MOTION TO CANCEL CERTIFICATE OF SERVICE AUTHORITY AND TARIFF

COMES NOW the Staff of the Missouri Public Service Commission and moves for the Missouri Public Service Commission (Commission) to cancel the certificate of interexchange service authority in Missouri of SNET America, Inc. ("the Company) and states as follows:

1. On September 14, 2006, the Commission granted a certificate of interexchange service authority to the Company in Case No. TA-2007-0041. It does not have an existing approved tariff.

2. On May 15, 2014, the Company notified the Commission that it no longer provided telecommunications services in Missouri (see BCES-2014-1871).

3. The Commission has the authority to cancel a telecommunications certificate pursuant to Section 392.410.5 RSMo 2000, which provides "[a]ny certificate of service authority may be altered or modified by the commission after notice and hearing, upon its own motion or upon application of the person or company affected."

4. The Commission need not hold a hearing, if, after proper notice and opportunity to intervene, no party requests such a hearing. *State ex rel. Rex Deffenderfer Enterprises, Inc. v. Public Service Commission*, 776 S.W.2d 494 (Mo. App. W.D. 1989).

WHEREFORE, the Staff respectfully recommends the Commission cancel the certificate of service authority of SNET America, Inc. to provide interexchange telecommunications service in Missouri as well as its tariff.
