ORDER GRANTING CERTIFICATE OF SERVICE AUTHORITY

Group Long Distance, Inc. (GLD) applied to the Commission on September 10, 1997, for a certificate of service authority to provide basic local telecommunications service¹ in Missouri under Sections 392.420 - .440, RSMo 1994,² and Sections 392.410 and .450, RSMo Supp. 1996. GLD asked the Commission to classify it as a competitive company and waive certain statutes and rules as authorized by Sections 392.361 and 392.420. GLD is a Florida corporation with its principal place of business at 1451 West Cypress Creek Road, Suite 2001, Fort Lauderdale, Florida 33309.

The Commission issued an Order and Notice on November 12, directing parties wishing to intervene in the case to do so by December 12. No applications to intervene were filed. The Staff of the Commission (Staff) filed a memorandum on April 6, 1998, in which it recommended

approval of GLD's application. No party responded to the Staff's recommendation. The requirement for a hearing is met when the opportunity for hearing has been provided and no proper party has requested the opportunity to present evidence. <u>State ex rel. Rex Deffenderfer</u> <u>Enterprises, Inc. v. Public Service Commission</u>, 776 S.W.2d 494, 496 (Mo. App. 1989). Since no one has asked permission to participate or requested a hearing in this case, the Commission may grant the relief requested based on the verified application and the Staff's recommendation.

Background

GLD, which is certificated to provide intrastate interexchange services in Missouri, wishes certification to provide resold basic local telecommunications service. GLD wants to provide basic local services in portions of Missouri that are currently served by Southwestern Bell Telephone Company (SWBT), GTE Midwest Incorporated (GTE) and Sprint Missouri, Inc. (Sprint). GLD is not asking for certification in any area that is served by a small incumbent local exchange provider (ILEC). The specific exchanges in which GLD proposes to operate are described in Exhibit IV to the Second Amended Application that was filed on November 4 (Attachment A to this order). GLD is requesting that its basic local exchange services be classified as competitive and that the application of certain statutes and regulatory rules be waived.

Discussion

A. Requirements of 4 CSR 240-2.060(4)

Commission rule 4 CSR 240-2.060(4) requires a foreign corporation applying for certification to provide telecommunications services to include in its application a certificate from the Secretary of State

showing it is authorized to do business in Missouri, a description of the types of service it intends to provide, a description of the exchanges where it will offer service, and a proposed tariff with a 45-day effective date. GLD has provided all the required documentation except for the proposed tariff. The company has requested a temporary waiver of 4 CSR 240-2.060(4)(H) because it is impractical for GLD to submit a tariff until it has executed interconnection agreements with the ILECs involved. GLD cannot price its resold services until it has reached price agreements with the ILECs from which it will purchase those services.

B. Basic local service certification

Section 392.455, RSMo Supp. 1996, sets out the requirements for granting certificates to provide basic local telecommunications service to new entrants. A new entrant must: (1) possess sufficient technical, financial and managerial resources and abilities to provide basic local telecommunications service; (2) demonstrate that the services it proposes to offer satisfy the minimum standards established by the Commission; (3) set forth the geographic area in which it proposes to offer service and demonstrate that such area follows exchange boundaries of the incumbent local exchange telecommunications company and is no smaller than an exchange; and (4) offer basic local telecommunications service as a separate and distinct service. In addition, the Commission must give due consideration to equitable access for all Missourians to affordable telecommunications services, regardless of where they live or their income.

1. Technical, financial and managerial resources and abilities. GLD submitted Exhibit II with its application that lists the names and qualifications of its executive officers. In addition to academic credentials, the team members have experience in various areas of the

telecommunications industry including technical, administrative, accounting, marketing and finance services. GLD also submitted as Exhibit III its SEC Form 10-K for the fiscal year ended April 30, 1997. The Staff reviewed this financial information and recommended approval of GLD's application despite the fact that GLD is growing at a pace that may create cash flow problems for it in the future. The Staff stated that GLD possesses sufficient technical, financial and managerial resources and abilities to provide basic local telecommunications service.

