I am Ron Pridgin. 4 I'm the 5 regulatory law judge assigned to preside over this conference that's being held via Webex on 6 7 January 12th, 2023, and the time is approximately 10:03 a.m. 8 9 I would like to get entries of appearance 10 from counsel, please. And let me begin with the 11 Office of the Public Counsel. 12 MS. VANGERPEN: Good morning, Your Honor. Lindsay VanGerpen on behalf of the Office of the 13 Public Counsel. 14 15 THE COURT: All right. Ms. VanGerpen, 16 thank you. On behalf of the staff of and the 17 18 Commission, please. 19 MS. BRETZ: Karen Bretz Commission staff. 20 THE COURT: Ms. Bretz, thank you. 21 On behalf of Missouri American Water 2.2 Company, please. 23 MR. COOPER: This is Dean Cooper from 24 Brydon, Swearengen & England, PC, appearing on 25 behalf of Missouri American Water Company. And

Page 23 I'll -- Ms. Niemeier is on as well. I'll let her 1 2 enter her appearance. 3 MS. NIEMEIER: Good morning. This is Rachel Niemeier on behalf of Missouri American Water 4 5 Company, and my address is 727 Craig Road in St. Louis 63141. 6 7 THE COURT: Mr. Cooper, thank you. 8 Ms. Niemeier, thank you. 9 Does anyone else wish to enter an 10 appearance? 11 All right. Hearing nothing, because this 12 is OPC's concern with discovery, my plan was to let public counsel proceed with whatever concerns it has 13 and then let the company respond and let the staff 14 15 respond, unless the parties wish to go another direction. 16 17 All right. I'm not hearing any --18 anything, so Ms. VanGerpen, when you are ready. 19 MS. VANGERPEN: Thank you, Your Honor. 20 So the OPC has noticed four of our DRs 21 that we are having some trouble getting responsive information to, and so it was my thought that we 2.2 23 could just maybe go through each individual one. Ι believe -- I've -- I've been speaking with 24 25 Mr. Cooper that we might have a preliminary

2	move forward on another, but I think we we might		
3	still discuss those just while we're here.		
4	So for the first one, it's DR 3001. And		
5	this pertains to analyst reports. And the reason

7	we've received a number of them, but as I understand		
8	it, we are missing at least four of those reports.		
9	And so and so we are requesting those reports		
10	the remaining four reports four of the firm's		
11	I apologize, Your Honor. I've been corrected. It		
12	is four reports four firms.		
13	THE COURT: Okay. Did you want to go		
14	through these one by one, Ms. VanGerpen, or did you		
15	just want to state your concern to all of these and		
16	let the company respond? I don't have a preference.		
17	MS. VANGERPEN: I think it might be easier		
18	just to go one by one, if that's okay with everyone.		
19	THE COURT: That's certainly fine with me.		
20	Mr. Cooper, Ms. Niemeier, any response on		
21	behalf of the company?		
22	MR. COOPER: Sure. Yes, Your Honor.		
23	As to 3001 and this will be something		
24	that I'll restate, probably, in regard to two of the		
25	other three as well. You'll note that the request		

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Page 25 is for information concerning American Water Works 1 2 Company and not Missouri American. Additionally -and -- well, let me back up. 3 So as to three of these four, we're going 4 to certainly believe that -- that Missouri American 5 has NO possession, custody, or control over the 6 7 documents that are being requested. They've done 8 what they can to request documents to provide documents as best they can, but it's not something 9 that -- that they have in their possession and can 10 11 provide on their own. Beyond that, as to 3001, again, what we're 12 13 talking about are equity research reports published 14 on American Water. They're not published by 15 American Water. They're not requested or contracted 16 for, even, by American Water. So, again, we've done 17 our best to provide those, as Ms. VanGerpen 18 indicated. There's permission to provide 10 of the 19 14 that are known, but these come with some -- some terms and -- and restrictions from the publisher of 20 21 the reports. And when I say "published," it's not like these are published for public consumption. 2.2 23 They're sent, as I understand it, to subscribers, that sort of thing, so they're very proprietary to 24 25 the -- to the issuer. At least three of those four

