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FAC net includable costs for the first partial accumulation period ending December 31, 2015, have increased by approximately \$7.2 million above the base costs included in rates. In accordance with the FAC for KCP&L approved by the Commission, the proposed rate schedules are designed to recover from customers 95 percent of those net cost increases. The requested increase will result in an increase to a typical residential customer’s bill of approximately \$0.67 per month.
