**ORDER GRANTING SECOND EXTENSION OF TIME TO FILE
PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE**

On July 13, 2007,¹ pursuant to Section 393.170, RSMo 2000, and Commission Rules 4 CSR 240-2.060, 4 CSR 240-3.305, and 4 CSR-3.600, Innsbrook Utilities, LLC, (“Innsbrook”) filed applications requesting the Commission grant it authority to own, operate, control, manage, improve and maintain a water and sewer system for the public in an incorporated area of Warren County, Missouri. Specifically, the water and sewer service is to be provided to the Village of Innsbrook, a community composed of a mixture of single family homes and recreational chalets.

On September 5, the Commission granted Public Water Supply District No. 2 of St. Charles County’s request to intervene, set a prehearing conference and directed the filing of a procedural schedule. The prehearing conference was held on September 13, and

at the conference, the Regulatory Law Judge gave the parties the option of filing a status report in lieu of the procedural schedule that was due on September 20.

On September 19, Innsbrook filed a status report requesting an additional 45 days to file a procedural schedule. Innsbrook stated that it required this additional time to consider information presented to it by the other parties at the prehearing conference. The Commission granted Innsbrook's request and extended the deadline to November 5.

On October 11, Innsbrook filed a second status report requesting a second extension of time. Innsbrook states that it will require an additional 30 days beyond November 5 to December 5 to consider the above referenced information. Innsbrook further states that no other party to this action opposes this extension. The Commission finds Innsbrook's request to be reasonable and shall grant it.

IT IS ORDERED THAT:

1. The November 5, 2007 deadline for filing a procedural schedule in this matter is canceled.
2. The parties shall jointly prepare and file a procedural schedule no later than December 5, 2007.

3. This order shall become effective on October 11, 2007.
