- Primary Listing** - A primary listing in the directory is furnished as part of a customer's local telephone service. The primary listing may include the name, address and telephone number of the individual, organization, firm, or corporation contracting for the service. JAN 15 1997

- Additional Listing** - Directory information which may provide a name and/or address of a customer within the same exchange.
- Premise** - All of the buildings or the adjoining portions of a building occupied and used by the subscriber as a place of business or residence, which are located on a contiguous plot of ground not intersected by a public thoroughfare.
- Extension Service** - An extension is an additional station connected to the same access line as the main station, and having the same telephone number as the main station.
- Toll Restriction** - Central office arrangement that would allow the placing of local calls however all outgoing long distance calls and operator service calls would be blocked.
- Demarcation Point** - The point of connection, provided and maintained by the telephone utility to which the station wiring becomes dedicated to an individual customer's use. For an individual customer dwelling, this point of connection will generally be the modular jack incorporated into the customer side of the Network Interface Device (NID). The drop wire and the network protector will continue to be provided by, and remain the property of, the telephone company. The demarcation point is usually the point at which the telephone company wiring connects with the customers wiring. +





1. A disabled customer, or a dependent, is a customer who requests or receives residential essential local telecommunications service, as defined in section 1 (c) of this tariff, and meets the eligibility requirements set forth in this tariff.

2. Support Amount – Customers eligible under the established criteria can receive a discount equal to the amount approved by the Missouri Public Service Commission from their bill for essential local telecommunications service. The amount of state lifeline support for any customer will not exceed the recurring charges for essential local telecommunications services (including the basic service rate, Touch-Tone calling charge, extended area service additive and mileage additives, if any).

MISSOURI UNIVERSAL SERVICE FUND

1. Company will place on each end retail end-user customer's bill, a surcharge equal to the Missouri Universal Service Fund percentage assessment ordered by the Commission.
2. The surcharge will appear as a separate line item detailed as "Missouri Universal Service Fund".
3. The surcharge percentage will be applied to the total of each customer's charges for intrastate regulated telecommunications services that meet the definition of net jurisdictional revenues at 4 CSR 240-31.010(12).




