## ORDER APPROVING AMENDMENTS TO INTERCONNECTION AGREEMENT

Issue Date: August 28, 2018 Effective Date: September 7, 2018

This order approves the amendments to the interconnection agreement between the parties filed by Embarq Missouri, Inc. d/b/a Century Link (CenturyLink).

On July 17, 2018, CenturyLink filed an application with the Commission for approval of an amendment to the Interconnection Agreement between Charter Fiberlink-Missouri, LLC (Charter) and Century Link. CenturyLink and Charter currently have a Commissionapproved interconnection agreement between them. 1 In the current application, the parties have agreed to amend the interconnection agreement. The amendments were filed pursuant to Section 252 (e)(1) of the Telecommunications Act of 1996.<sup>2</sup> The amendment to the interconnection agreement adds specific terms, conditions, and rates for Bill and Keep, as set forth in Table 1 to the Amendment. Both CenturyLink and Charter hold certificates of service authority or are registered to provide basic local exchange telecommunications services in Missouri.

Although Charter is a party to the agreement, it did not join in the application. On July 25, 2018, the Commission issued an order making Charter a party in this case and directing any party wishing to request a hearing to do so no later than August 9, 2018. No requests for hearing were filed.

Under Section 252(e) of the Act, any interconnection agreement adopted by negotiation must be submitted to the Commission for approval. The Commission may reject an agreement if it finds that the agreement is discriminatory or that it is not consistent with the public interest, convenience, and necessity. On August 27, 2018, the Staff of the Commission filed a recommendation. Staff recommends that the amendments to the agreement be approved and notes that the agreement meets the limited requirements of the Act in that it is not discriminatory toward nonparties and is not against the public interest. Staff recommends that the Commission direct the parties to submit any further amendments to the Commission for approval.

## Findings of Fact

The Commission has considered the application, the supporting documentation, and Staff's recommendation. Based upon that review, the Commission finds that the agreement as amended meets the requirements of the Act in that it does not discriminate against a nonparty carrier and implementation of the agreement as amended is not inconsistent with the public interest, convenience, and necessity. The Commission finds that approval of the agreement as amended shall be conditioned upon the parties submitting any further amendments to the Commission for approval pursuant to the procedure set out below.

#### **Amendment Procedure**

The Commission has a duty to review all interconnection agreements, whether arrived at through negotiation or arbitration, as mandated by the Act.<sup>3</sup> In order for the Commission's role of review and approval to be effective, the Commission must also review and approve or recognize amendments to these agreements. The Commission has a further duty to make a copy of every interconnection agreement available for public inspection.4

The parties to each interconnection agreement must maintain a complete and current copy of the agreement, together with all amendments, in the Commission's offices. Any proposed amendment must be submitted pursuant to Commission Rules 4 CSR 240-28.020(5) and 4 CSR 240-28.080.

## Conclusions of Law

The Commission, under the provisions of Section 252(e)(1) of the federal Telecommunications Act of 1996,<sup>5</sup> is required to review negotiated interconnection agreements. It may only reject a negotiated agreement upon a finding that its implementation would be discriminatory to a nonparty or inconsistent with the public interest, convenience, and necessity. <sup>6</sup> Based upon its review of the amendments to the agreement between CenturyLink and Charter and its findings of fact, the Commission concludes that the agreement as amended is neither discriminatory nor inconsistent with the public interest and shall be approved.
