETTING HEARING

Issue Date: September 11, 2014 Effective Date: September 11, 2014

On November 20, 2013, Peaceful Valley Service Company ("Company") submitted a written request to the Commission for an increase in water and sewer revenue. On April 24, 2014, Company filed with the Commission revised tariff sheets with a June 15, 2014 effective date. The Staff of the Missouri Public Service Commission and Company filed a disposition agreement, for which the Office of Public Counsel did not request an evidentiary hearing. Directing the Commission to set just and reasonable rates, Commission Rule 4 CSR 240-3.050(25) states the Commission may approve, reject or alter a disposition agreement.

As directed by the Commission, the Staff of the Missouri Public Service Commission filed a report on Company's plans for compliance with guidelines set by the Missouri Department of Natural Resources ("DNR"). As part of its review of the tariffs submitted by Company and the disposition agreement, the Commission seeks additional information on the compliance plan that are not addressed in the disposition agreement. Therefore, the Commission will set an evidentiary hearing.

The Commission requests Mr. August B. Hoernschmeyer appear at the scheduled hearing to provide testimony, including on the following topics: the Company's planned change of corporate status; discussions with DNR on scheduled improvements; financing options considered by the Company for DNR improvements; the disposition agreement; and Staff's August 15, 2014 memorandum. All parties may present evidence at hearing, and are not limited to the subjects previously identified.

Commission Rule 4 CSR 240-2.040(5) prohibits practice before the Commission by nonattorneys when representing other persons or entities. The "practice of law" is defined under Section 484.010, RSMo 2000, as the appearance as an advocate in a representative capacity or the drawing of papers, pleadings or documents or the performance of any act in such capacity in connection with proceedings pending before a commission.

Company does not have an attorney of record in these matters.¹ The Commission hereby provides notice to the Company that should it wish to perform any activities considered to be the practice of law – such as cross-examining witnesses, objecting to testimony, or making opening statements – it must be represented by an attorney.

THE COMMISSION ORDERS THAT:

An evidentiary hearing will be held at 10:30 a.m. on September 23, 2014,
at the Commission's office at the Governor Office Building, 200 Madison Street,
Jefferson City, Missouri, Room 310. This building meets accessibility standards required

- 4. Parties shall submit a list of their known witnesses no later than September 19, 2014. The list of witnesses may be amended at any time up to and including the hearing.
