

#### Discontinuance of Service By Company for Non-Payment

In all case of non-payment of bills within ten (10) days after due date, and following 48 hours prior written notice, the Water supply will be cut off and not turned on again except upon payment of the amount due together with and additional fee of Twenty-Five Dollars (\$25.00) for turning on the water.

#### Discontinuance of Service By Consumer

Service may be discontinued by Consumer by giving not less than twenty-four (24) hours notice to the Company during its regular office hours that water service is to be discontinued.

If you have any questions about your bill or the services provided by the Company, the Customer Service Department will assist you weekdays from 9 a.m. to 12 p.m. & 1 p.m. to 5 p.m.
