repair industry before starting my career in the telephone industry in 1983 with CP National Utility in California, which later became part of ALLTEL. I started as Communications Technician with responsibilities for operation of Digital Microwave radio systems, Land-Mobile radio systems, and Improved Mobile Telephone systems (predecessor to Cellular), and Digital and step-by-step switching offices operation and maintenance. In 1988, I transferred to Central Office Engineering with responsibilities which included Central Office switching, transport and special service engineering, toll and subscriber carrier system engineering, and Digital switching. These translation activities have included Analog to Digital office conversions, Equal Access conversions, SS7/CLASS additions and Local Number portability conversions. I have attended Telephony related training courses with Nortel, NEC, Lucent, ITT, Lorain, Tekelec and others.

Q. Would you please describe your current duties at ALLTEL.

16 A. My current duties include the management of a translations department consisting
17 of twelve (12) people providing translations services to ALLTEL wireline and
18 wireless offices in eight (8) states, including the state of Missouri.

Q. What is the purpose of your testimony?

21 A. The purpose of my testimony is to respond to the direct testimony of Thomas F.
22 Hughes of Southwestern Bell Telephone Company, filed in this proceeding in
23 October, 2000.

- Q. Why does SWBT presuppose that Local Plus is not available to facilities-based CLECs?
- A. SWBT states in Hughes direct testimony (pg. 6, line 15): "It is simply not technically feasible for SWBT to offer Local Plus for resale when a facilities-based CLEC is providing the end user local service using its own switch.

 Because Local Plus is provisioned by translations changes made in the local switch, resale of SWBT's Local Plus by a CLEC or an IXC can only occur where SWBT provides the local switching to the end user. SWBT cannot make the changes in the translations to offer Local Plus unless it provides the switching."

Q. Do you agree that it is technically infeasible for SWBT to offer Local Plus to ACI?

- No. SWBT contends that the inability to provide Local Plus to a facilities-based A. 13 14 CLEC hinges on their inability to make necessary changes in translations in order to create the proper Automatic Message Accounting (AMA) records unless it 15 provides the local switching. ACI suggests that ACI's switch can make the 16 necessary translation changes and send the call to SWBT, if necessary over a 17 separate trunk group, for transport to its destination. Concurrently, settlement 18 records created from the AMA records on ACI's switch would be forwarded to 19 SWBT for delivery to any non-SWBT ILEC to which a Local Plus call 20 terminates. 21
- 22 Q. Does this conclude your testimony.
- 23 A. Yes, it does.