Page 26 remaining -- I think they are banks -- I understand 1 2 have indicated they do not consent to any further 3 release. So that's kind of where we are on 3001. 4 Т don't know what more Missouri American can -- can do 5 in this regard and -- and we would -- we would toss 6 7 it back to you, Your Honor, at that point. 8 THE COURT: All right. Thank you. 9 Ms. Bretz, any staff response on OPC Data 10 Request 3001? 11 I don't think so. MS. BRETZ: 12 Mr. Foster, Mr. Spratt, do you have 13 anything you want to say about 3001? 14 MR. SPRATT: No, I don't. 15 THE COURT: Thank you. 16 Ms. VanGerpen, I'll throw it back to you 17 to DR 3010, then. 18 MS. VANGERPEN: Thank you, Your Honor. 19 And so as it concerns 3010, this pertains 20 to American Water's finance committee materials. 21 And, again, OPC has requested these because they 2.2 discuss capital structure strategies, cost of 23 capital, business risk, and capital markets in general. And it's the OPC's position that those are 24 25 at the heart of the rate of return issues that are

2	understand it I think this might be one of the		
3	the DRs that OPC and Missouri American are are		
4	working towards a resolution on; however, that		
5	resolution, I think, might just be an initial step,		
6	and it wouldn't be until after the review at		
7	Missouri American's counsel's office that we would		
8	be able to say whether or not this dispute is		
9	resolved.		
10	THE COURT: Ms. VanGerpen, thank you.		
11	Any response on behalf of the company?		
12	MR. COOPER: Yes, Your Honor.		
13	And, again, I just reiterating what I		
14	said before. This is another one that concerns		
15	American Water Works Company's financial committee,		
16	not Missouri American's finance committee. There is		
17	no Missouri American finance committee, as I		
18	understand it. But even American Water Works		
19	doesn't have exclusively a finance committee; it has		
20	an audit finance and risk committee, so any minutes		
21	would would be beyond what's really been		
22	requested by by OPC here.		
23	But, again, going back to where I started,		
24	this is American Water; it's not Missouri American.		
25	It's not something Missouri American has possession,		

Page 28 1 custody, or control over or can provide on its own, 2 if it wants -- even if it wants to. 3 Ms. VanGerpen accurately stated that we've exchanged some -- some communication about a 4 5 possible resolution. I -- I can't tell you at this point how -- how close I think we are. I just -- I 6 7 just don't know whether we're going to get there on this one or not, but -- but those are -- those are 8 9 the points that we would make in regard to 3010. 10 In addition, Your Honor --MS. Thank you. 2.2 THE COURT: All right. Thank you. 23 And, Ms. VanGerpen, I guess I'll ask what 24 your statement is on Data Request 3018. 25 And, Your Honor, if I MS. VANGERPEN:

Page 29 might -- could I possibly back up to respond to 1 2 Missouri American's statement for both 3001 and 3010? 3 THE COURT: 4 Sure. MS. VANGERPEN: So since we're on 3010, 5 6 I'll just start there. And this pertains to 3001 as 7 well. 8 So Mr. Cooper has mentioned that these are 9 American Water Works Company's finance committee 10 meeting minutes and that they may be beyond the care, custody, and control of Missouri American. 11 12 However, Missouri American is a wholly owned subsidiary of American Water, and so it is OPC's 13 position that they should have access to those 14 15 documents and should give the -- those documents over to us because they do go to the -- the -- to 16 the heart of the rate of return issues that are at 17 18 issue in this general rate case. However, if 19 Missouri American is asserting that they do not -they cannot get those documents, I believe the 20 21 commission does have subpoena power, and the OPC 2.2 will -- is -- will pursue a subpoena of the parent 23 company in order to obtain those -- those documents. Because they do go to the heart of our issues here. 24 25 And then as to the relevance of the -- the

