ORDER APPROVING TARIFFS

On December 23, 1992, the Commission issued its Report And Order in Case No. TO-92-306 in which it established expanded calling area plans for Missouri and established intercompany compensation arrangements for those plans. The intercompany compensation arrangements were to maintain revenue neutrality for affected local exchange telecommunications companies (LECs). On September 23, 1994, Mid-Missouri Telephone Company (Mid-Missouri) filed a proposed tariff to reduce its intraLATA switched access rates to comply with the Commission's Report And Order (TR-95-88). Mid-Missouri's tariff has an effective date of October 23, 1994.

On October 11, 1994, New Florence Telephone Company (New Florence) filed a proposed tariff designed to maintain revenue neutrality in compliance with the Commission's Report And Order in Case No. TO-92-306. New Florence has requested the tariff be approved by October 16, 1994, to coincide with its access billing cycle.

On October 11, 1994, Commission Staff filed memoranda in Cases No. TR-95-88 and TR-95-119 in which it recommends approval of both sets of tariffs. Staff indicates that both companies' tariffs comply with the revenue-neutrality provision of Case No. TO-92-306 and the companies are making refunds in accordance with that Report And Order.

The Commission has reviewed the tariffs and Staff's memoranda and finds that the tariffs should be approved. Based upon Staff's review the Commission finds both sets of tariffs comply with the Commission's Report And Order in Case No. TO-92-306 and effectively complete that portion of the order. The Commission also finds there is good cause to allow New Florence's tariffs to become effective in less than thirty days to coincide with its access billing cycle.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

1. That the tariff filed by Mid-Missouri Telephone Company to comply with the revenue-neutrality provisions of the Commission's Report And Order in Case No. TO-92-306 is hereby approved for service on and after October 23, 1994. The tariff sheet approved is:


