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DEFINITIONS 1.0

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1.1 **Definitions of Terms**

Access Line - An arrangement which connects the subscriber/end user location to an Alternate Communications Technology Inc. switching center or point of presence.

Alternative Operator Services (AOS) - Those services provided by the Company in which the subscriber and end user are totally separate entities. The Company contracts with the subscriber to provide the alternative operator service (AOS); however, the Company does not directly contract with the end user to provide the services even though it is the end user who actually pays for the operator calls.

Automated Calling Card - A calling card of a telephone utility with an encoded number that does not require the End User to dial additional digits to route and bill the call. Calls billed to an automated calling card will be billed at the same rates as calls billed to a credit card.

Calling Card - A billing convenience whereby the End User may bill the charges for a call to an approved telephone company issued calling card. The terms and conditions of the local telephone company will apply to payment arrangements.

Carrier or Company - Whenever used in this tariff, "Carrier" or "Company" refers to Alternate Communications Technology, Inc., unless otherwise specified or clearly indicated by the context.

Casual User - A Customer or End User who does not negotiate directly with the Company for provisioning or termination of service. A Casual User is typically a member of the transient public and may use such services of ACT as are designated for transient use.

Collect Billing -A billing arrangement by which the charge for a call may be charged to the called party, provided the called party accepts the charge.

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1.0 **DEFINITIONS** (Continued)

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1.1 **Definitions of Terms** (Continued)

Public Service Commission

Credit Card - A billing convenience whereby the End User may bill the charges for a call to an authorized national charge card, such as Mastercard or Visa. The terms and conditions of the agreement between the credit card company and its patrons will apply to payment arrangements.

End User - Any person, firm, partnership, corporation, or other entity furnished telecommunications services under the provisions and regulations of the Company's tariff. The Customer or End User is typically a member of the transient public and, as such, does not negotiate directly with Company for provisioning or termination of service.

Person-to-Person Call - A service whereby the person origination the call specifies to the Company Operator a particular person to be reached, or a particular station, room number, department, or office to be reached through a PBX attendant.

Rate Center - A geographic location from which the vertical and horizontal coordinate are used in calculation of airline mileage for the purposes of rating a call.

Station-to-Station Call - A service whereby the person originating the message dial the telephone number desired, or gives to the Company operator the telephone number of the desired service point, PBX or PBX service point which is reached directly rather than through a PBX attendant, or gives only the name and address under which the number of the desired service point, or PBX is listed, and does not specify a particular person to be reached nor a particular service point, department or office to be reached through a PBX attendant.

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1.1 Definitions of Terms (Continued)

Subscriber - The person, firm, partnership, corporation, or other entity who owns, leases or manages the pay telephone, PBX, or other switch vehicle from which a Customer places a call utilizing the services of the Company. The Subscriber has a pre-existing business arrangement with the Company and may also be an End User.

Third Party Billing - A billing convenience by which the charges for a call may be billed to a number that is different from the calling number and the called number. This billing arrangement can only be used after a person verbally accepts the charges for the call.

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Undertaking of Alternate Communications Technology Inchic Sarvice Commission 2.1

2.1.1 Application of Tariff

This tariff applies to Long Distance Resale Service by Carrier to all points in Missouri. Long distance Resale Service is a public telecommunication service for hire that includes providing both interstate and intrastate long distance service and operator service to Subscribers through the resale of WATS and WATS-like service.

2.1.2 Availability of Service

Carrier offers Long Distance Resale Service to any person in its service area who desires to become a Subscriber.

2.1.3 Service Area

Carrier shall provide intralata and interlata service within the State of Missouri.

Obligation of Subscriber

The subscriber will assume responsibility for all usage billed to the subscriber's billing code.

2.1.5 Limitations

- (A) Service is offered subject to the availability of the necessary facilities or equipment, or both facilities and equipment, and subject to the provisions of this tariff.
- The Carrier reserves the right to discontinue service when necessitated (B) by conditions beyond its control, or when the Customer or Subscriber is using the service in violation of the provision of this tariff, or in violation of the law.

