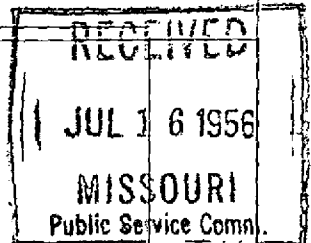

B. SIX ELEMENT CHARGE PLAN

The Six Element Charge Plan covers any work done at the request of the subscriber for single, or multi-party business or residence service.

Elements Covered:

1. Service ordering Charge covers all work associated with creation and processing of service order, including initial interview with subscriber, work done as to application for service and other permanent records, typing service orders, distribution of service order copies and completion of all other records originating from service orders.
2. Trip Charge covers the trip to the customer **CANCELLED** when work is required under either categories 4, 5, and 6 following.