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1	finance committee documents, I think, similarly, as		
2	I mentioned, these these documents do go to the		
3	heart of the rate of return issues, which is		
4	directly at issue in in this general rate case,		
5	so they they certainly are relevant to this case.		
б	And I think that that covers a lot of		
7	what was discussed with 3001, as well, as far as the		
8	information for American Water Works Company.		
9	Again, Missouri American is a wholly owned		
10	subsidiary of American Water, and so it is our		
11	position that they should have access to those		
12	documents, but if they do not, a subpoena to		
13	American Water will will likely come about to		
14	obtain those documents.		
15	And as far as the permission of the		
16	documents goes, if the concern is copyright, I would		
17	imagine that this would fall within the fair use		
18	exception to the copyright laws, which is, I		
19	believe, 17 U.S.C. Section 107, and so that is		
20	that is our response to those two data requests as		
21	well.		
22	MR. COOPER: Judge, a couple of quick		
23	things.		
24	As to copyright again, keep in mind,		
25	these are not publicly published documents in regard		

Page 31 1 They're proprietary documents that are to 3001. 2 sent essentially sold to subscribers, for lack -- or 3 investors or -- or what have you. So we're not really talking just about a -- you know, a copyright 4 5 situation that you would have with publicly provided materials. 6 7 Additionally, in regard to the possession, 8 custody, and control, it -- I think everybody on here understands this, but Missouri American is a --9 10 as was stated, a subsidiary of American Watter. It's essentially a downstream corporation. 11 Ιt 12 doesn't have control over a parent, so I would kind of note that and -- and just acknowledge, as 13 Ms. VanGerpen, said that there are subpoena powers 14 with the commission. And I don't think that's 15 really the question for today, but I would 16 17 acknowledge that those are out there. 18 THE COURT: Mr. Cooper, thank you. 19 Anything further before Ms. VanGerpen 20 makes her argument on -- on Data Request 3018? 21 All right. Ms. VanGerpen, when you're 2.2 ready. 23 Thank you, Your Honor. MS. VANGERPEN: 24 For 3018, these are some rating agency 25 And the OPC has been able to review those reports.

1	Page 32 documents at Mr. Cooper's office, and we certainly			
2	thank Missouri American for making those available			
3	to us. However, now that we've reviewed those			
4	documents, it is our position that they are are			
5	relevant and we need to attach those documents to			
6	Mr. Murray's upcoming rebuttal testimony, and so we			
7	are now requesting copies of those documents to			
8	attach to Mr. Murray's testimony for rebuttal next			
9	week.			
10	Again, it's my understanding that			
11	Missouri American and OPC have reached a preliminary			
12	agreement about this dispute, and we may I think			
13	Mr. Cooper and I have discussed possibly filing a			
14	motion for a protective order, and if if			
15	Missouri American would like those documents to be			
16	filed as highly confidential, that's not something			
17	that OPC would oppose. We would we would give			
18	them whatever designation Missouri American believes			
19	is appropriate, as long as we can have possession of			
20	those documents to attach to Mr. Murray's testimony.			
21	And that would just be to support Mr. Murray's			
22	testimony and his statements in testimony.			
23	MR. COOPER: Judge, this is Dean Cooper.			
24	Ms. VanGerpen accurately stated, I think,			
25	where we are in regard to 3018. But as you probably

2	probably are going to need your help, because how			
3	we've talked about dealing with this is is filing			
4	a motion for a protective order that would establish			
5	a highly confidential category that that these			
6	particular documents would then be would then

8	Rebuttal testimony comes up, I think, next			
9	Wednesday. It's the 18th, so I don't know that			
10	there's anything you could do about that here today,			
11	but just kind of giving you a heads up that we'll			
12	we'll try to get that to you quickly and hope that			
13	you'll be able to help us out in terms of,			
14	ultimately, an order.			
15	THE COURT: Sure. Obviously, I don't want			
16	to tell anybody how to practice. I mean, if			
17	somebody files a motion and represents that nobody			
18	objects, I could probably rule on that pretty			
19	quickly. Also I guess there's always the			
20	possibility of a late filed, you know, supplement			
21	where perhaps somebody files a rebuttal that's			
22	missing some information, and then you supplement			
23	that information later. And I'm sure you've			
24	considered these possibilities, as well, but,			
25	hopefully I mean, if the parties agree, I