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2.0 RULES AND REGULATIONS (continued)

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2.1.5 Limitations

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(C) The liability of Carrier for damages arising out of mistakes, omissions, interruptions, delays or errors or defects in the transmission occurring in the course of furnishing service, channels or other facilities and not caused by the negligence of the subscribers, commences upon activation of service and in no event exceeds an amount equivalent to the proportionate charge to the subscriber for the period of service during which such mistakes, omissions, interruptions delays or errors or defects in the transmission occur, or as otherwise determined in a court of law.

2.2 Use

2.2.1 Purpose

Services provided under this tariff may be used for any lawful purpose for which the service is technically suited.

2.3 Liability

(A) The Company shall not be liable for claim or loss, expense or damage (including indirect, special or consequential damage), for any interruption, delay, error, omission or defect in any service, facility or transmission provided under this tariff, if caused by any person or entity other than the Company, by any malfunction of any service or facility provided by any other carrier, by an act of God, fire, war, civil disturbance, or act of government, or by any other Cause beyond the Company's direct control.

- (B) The Company shall not be liable for, and shall be fully indemnified and held harmless by Customer and Subscriber against any claim or loss, expense, or damage (including indirect, special or consequential damage) for defamation, libel, slander, invasion, infringement of copyright or patent, unauthorized use of any trademark, tradename or service mark, unfair competition, interference with or misappropriation or violation of any contract, proprietary or creative right, or any other injury to any person, property or entity arising out of the material, data, information, or other content revealed to, transmitted, or used by the Company under this tariff; or for any act or omission of the Customer or Subscriber; or for any personal injury or death of any person caused directly or indirectly by the installation, maintenance, location, condition, operation, failure, presence, use, or removal of equipment or wiring provided by the Company, if not directly caused by negligence of the Company.
- (C) The Company shall not be liable for any defacement of or damages to the premises of a Subscriber resulting from the furnishing of service which is not the direct result of the Company's negligence.
- (D) No agent or employee of any other carrier shall be deemed to be an agent or employee of the Company.

2.4 **Initial Contract Period**

The initial contract period for service and facilities is thirty (30) days.

2.5 Termination of Service by Subscriber

- (A) Service or facilities may be terminated by the subscriber at any time, subject to payment of full charges accumulated for the period service is rendered.
- (B) For cause, the Subscriber may cancel service by giving notice to the Carrier not less than thirty (30) days prior to the date a cancellation is requested.
- If the Subscriber orders service which requires special construction or (C) special facilities dedicated to the Subscriber's use, the cost for which carrier is liable, and then the Subscriber cancels before service begins. a charge will be made to the Subscriber for the nonrecoverable portions of the expenditures or liabilities incurred expressly on behalf of the Subscriber by the Carrier.

2.6 Cancellation of Service by Carrier

- In the event of the non-payment of any sum due, the use of foul or (A) profane expressions, the impersonation of another with fraudulent intent, or of any other violation of the Communications act of 1934, as amended, or of the rules and regulations of the Federal Communications Commission, ACT may either temporarily deny service or terminate the contract.
- (B) Any denial of service or disconnection as a result of non-payment by the subscriber shall be in accordance with the billing agency rules and regulations. RILEL

Access to Subscriber Operator Service 2.7

Public Service Commission

- ACT service is available to Subscriber for a fee as described in the (A) Rates section of this tariff, for direct-dial and operator-assisted calls.
- The dialing patterns are different from property-to-property depending (B) on the type of equipment and programming capability of the subscriber. The end user usually reaches an ACT Operator by dialing ("O+") and the ten-digit-termination number, or the end user can reach the operator by dialing ("OO") or ("O-). Again, depending on customer premises equipment and programming systems. An outside service level prefix such as "8" or "9" may have to be dialed first before entering "O".

