MOTION TO CANCEL CERTIFICATES OF SERVICE AUTHORITY

COMES NOW the Staff of the Missouri Public Service Commission ("Staff"), by and through the undersigned counsel, and moves for the Missouri Public Service Commission ("Commission") to cancel the certificates of service authority of Main Street Telephone Company ("MSTC" or "Company") and states as follows:

- 1. On September 15, 1998, the Commission granted MSTC certificates of service authority to provide competitive intrastate interexchange telecommunications services and nonswitched local exchange private line telecommunications services in the state of Missouri.
- 2. On August 31, 2011, the Commission received a Ceasing Operations Statement from MSTC that stated the Company has no customers in Missouri and requested the Commission cancel the Company's authority effective immediately. See Attachment A.
- 3. Because MSTC requested cancellation of its certificates and has no customers in Missouri, the Staff recommends that the Commission cancel the certificates.
- 4. The Commission has the authority to cancel a telecommunications certificate pursuant to Section 392.410.5, RSMo (Supp. 2010), which provides

"[a]ny certificate of service authority may be altered or modified by the commission after notice and hearing, upon its own motion or upon application of the person or company affected."

- 5. The Commission need not hold a hearing if, after proper notice and opportunity to intervene, no party requests such a hearing. State ex rel. Rex Deffenderfer Enterprises, Inc. v. Public Service Commission, 776 S.W. 2d 494 (Mo. App. W.D. 1989).
- 6. MSTC is current on its fiscal year 2012 assessment and submission of its calendar year 2010 annual report.

WHEREFORE, the Staff respectfully recommends that the Commission cancel the certificates of service authority and associated tariff of Main Street Telephone Company to provide competitive intrastate interexchange telecommunications services and nonswitched local exchange private line telecommunications services in the state of Missouri.
