

When a new sheet is added between sheets already in effect, a decimal is added. For example, a new sheet added between sheets 14 and 15 would be 14.1.
- B. <u>Sheet Revision Numbers</u> Revision numbers also appear in the upper right corner of each page. These numbers are used to determine the most current sheet version on file with the Commission. For example, the 4th revised Sheet 14 cancels the 3rd revised Sheet 14. Because of various suspension periods, deferrals, etc. the Commission follows in their tariff approval process, the most current sheet number on file with the Commission is not always the tariff page in effect.

<u>Access Line</u> - An arrangement from a local exchange telephone company or other common carrier, using either dedicated or switched access, which connects a subscriber's location to Carrier's location or switching center.

<u>Authorization Code</u> - A numerical code, one or more of which may be assigned to a subscriber, to enable Carrier to identify the origin of service user so it may rate and bill the call. All authorization codes shall be the sole property of Carrier and no subscriber shall have any property or other right or interest in the use of any particular authorization code. Automatic numbering identification (ANI) may be used as or in connection with the authorization code.

<u>Automatic Numbering Identification (ANI)</u> - A type of signalling provided by a local exchange telephone company which automatically identifies the local exchange line from which a call originates.

Carrier - Refers to L.D. Services, Inc.

Commission - Refers to the Missouri Public Service Commission.

<u>Common Carrier</u> - A company or entity providing telecommunications services to the public.

<u>Holiday</u> - New Year's Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, President's Day, Thanksgiving Day, and Christmas Day.

<u>Local Access and Transport Area</u> (<u>LATA</u>) - The term "Local Access Transport Area" denotes a geographical area established by the U.S. District Court for the District of Columbia in Civil Action No. 82-0192, within which a local exchange company provides communications services.

<u>Measured Charge</u> - A charge assessed on a per minute basis in calculating the charges due for a completed call.

2.1 Application of Tariff

- 2.1 <u>Application of Tariff</u> (Cont'd)
 - 2.1.5 The subscriber is entitled to limit the use of Carrier's services by users at the subscriber's facilities, and may use other common carriers in addition to or in lieu of Carrier's services, including without limitation, offering users the ability to access the carrier of the user's own choice.

2.2 <u>Use of Services</u>

- 2.4.1 The subscriber is responsible for placing any necessary orders; for complying with tariff regulations; and for assuring that users comply with tariff regulations. The subscriber shall ensure compliance with any applicable laws, regulations, orders or other requirements (as they exist from time to time) of any governmental entity relating to services provided or made available by the subscriber to end users. The subscriber is also responsible for the payment of charges for calls originated at the subscriber's numbers which are not collect, third party, third-party calling card, or credit card calls.

2.4.5 The subscriber shall ensure that the equipment and/or system is properly interfaced with Carrier facilities or services, that the signals emitted into Carrier's network are of the proper mode, bandwidth, power, and signal level for the intended use of the subscriber and in compliance with the criteria set forth in this tariff, and that the signals do not damage equipment, injure personnel, or degrade service to other subscribers. - 2.6.1 Without incurring liability, Carrier may discontinue services to a subscriber or may withhold the provision of ordered or contracted services, subject to the procedures set forth in 2.6.2:
 - (A) For nonpayment of any sum due Carrier for more than thirty days after issuance of the bill for the amount due,
 - (B) For violation of any of the provisions of this tariff,
 - (C) For violation of any law, rule, regulation or policy of any governing authority having jurisdiction over Carrier's services, or
 - (D) By reason of any order or decision of a court, public service commission or federal regulatory body or other governing authority prohibiting Carrier from furnishing its services.

2.6 <u>Cancellation or Interruption of Services</u> (Cont'd)

- 2.6.2 Procedures for discontinuance of existing service:
 - A. Carrier may discontinue service without notice for any of the following reasons:
 - 1. If a subscriber or user causes or permits any signals or voltages to be transmitted over Carrier's network in such a manner as to cause a hazard or to interfere with Carrier's service to others.
 - 2. If a subscriber or user uses Carrier's services in a manner to violate the law.
 - B. In all other circumstances, Carrier will provide the subscriber with written notice stating the reason for discontinuance, and will allow the subscriber a period of time in which to remove the cause for discontinuance.