Terminal Equipment 2.8

(A) Carrier's facilities and service may be used with or terminated in or Customer or Subscriber-provided terminal equipment or Customer or Subscriber-provided communication systems, such as a PBX or pay telephone. Such terminal equipment shall be furnished and maintained at the expense of the providing Customer or Subscriber, except as otherwise agreed in advance and in writing. The Customer or Subscriber is responsible for all costs at his or her premises, including personnel, wiring, electrical power, and the like, incurred in the use of Carrier's service. When such terminal equipment is used, the equipment shall comply with the generally accepted minimum protective criteria standards of the telecommunications industry.

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2.9 Installation and Termination

2.9.1 ACT Operator Services

MISSOURI Public Service Commission

Service is installed upon contractual agreement between the Subscriber (A) and the Company. The contractual agreement specifies the terms and conditions of installation, termination of service, commission structure, and commission payment schedule. The service contract does not alter rates specified in the tables and schedules contained in this tariff. Service contracts do no apply to End Users. Deposits are not required to establish service.

2.9.2 Posting

- The contract of ACT or its agents with the subscriber will contain (A) provisions requiring the subscriber to post on or in close proximity to all telephones served by ACT the following information:
- The name and address of Alternate Communications Technology, Inc. 1.
- A customer service number for receipt of further service and billing 2.
- Dialing directions to the ACT operator for specific rate information 3.

2.10 Payment for Service and Credit Allowance

2.10.1 Payment for Service

All charges due by the Customer are payable to any agency duly (A) authorized to receive such payments. The billing agency may be a local exchange telephone company or credit card company. Terms of payment shall be according to the rules and regulations of the billing agency. Adjustments to Customers bills shall be made when circumstances exist which reasonably indicate that such changes are appropriate. BILED

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2.10.1 Payment for Service

Public Service Commission

(B) The Subscriber is responsible for the payment of ALL for services and equipment provided to the Subscriber. This applies to Subscribers where the provision of service by Carrier includes the use of authorization (access) codes. The Subscriber agrees to pay to Carrier any cost incurred as a result of any delegation of authority resulting in use of his/her authorization code. Where a Subscriber, e.g. an employer, provides use of authorization codes to his/her employees, or the Subscriber, e.g. a family member, provides use of authorization codes to his/her family relations or friends, guests, etc., the Subscriber agrees to pay the Carrier any cost incurred as a result of the use of the authorization codes.

2.11 **State Sales Taxes**

(A) All long distance calls originating or terminating in Missouri and charged to a Missouri telephone number are subject to state and local taxes at the prevailing tax rate. These taxes appear as a separate line item on the Customer bill.

3.1 General

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Public Service Commission

- (A) The Carrier endeavors to provide high quality service. All network access is monitored and engineered to provide a P.01 grade of service (99% call completion ratio.) Service, including operator assistance, is available 24 hours per day, 7 days a week, subject to routine maintenance and outages beyond the control of the Carrier. Carrier's switching equipment is designed and engineered to provide high quality transmission of voice and data with a minimum level of such as noise and echo. However, overall quality may vary somewhat due to the variability in quality of the connections provided by the local telephone companies and other interexchange carriers which is beyond the Company's control.
- (B) Carrier will not bill for incomplete calls where answer supervision is available. Carrier will not bill for incomplete calls and will remove any charge(s) for incomplete calls upon subscriber notification or Carrier's knowledge.
- (C) The Caller and billed party, if different from the caller, will be advised that Carrier is the operator service provider at the time of the initial contact.
- (D) Rate quotes will be given upon request, at no charge, including all rate components and any additional charges.
- (E) Only tariffed rates approved by this Commission for carrier shall appear on any local exchange company (LEC) billings.
- (F) Carrier shall be listed on the LEC billing if the LEC has multicarrier billing ability.
- (G) Carrier will employ reasonable calling verification procedures which are acceptable to the companies issuing the calling cards.
- (H) Carrier will route all O- or OO- emergency calls in the quickest possible manner to the appropriate local emergency service provider, at no charge.

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- (I)Upon request, Carrier will transfer calls to other authorized interexchange carriers or to the LEC, if billing can list the caller's actual origination point.
- **(J)** Carrier will refuse operator services to traffic appregators which block access to other carriers.

