**AMENDED ORDER GRANTING WAIVER OF STATUTES AND  
REGULATIONS AND APPROVING REVISED TARIFF**

Issue Date: June 15, 2009

Effective Date: June 30, 2009

The Missouri Public Service Commission is granting the petition for waiver of statutes and regulations filed by KLM Long Distance Company (“the company”).

The company filed the petition on May 27, 2009, with an affidavit and a revised tariff sheet effective June 30, 2009. The petition also included a motion for expedited treatment (“the motion”), seeking a decision effective June 30, 2009. On June 1, 2009, the Commission granted the motion and ordered the Commission’s staff (“Staff”) to file its recommendation on the petition in an expedited fashion. Accordingly, Staff filed a verified recommendation in favor of the petition on June 10, 2009. Because all parties agree with the petition, no law requires a hearing before deciding the petition, and the Commission convened no hearing and bases its findings on the verified filings.<sup>1</sup>

The company holds certificates of service authority (“certificates”) to provide local exchange telecommunications services limited to providing dedicated, non-switched local exchange private line services, and intrastate interexchange telecommunications services in Missouri under competitive classification. The company’s certificates already include waivers of certain provisions of law, and the petition seeks further waivers as follows:

The company is not delinquent in filing an annual report, remitting its annual assessment to the Commission, and payments to the Universal Service Fund and Relay Missouri.

The Commission may grant the petition as follows:

The commission is authorized, in connection with the . . . modification of a certificate of interexchange or local exchange service authority . . . to entertain a petition to suspend or modify the application of its rules or the application of any statutory provision contained in sections 392.200 to 392.340 if such waiver or modification is otherwise consistent with the other provisions of sections 392.361 to 392.520 and the purposes of this chapter.[<sup>3</sup>]

The Commission retains jurisdiction over the petition because the time for rehearing has not passed and no person has instituted judicial review. **Woodman v. Director of Revenue**, 8 S.W.3d 154, 156 (Mo. App., W.D. 1999). Therefore, the Commission will issue an amended order to read as intended with regard to the waiver of § 392.300.

The parties' affidavits state, and the Commission concludes, that the waivers sought are consistent with the other provisions of sections 392.361 to 392.520 and the purposes of chapter 392, RSMo. The Commission finds that waiving the statutes and Commission rules set out in the ordered paragraph below is reasonable and not detrimental to the public interest.

Therefore, the Commission will grant the waivers and approve the company's tariff to become effective on June 30, 2009.

**THE COMMISSION ORDERS THAT:**

1. The petition for waiver of statutes and regulations filed by KLM Long Distance Company is granted.