2. The entrant's proposed services satisfy the minimum standards established by the Commission. GLD has stated that it will meet the Commission's minimum basic local service standards, including quality of service and billing standards.

3. The geographic area in which the company proposes to offer service. GLD set out in Exhibit IV to its Second Amended Application all the exchanges in which it proposes to offer services. GLD has defined its service area by means of the tariffed exchange areas of the ILECs presently providing basic local service in those exchanges. Exhibit IV consists of Commission-approved tariff sheets filed by SWBT, GTE and Sprint, and describing local exchanges. The company has agreed that its service area must follow ILEC exchange boundaries and be no smaller than an exchange. The Staff stated that GLD has sufficiently identified the geographic area in which it proposes to offer basic local service and that the area follows ILEC exchange boundaries and is no smaller than an exchange.

4. The offering of basic local telecommunications service as a separate and distinct service. GLD has stated that it will offer basic local telecommunications service as a separate and distinct service.

5. Equitable access for all Missourians to affordable telecommunications services. GLD has not stated in its amended application that it will provide equitable access for all Missourians within the geographic area in which it will offer basic local services. However, the Commission notes that this is a requirement for the provision of basic local service under Section 392.455(5), RSMo Supp. 1996, and that GLD will be required to provide equitable access by law once it is certificated, whether or not GLD has made a representation that it will do so.

C. Competitive classification

The Commission may classify a telecommunications provider as a competitive company if the Commission determines it is subject to sufficient competition to justify a lesser degree of regulation. § 392.361.2. In making that determination the Commission may consider such factors as market share, financial resources and name recognition, among others. In the matter of the investigation for the purpose of determining the classification of the services provided by interexchange telecommunication companies within the State of Missouri, 30 Mo. P.S.C. (N.S.) 16 (1989); In the matter of Southwestern Bell Telephone Company's application for classification of certain services as transitionally competitive, 1 Mo. P.S.C. 3d 479, 484 (1992). In addition, all the services a competitive company provides must be classified as competitive. § 392.361.3. The Commission has found that whether a service is competitive is a subject to case-by-case examination and that different criteria may be given greater weight depending upon the service being considered. Id. at 487.

Staff recommends that GLD be classified as a competitive telecommunications company. Staff also recommends that any switched exchange access service offered by GLD in the future be classified as a

competitive service, conditioned upon certain limitations on GLD's ability to charge for its access services. Staff recommends that, unless otherwise ordered by the Commission, GLD's originating and terminating access rates should be no greater than the lowest Commission-approved corresponding access rates in effect at the date of certification for the large incumbent LECs within those service areas in which GLD seeks to operate. According to Staff, the Commission's grant of service authority and competitive classification to GLD should be expressly conditioned on the continued applicability of Section 392.200, RSMo Supp. 1996, and on the requirement that any increases in switched access services rates above the maximum switched access service rates set forth in the agreement must be costjustified pursuant to Sections 392.220, RSMo Supp. 1996, and 392.230, rather than Sections 392.500 and 392.510. These conditions have been imposed on other certificated competitive local exchange carriers in Missouri.

Staff stated that GLD's application contains a request for the standard waivers granted to interexchange carriers. However, Staff has spoken with representatives of GLD who clarified that this reuest was a mistake. GLD actually desires to have the standard set of statute and rule waivers that are waived for other basic local telecommunications providers waived for it, as well. Staff states that waiver of the following statutes is therefore appropriate: Sections 392.210.2, 392.270, 392.280, 392.290.1, 392.300.2, 392.310, 392.320, 392.330, RSMo Supp. 1996, and 392.340. The Commission also finds that application of these Commission rules should be waived: 4 CSR 240-10.020, 4 CSR 240-30.040, and 4 CSR 240-35.