3.2 Location of Service

- (A) The Carrier will utilize switched access (FGA, FGB and FGD) from areas desiring service within the State.
- (B) The Carrier and customer service representative are available by dialing the Carrier's 1-800 access number from any exchange within the State.

3.3 **Timing of Calls**

- (A) The minimum length of a call for billing purposes is sixty seconds, unless otherwise specified under the individual description of service contained in this Tariff.
- Chargeable time for Customer Dialed Credit Card Calls will begin (B) when the local exchange company signals that the called party has For Operator-Station and Person-to-Person calls, chargeable time will begin when a connection is established between the calling party and the called party. No charge will apply to collect calls not accepted by the billing party. No charge will apply to Personto-Person calls for which the designated party or agreed alternate is unavailable. In all cases, chargeable time ends when either party disconnects.

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3.4 **Determination of Mileage**

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- Calls are measured from the Rate Center of the Subscriber's terminal (A) or switch location to the Rate Center of the destination of the call.
- **(B)** The distance between the Rate Center of the Subscriber's switch and destination point is calculated by using the vertical ("V") and horizontal ("H") coordinates found in AT&T Tariff FCC No. 10, in the following manner:
 - Step 1 Obtain the V and H coordinates for the originating and terminating rate centers.
 - Obtain the differences between the "V" coordinates for Step 2 each of the Rate Centers. Obtain the difference between the H coordinates.
 - Step Square each difference obtained in step 2 above.
 - Step Add the squares of the "V" difference and "H" difference obtained in Step 3.
 - Step - 5 Divide the sum of the squares obtained in Step 4 above by 10. Round to the next higher whole number if any fraction results from the division.
 - Obtain the square root of the whole number obtained in Step 6 Step 5. Round to the next higher whole number if any fraction is obtained. This is the mileage between the Rate Centers.

Step 7 The formula is as follows:

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3.5 ACT Operator Services

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Public Service Commission

- (A) ACT Operator Services anticipates the provision of billing options or operator assistance, or both billing options and operator assistance. End Users are members of the transient public, and therefore considered casual users of the ACT Network.
- (B) ACT Operator Services is offered via Subscribers pay telephones, PBX or similar switch vehicle to Customers for direct transmission of voice telecommunications to locations throughout the State of Missouri. Service is provided through the terminal equipment of Subscribers serving the transient public.
- (C) Service is available 24 hours per day, 7 days a week from Subscribing locations.
- (D) No deposits are required for ACT Operator Services.
- (E) Minimum call duration is one minute. Minimum charges include the usage charge for the initial minute, Time of Day and Holiday discounts, and applicable service charges.
- (F) ACT Operator Services rates and charges are specified in Section 4.0 following.
- (G) The end user will be informed of the utilization of the ACT network. A pre-recorded message, "Thank you for using ACT," occurs prior to the call being outpulsed.

When a live operator for assistance is required, he/she will answer, "ACT Operator", as well as provide his/her first name. Thereafter, this operator will proceed to inform the end user that his/her call is being carried over ACT's network.

> 4.8 **Emergency Calls**

MISSCUEL Public Service Commission

Subscriber shall configure its pay telephone, PBX, or other switch vehicle from which a customer places a call so that 911 emergency calls, where available, and similar emergency calls will be automatically routed to the emergency answering point for the geographical location where the call originated without the intervention of ACT. Emergency calls which do reach a ACT operator shall be handled in accordance with ACT standard operating procedures.

Standard Emergency Operating Procedures 4.8.1

911 calls are not routed but completed through the local network. If a caller dials an ACT operator or a 911 call is mistakenly routed to ACT, ACT's systems are designed to handle the call efficiently and expeditiously. ACT operator software retains an emergency number database associated with the originating location of the call. A single key stroke by the operator connects the caller and the operator to the appropriate emergency answering agency at the originating locations of the call. The operator remains in connection until he or she has verified that the caller and the emergency answering service location personnel have established conversation and that the caller location has been identified. No billing applies to emergency calls.
