STAFF RECOMMENDATION

COMES NOW the Staff of the Missouri Public Service Commission (Staff) and for its recommendation states:

- 1. In the attached Memorandum, which is labeled Appendix A, the Staff recommends that the Missouri Public Service Commission (Commission) grant Vectris Telecom, Inc. (Applicant) a certificate of authority to provide basic local exchange telecommunications services. The Commission shall grant an application for a certificate of telecommunications service authority upon a finding that the grant of authority is in the public interest. (See §§ 392.430 and 392.440 RSMo 1994.)
- 2. Staff also recommends that the Commission classify the Applicant and its services as competitive. The Commission may classify a telecommunications provider or its services as competitive if the Commission determines it is subject to sufficient competition to justify a lesser degree of regulation. (See §392.361.2 RSMo 1994.) All the services a competitive company provides must be classified as competitive. (See §392.361.3 RSMo 1994.)
- 3. Staff further recommends that the Commission approve the waivers listed in the Notice of Application. The Commission may waive the application of its rules and certain

statutes if the Commission determines that waiver is consistent with the purposes of Chapter 392 RSMo. (See §§ 392.361.3 and 392.420 RSMo 1994, and § 392.185 RSMo Supp. 1999.)

WHEREFORE, Staff recommends that the Commission grant Vectris Telecom, Inc. a certificate of service authority to provide basic local exchange telecommunications, grant Applicant competitive classification, approve Applicant's proposed tariff, PSC MO No. 1 with a proposed effective date of February 12, 2000, and approve the waivers listed in the Notice of Applications.

On January 7, 2000, Vectris Telecom, Inc. (Vectris) submitted an Application for Certificate of Service Authority to Provide Basic Local Exchange Telecommunications Services. On January 11, 2000, the Missouri Public Service Commission (Commission) issued a Notice of Applications that established an intervention deadline of February 10, 2000. No parties filed for intervention in the case.

Vectris requests classification as a competitive telecommunications carrier and proposes to provide resold and facilities-based basic local telecommunications services in portions of Missouri that are currently served by three incumbent local exchange carriers (ILECs). The ILECs are Southwestern Bell Telephone Company (SWBT), GTE Midwest, Inc. (GTE), and United Telephone Company of Missouri d/b/a/ Sprint (Sprint). Vectris refers to the lists of exchanges appearing in the tariffs of SWBT, GTE, and Sprint as the specific exchanges in which it requests authority to serve.

Vectris requested a temporary waiver of 4 CSR 240-2.060(4)(H) which requires applicants to file a tariff. Vectris submitted copies of its Certificate of Service Authority from the Missouri Secretary of State, a brief description of the qualifications and experience of Vectris' key management employees, and a copy of Vectris' financial statements (under protective order). A copy of the Financial Analysis Department's Comments is attached.

Vectris' Application states that it will comply with all billing, quality of service, and tariff requirements of the Commission. It also states that Vectris will offer basic local telecommunications service as a separate and distinct service, and give consideration to equitable access for all Missourians within the geographic area in which it proposes to offer basic local service, regardless of whey they live or their income.

The aforementioned waivers are routinely granted to competitive local exchange carriers.

Vectris states that it "initially intends to provide data transmission services only, but requests authority to provide all forms of basic local exchange telecommunications service.... [Services will be provided] through its own electronic equipment collocated at ILEC central offices, through the use of unbundled network elements leased from other certificated carriers, and/or through the resale of the service of other carriers."

The Telecommunications Department Staff (Staff) has reviewed Vectris' Application and concludes that:

- 1. Vectris possesses sufficient technical, financial, and managerial resources to provide basic local exchange telecommunications service. In Exhibits 2 and 3 to its Application, Vectris demonstrates its technical, financial and managerial resources and abilities.
- 2. Vectris has sufficiently identified the geographic area in which it proposes to offer basic local service and the area follows exchange boundaries of the ILECs and is no smaller than an exchange.
- 3. Vectris will provide basic local exchange service as a separate and distinct service.
- 4. Vectris has demonstrated that the services it proposes to offer satisfy the minimum standards established by the Commission and that it will comply with those minimum standards.
- 5. Vectris will provide equitable access to affordable telecommunications services for all Missourians, regardless of where they live or their income.

Therefore, the Staff recommends the Commission grant Vectris a Certificate of Service Authority to Provide Basic Local Telecommunications with the following condition: If Vectris later provides access service, its originating and terminating access rates will be no greater than the lowest Commission approved corresponding access rates in effect for each ILEC within whose service area Vectris seeks authority to provide service, unless authorized by the Commission pursuant to Sections 392.220 and 392.230 RSMo. Staff also recommends that the Commission order Vectris to file a tariff within thirty (30) days following the Commission's approval of an interconnection agreement, and that the filed tariff have an effective date forty-five (45) days following the date the tariff is filed with the Commission. Additionally, Staff recommends that Vectris be classified as a competitive telecommunications carrier and that Vectris' certificate become effective when its tariff becomes effective. Lastly, Staff recommends the Commission grant Vectris waivers of the previously mentioned Commission rules and statutes.

The Staff is unaware of any other filing which affects, or which would be affected by, this filing. Vectris has not filed any proposed interconnection agreements with this Commission.