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SECTION 2. <u>RULES AND REGULATIONS</u> (Cont'd)

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- 2.6 <u>Cancellation or Interruption of Services</u> (Cont'd)
 - 2.6.3 Without incurring liability, Carrier may interrupt the provision of services at any time in order to perform tests and inspections to assure compliance with tariff regulations and the proper installation and operation of subscriber and Carrier's equipment and facilities and may continue such interruption until any items of non-compliance or improper equipment operation so identified are rectified.
 - 2.6.4 Service may be discontinued by Carrier, without notice to the subscriber, by blocking traffic to certain countries, cities, or NXX exchanges, or by blocking calls using certain customer authorization codes, when Carrier deems it necessary to take such action to prevent unlawful use of its service. Carrier will restore service as soon as it can be provided without undue risk, and will, upon request by the customer affected, assign a new authorization code to replace the one that has been deactivated.

2.7 Billing Arrangements

2.7.1 Direct Dial Calls

Subscribers will either be billed directly by Carrier or its intermediary, or charges will be included in the subscribers' regular home or business telephone bill pursuant to billing and collection agreements established by Carrier or its intermediary with the applicable telephone company.

2.8 Validation of Credit

Carrier reserves the right to validate the credit worthiness of users through available credit card and calling card verification procedures. Where a requested billing method cannot be validated, the user may be required to provide an acceptable alternate billing method or Carrier may refuse to place the call.

2.9 <u>Contested Charges</u>

All bills are presumed accurate, and shall be binding unless objection is received by the Carrier within thirty days after such bills are rendered. In the case of a billing dispute between the subscriber and the Carrier for service furnished by Carrier which cannot be settled with mutual satisfaction, the subscriber can take the following course of action within 30 days of the billing date:

2.9.1 First, the subscriber may request, and the Carrier will provide, an in-depth review of the disputed amount. (The undisputed portion and subsequent bills must be paid on a timely basis or the service may be subject to disconnect.)

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- 2.9 <u>Contested Charges</u> (Cont'd)
 - 2.9.2 Second, if there is still a disagreement about the disputed amount after the investigation and review by a manager of the Carrier, the subscriber may file an appropriate complaint with the Missouri Public Service Commission. The Commission's address is:

2.10 Billing Entity Conditions

When billing functions on behalf of Carrier are performed by local exchange telephone companies, credit card companies or others, the payment conditions and regulations of such companies apply, including any applicable interest and/or late payment charge conditions.

2.11 Deposits

Carrier does not require a deposit from the subscriber.

2.12 Taxes

All federal excise taxes, and state and local sales, use, and similar taxes, are the responsibility of the user, are billed as separate line items and are not included in the quoted rates. Gross receipts tax will not be billed as a separate line item.

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SECTION 3. DESCRIPTION OF SERVICE

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3.1 <u>Timing of Calls</u>

Billing for calls placed over the Carrier network is based on the duration of the call. Timing begins when the called station is answered, as determined by standard industry methods generally in use for ascertaining answer, including hardware answer supervision in which the local telephone company sends a signal to the switch or the software utilizing audio tone detection.

3.2 <u>Calculation of Distance</u>

Usage charges for all mileage sensitive products are based on the airline distance between rate centers associated with the originating and terminating points of the call. Carrier uses the rate centers, associated vertical and horizontal coordinates, and method of computing mileage set forth in AT&T Tariff F.C.C. No. 10.

3.3 Service Offerings

Carrier provides direct dialed services. The applicable rates for these services are set forth in Section 4 of this tariff.

3.4 Directory Assistance

Carrier does not offer directory assistance services. Directory assistance calls are routed to the local exchange company.

3.5 <u>Minimum Call Completion Rate</u>

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Carrier will ensure an industry standard blocking rate of less than P.01.

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SECTION 4. RATES

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This section sets forth the rates and charges applicable to Carrier's measured use service offering.

The total charge for each completed direct dialed call consists of the measured usage charge incurred. The minimum measured usage charge is one minute. Thereafter the measured usage charge is calculated in one minute increments. Direct-dialed calls will be completed at the measured usage charge rates contained herein.

Α. Calls placed from 8 a.m. to (but not including) 5 p.m. Monday -Friday will be billed at the following rates:

> Per Minute: \$0.2500

C. Calls placed from 11 p.m. Monday to (but not including) 8 a.m. Thursday and 11:00 p.m. Friday to (but not including) 8 a.m. Monday will be billed at the following rates:

Per Minute: \$0.19003

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
