Subject: Review of Fiscal Impact for 4 CSR 240-31 Rulemaking

The rulemaking associated with this case went into effect April 30, 2014 for Chapter 31 of the Missouri PSC's rules. Section 536.200.2, RSMo 2000 requires agencies to make a filing with the Missouri Secretary of State if after the first full year after implementation of a rule the cost of a rule exceeds the agency's estimate by ten percent or more. An aggregate fiscal impact of \$21,600 was estimated for Missouri Commission rule 4 CSR 240-31.130; however, all other rules projected a fiscal impact of less than \$500 in the aggregate.

Staff contacted by e-mail all Missouri telecommunications companies, IVoIP providers and eligible telecommunications carriers to verify whether the actual cost associated with the rulemaking exceeds the estimated cost by ten percent or more. A copy of Staff's e-mail is provided in Attachment A. The email was directed to the Official Representative for the company as listed in the Commission's Electronic Filing and Information System (EFIS). No company responded to Staff's inquiry. Based on this result Staff has no reason to believe actual costs for the rules in this rulemaking exceed estimated costs by ten percent or more.

The rulemaking associated with Case No. TX-2013-0324 pertained to universal service and revised rules went into effect April 30, 2014 for Chapter 31 (4 CSR 240-31) of the Missouri PSC's rules. An aggregate fiscal impact of \$21,600 was estimated for Missouri Commission rule 4 CSR 240-31.130; however, all other rules within that rulemaking estimated the proposed rule will not cost private entities more than \$500 in the aggregate. If you believe the actual cost associated with this rulemaking exceeded these estimates by ten percent or more then please respond and provide an explanation by July 24, 2015.