Findings of Fact

The Missouri Public Service Commission, having considered all of the competent and substantial evidence upon the whole record, makes the following findings of fact:

- A. The Commission finds that competition in the basic local exchange telecommunications markets is in the public interest.
- B. The Commission finds that GLD has met the requirements of 4 CSR 240-2.060(4) for applicants for certificates of service authority to provide telecommunications services with the exception of the filing of a tariff with a 45-day effective date.
- C. The Commission finds that GLD has demonstrated good cause to support a temporary waiver of the tariff filing requirement and the waiver shall be granted.
- The Commission finds that GLD meets the statutory requirements D. for provision of basic local telecommunications services and has agreed to abide by those requirements in the future. The Commission determines that granting GLD a certificate of exchange service authority to provide basic local telecommunications services is in the public interest. GLD's certificate shall become effective when its tariff becomes effective.
- E. The Commission finds that GLD is a competitive company and shall be granted waiver of the statutes and rules set out in Ordered Paragraph 3.
- F. The Commission finds that GLD's certification and competitive status are expressly conditioned upon the continued

applicability of Section 392.200, RSMo Supp. 1996, and on the requirement that any increases in switched access services rates above the maximum switched access service rates set forth in the agreement must be cost-justified pursuant to Sections 392.220, RSMo Supp. 1996, and 392.230, rather than Sections 392.500 and 392.510.

Conclusions of Law

The Missouri Public Service Commission has reached the following conclusions of law:

The Commission has the authority to grant certificates of service authority to provide telecommunications service within the state of Missouri. GLD has requested certification under Sections 392.420 - .440, and Sections 392.410 and .450, RSMo Supp. 1996. Those statutes permit the Commission to grant a certificate of service authority where the grant of authority is in the public interest. Sections 392.361 and .420 authorize the Commission to modify or suspend the application of its rules and certain statutory provisions for companies classified as competitive or transitionally competitive.

The federal Telecommunications Act of 1996 and Sections 392.185 and 392.455, RSMo Supp. 1996, were designed to institute competition in the basic local exchange telecommunications market in order to benefit all telecommunications consumers. Section 392.185, RSMo Supp. 1996, states that "the provisions of this chapter shall be construed to: (1) Promote universally available and widely affordable telecommunications services; . . . (3) Promote diversity in the supply of telecommunications services and products throughout the state of Missouri; . . . (6) Allow full and fair competition to function as a substitute for regulation when

consistent with the protection of ratepayers and otherwise consistent with the public interest . . ."

Based upon the information contained within GLD's verified application as amended, the Staff's recommendation, and its findings of fact, the Commission concludes that the relief requested by GLD should be granted.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

1. That the application of Group Long Distance, Inc. is approved.

2. That Group Long Distance, Inc. is granted a certificate of service authority to provide basic local telecommunications services in the state of Missouri to become effective when the company's tariff becomes effective, subject to all applicable statutes and Commission rules except as specified in this order.

3. That Group Long Distance, Inc. is classified as a competitive telecommunications company. Application of the following statutes and regulatory rules shall be waived:

4. That the filing of a 45-day tariff as required by 4 CSR 240-2.060(4)(H) is waived until Group Long Distance, Inc. has entered into a Commission-approved interconnection agreement that enables it to provide basic local exchange services.

5. That Group Long Distance, Inc. shall file tariff sheets for approval reflecting the rates, rule, regulations and the services it will offer within 30 days after Commission approval of the necessary interconnection agreement(s). The tariff shall be filed in Case No. TO-98-112 and shall include a listing of the statutes and Commission rules waived under Ordered Paragraph 3.

6. That Group Long Distance, Inc. shall give notice of the filing of the tariffs described in Ordered Paragraph 5 to all parties or participants. In addition, Group Long Distance, Inc. shall file a written disclosure of all interconnection agreements which affect its Missouri service areas, all portions of Missouri service areas for which it does not have an interconnection agreement, and an explanation of why no interconnection agreement is necessary for those areas.

7. That Group Long Distance, Inc.'s certification and competitive status are expressly conditioned upon the continued applicability of Section 392.200, RSMo Supp. 1996, and on the requirement that any increases in switched access service rates above the maximum switched access service rates set forth in the agreement must be cost-justified pursuant to Sections 392.220, RSMo Supp. 1996, and 392.230, rather than Sections 392.500 and 392.510.

8. That this order shall become effective on May 18, 1998.
