

If Ms. Geary no longer intends to pursue her complaint, no further action from any party is needed, because the Commission can end these proceedings by dismissing her complaint. But before the Commission does so, Ms. Geary may show cause why the

Commission should not dismiss her complaint. To show cause why the Commission should not dismiss her complaint, Ms. Geary must respond to this order by stating that she intends to pursue her complaint and by complying with our April 3, 2009, order.

If Ms. Geary does so, the Commission will resume these proceedings, including a hearing to gather evidence on which to decide the complaint. Ms. Geary may participate in the hearing in different ways, including attending in person or by telephone. But if Ms. Geary does not respond to this order as directed, the Commission may assume that she does not intend to pursue her complaint, and may dismiss her complaint.

THE COMMISSION ORDERS THAT:

1. No later than May 15, 2009, Alice Geary shall comply with our April 3, 2009, order and show cause why the Commission should not dismiss her case.

2. This order shall become effective immediately on issuance.
