On April 15, 2005, Nathan and Leah Godsey filed a complaint with the Missouri Public Service Commission against AquaSource. A copy of the complaint is enclosed. The Godseys filed a Motion for Expedited Treatment along with their complaint. In that motion, they explain that the house they are building is substantially complete but cannot be occupied because of AquaSource's refusal to allow the house to be

connected to its sewer system. The Godseys request that the Commission act on their complaint by May 15.
