3.5.4 RDST Prepaid Calling Cards

This service permits use of Prepaid Calling Cards for placing long distance calls. Customers may purchase RDST Prepaid Calling Cards at a variety of retail outlets or through other distribution channels. Prepaid Calling Cards are available at a variety of face values ranging from five dollars (\$5.00), in one dollar (\$1.00) increments. RDST Prepaid Calling Card service is accessed using the RDST toll-free number printed on the card. The caller is prompted by an automated voice response system to enter his/her Authorization Code, and then to enter the terminating telephone number. RDST's processor tracks the call duration on a real time basis to determine the number of Telecom Units consumed. total consumed Telecom Units for each call is deducted from the remaining Telecom Unit balance on the Customer's RDST Prepaid Calling Card.

All calls must be charged against Prepaid Calling Card that has a sufficient Telecom Unit balance. A Customer's call will be interrupted with an announcement when the balance is about to be depleted.

In order to continue the call, the Customer can either call the toll-free number on the back of the RDST Prepaid Calling Card and "recharge" the balance on the card using a nationally recognized credit card, or the Customer can throw the card away and purchase a new one. Calls in progress will be terminated by the Company if the balance on the RDST Prepaid Calling Card is insufficient to continue the call and the Customer fails to enter the number of another valid RDST Prepaid Calling Card prior to termination.