4	THE COURT: Any any further comments			
5	either from Ms. Bretz or anybody else on DR 3018?

13	mainly its net worth. And that information informs			
14	the financial health, cost of capital, and capital			
15	structures issues related to American Water. And,			
16	again, the OPC believes those are issues that are			
17	directly at issue in the general rate case, and so			
18	we have requested those documents from			
19	Missouri American. And as I understand it, I			
20	believe we've and Mr. Murray I'm looking at			
21	Mr. Murray across the table from me. I hope he			
22	corrects me if I'm wrong about this, but I believe			
23	we've received some type of information in response			
24	to this DR, but there is an outstanding piece of it			
25	that we're still waiting and more recent			

Page 35 1 information, I'm informed. 2 THE COURT: All right. Ms. VanGerpen, 3 thank you. 4 Any company response? MR. COOPER: Yes, Your Honor. 5 As to this particular DR -- again, all 6 7 we've said before about it concerning American Water 8 Works, as opposed to Missouri American remains the Additionally, as -- well, let me back up. 9 case. 10 As I understand it at the American Water level, what we're -- we're talking about impairment 11 12 testing, and it can be quantitative or it can be qualitative. And what has been provided by 13 American Water is the last quantitative impairment 14 testing that they did, which was 2019. Since then, 15 we understand no quantitative testing has been 16 17 performed; it's been qualitative in those years. So 18 that's -- that's the difference between, I guess, 19 what -- what has been provided and OPC has received 20 and what -- what has not. 21 I would disagree with something that 2.2 Ms. VanGerpen said about its relevance, and that 23 is -- well, I think she made the comment that it was very -- it was relevant to essentially the financial 24 25 structure of American Water Works. You know, keep

1	Page 36 in keep in mind that the issue in this case is			
2	really the financial structure of Missouri American			
3	Water Company. Now, the Commission may take			
4	different factors in into account in			
5	establishing that or a hypothetical capital			
6	structure, ultimately, but but, really,			
7	American Water Works' structure is is not at			
8	issue and not appropriate for this case.			
9	Again, having said all of that, I'll			
10	circle back around to where I started, which is this			
11	is another question about American Water Works. The			
12	financial statement that is referenced is the 10K			
13	for American Water Works, not Missouri American.			
14	The 10K is is audited by independent auditors.			
15	To the extent someone does want to allege that it's			
16	relevant, it should be able to stand on its own			
17	without any further backup, in terms of this			
18	impairment testimony.			
19	THE COURT: Mr. Cooper, thank you.			
20	Ms. Bretz, anything on behalf of staff?			
21	MS. BRETZ: Nothing. Thank you.			
22	THE COURT: All right. Thank you.			
23	I think we've covered the four data			
24	requests. Is there anything else counsel wants to			
25	bring to my attention?			

Page 37 Your Honor, could I have 1 MS. VANGERPEN: 2 just one moment to -- to discuss with Mr. Murray a 3 possible response to some of Mr. Cooper's 4 statements? THE COURT: 5 Sure. Thank you. 6 MS. Page 38 of financial -- affiliate financial transactions, 1 2 which are impacted by American Water's financial 3 transactions, and so they -- we believe these documents are relevant. 4 And I'm looking to Mr. Murray to make sure 5 I accurately represented that. 6 7 And that's all we have, Your Honor. THE COURT: All right. Ms. VanGerpen, 8 9 thank you. 10 And I think we've covered the 4 DRs. Is 11 there anything further that counsel wants to bring to my attention? 12 13 MR. COOPER: Judge, just one point of clarification very quickly. 14 15 In terms of Ms. VanGerpen's statement about Missouri American's financing, it does have 16 some debt, essentially, that it receives from an 17 affiliate, but it's not American Water; it is 18 19 Capital Corp., a different entity from American Water. So I -- small point, but I just 20 21 want to make that point, that there is no direct debt that Missouri American receives from 2.2 23 American Water Works Company. 24 THE COURT: Mr. Cooper, thank you. 25 Anything else from counsel?
