NOTICE ACKNOWLEDGING DISMISSAL OF APPLICATION
ORDER REJECTING TARIFF AND CLOSING CASE

On November 6, 2007, Syniverse Networks, Inc. ("Syniverse") filed an application asking the Commission to change the name on its certificate of service authority to Syniverse Technologies, Inc. Also on November 6, Syniverse issued a tariff reflecting the name change. The tariff was set to become effective on December 6, 2007. However, upon review of Syniverse's application, it appeared that Syniverse Networks, Inc. and Syniverse Finance, Inc. were merging into a new corporate entity utilizing the new name of Syniverse Technologies, Inc. Consequently, the Commission suspended Syniverse's tariff until April 4, 2008 to allow sufficient time for Syniverse to file an appropriate merger application and for the Commission to determine if Syniverse's merger and proposed tariff were just, reasonable, and in the public interest.

On January 17, 2008, prior to the filing of any testimony or the admission of any evidence, Syniverse filed a Notice of Dismissal pursuant to Commission Rule 4 CSR 240-2.116(1). Syniverse served a copy of its voluntary dismissal on all parties to this matter as evidenced by its certificate of service.

Commission Rule 4 CSR 240-2.116(1) provides as follows:

(1) An applicant or complainant may voluntarily dismiss an application or complaint without an order of the commission at any time before prepared testimony has been filed or oral evidence has been offered, by filing a notice of dismissal with the commission and serving a copy on all parties. Once evidence has been offered or prepared testimony filed, an applicant or complainant may dismiss an action only by leave of the commission, or by written consent of the adverse parties.

No prepared testimony or oral evidence has been offered in this case, and Syniverse has served a copy of this notice on all parties of record. Therefore, the Commission acknowledges that Syniverse has voluntarily dismissed its application. Because Syniverse is dismissing its application, the Commission shall reject the tariff Syniverse filed in association with its requested name change.

IT IS ORDERED THAT:

1. The Missouri Public Service Commission acknowledges Syniverse Networks, Inc.'s voluntary dismissal of the name change application filed in this matter.
2. The proposed tariff of Syniverse Networks, Inc., issued on November 6, 2007 and suspended until April 4, 2008, reflecting the new name Syniverse Technologies, Inc., and assigned Tariff File Number JX-2008-0299, is hereby rejected. The tariff sheets rejected are:

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3. Nothing remains for decision by the Commission and this case may be closed.

4. This order shall become effective on January 22, 2008.
