   with a plan to finally resolve the case.
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1 Missouri Landowners has proposed that the 2 Commission direct Grain Belt and other parties to answer a series of questions in order to update the 3 record. And while I appreciate the idea of not 5 re-litigating the entire case, which we are not going 6 to do, it wouldn't be appropriate for the Commission 7 to direct parties to answer questions in that manner. 8 I think that can be handled through discovery. 9 But the evidentiary record is stale because of the length of time that's passed. We think 10 11 the best way to correct that would be to have first 12 Grain Belt to file Supplemental Direct Testimony that would update or correct any of its previously filed 13 14 Direct Testimony that's materially changed. The other parties would have a chance to file Rebuttal 15 responding to that Supplemental Direct, filed by 16 17 Surrebuttal. 18 Now, Grain Belt has proposed that we skip Surrebuttal entirely, but we think that Surrebuttal 19 20 would be valuable to help narrow the issues, even if we have to shorten the time for filing it. But I 21 22 think that we would end up with a better record at the 23 end. 24 After the pre-filed testimony and any discovery, the Commission would conduct a supplemental 25

1 evidentiary hearing to permit cross-examination 2 regarding the new testimony. We should also have some briefing afterwards. And I don't have any preference 3 about whether it's one or two rounds of briefs. 5 So I would like Grain Belt Express, on 6 behalf of all the parties, to file a joint proposed 7 procedural schedule no later than next Wednesday, 8 October 17th. And you should include any provisions 9 or suggestions on how the Commission should proceed, and also any specific discovery provisions that you 10 can all agree to. 11 12 And if for some reason you cannot agree on these matters, then parties do have an opportunity 13 14 to provide or file their own separate procedural schedule if necessary. Of course, the Commissioners 15 are going to make the final decision on the schedule. 16 17 Does anybody have any other matters that need to be brought up on the record while we're here? 18 19 MR. ZOBRIST: Judge, I just have one 20 comment. You talked about post-hearing briefing. would propose also to update proposed findings of 21 fact, maybe conclusions of law, but we think the major 22 23 legal issue has been resolved. Would that be helpful to the Commission? 24 25 JUDGE BUSHMANN: It could be. And if you

1	want to include that in your proposal, then I'll take
2	it to the Commissioners and we'll see what they want
3	to do on that.
4	Anybody else have anything that we need
5	to discuss?
6	MR. JOHNSON: Judge, are there any
7	specific weeks or days the Commission would like to
8	exclude from potential hearing?
9	JUDGE BUSHMANN: Well, not off the top of
10	my head, although I do have a copy of the adjudication

13	be helping in picking dates.
