ORDER DISMISSING COS PETITIONS

The Commission consolidated a number of community optional service (COS) petitions by orders issued in March and April of 1997 in order to consider a common issue. Some local exchange companies requested protective orders for the calling study results required to be filed in these cases on the grounds that the information constitutes trade secrets. The parties filed a joint stipulation of facts and submitted briefs.

In the meantime the Commission had taken up the issue of whether COS service should be continued. Case No. TW-97-333 was established to determine the future of COS service in a competitive basic local telecommunications environment. The Commission issued its order in TW-97-333 on October 16, finding that COS service should be discontinued throughout the state by March 31, 1998, and directing that all pending petitions for the service be dismissed. The Commission denied the motions filed for clarification and rehearing on November 18. In light of those orders the issue of the confidentiality of COS calling study results is now moot. Accordingly, these consolidated cases shall be dismissed.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

- That the petitions for COS service filed in these consolidated cases are dismissed in accordance with the Commission's order in Case No. TW-97-333.
- 2. That all pending motions for protective orders are dismissed as moot.
 - 3. That this order shall become effective on December 23, 1997.

4. That these cases shall be closed on December 24, 1997.
