Commission Rule 4 CSR 240-2.116(1) provides as follows:

(1) An applicant or complainant may voluntarily dismiss an application or

complaint without an order of the commission at any time before prepared testimony has been filed or oral evidence has been offered, by filing a notice of dismissal with the commission and serving a copy on all parties. Once evidence has been offered or prepared testimony filed, an applicant or complainant may dismiss an action only by leave of the commission, or by written consent of the adverse parties.

No prepared testimony or oral evidence has been offered in this case, and Staff has served a copy of this notice on all parties of record. Therefore, the Commission acknowledges that Staff has voluntarily dismissed its complaint. Nothing remains for decision by the Commission and this case may be closed.
