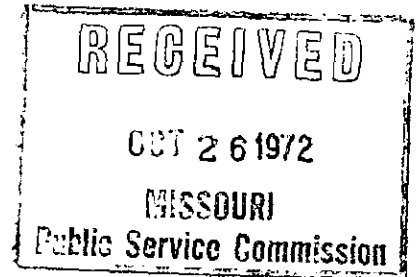

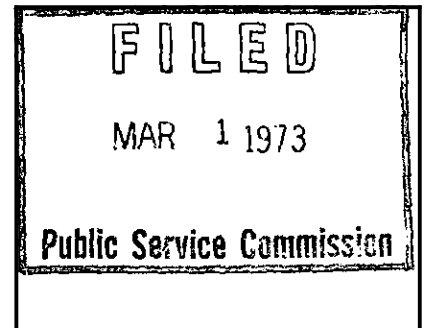

CUSTOM AND CLASS CALLING SERVICES

(*)

A. General

1. Custom Calling Services and Custom Local Area Signaling Services (CLASS) are features that provide special customer-controlled communications or call management capabilities from appropriately equipped central offices.
2. Conditions. Custom Calling and CLASS services may be provided on individual lines, key business lines, but are not provided in conjunction with coin telephone services.
3. Special Promotions. Alma Telephone Company may during certain promotional periods waive the non-recurring installation or move charge and/or monthly rates for customers who wish to participate. Any promotional waiver or discounted rate will apply only one time per customer for each service during the promotional period. Alma Telephone Company will notify the Commission in advance of these promotions, and obtain the Commission's approval, when required.
4. Grade of Transmission. The grade of transmission of calls which are forwarded or added may vary depending upon the distance, routine, and routing necessary to complete the call. The normal grade of transmission is not guaranteed on any forwarded or added call.

B. The services are listed and generally described as follows:

1. Automatic Callback allows a customer to make a call to the last directory number called. The callback can be made if the called number was busy or idle, whether the call was answered or not.
2. Automatic Recall allows a customer to place a call to the source of the last incoming call to the customer.
3. Call Forwarding allows a customer to transfer all incoming calls to another dialable telephone number.
4. Call Hold allows a customer to return the telephone's handset to its hook while a call is in progress.
5. Call Waiting provides a signal to a customer using the telephone that another call is being attempted to his number. The customer can "hold" the original call to answer the incoming call.
6. Distinctive Ring/Directory Number allows a customer to receive a distinctive ringing pattern on a second directory phone number using the same equipment as the first phone number.
7. Speed Calling 8 and 30 number allows a customer to reach preset numbers by abbreviated dialing. The customer can alter his speed calling list.

8. Three Way Calling allows a customer to add a third party to an existing conversation. The party initiating a three way call (the controller) may place one party on hold while dialing and talking to a second party. The controller may then include the held party in a three way connection. The added party may be dropped from the connection by a flash from the controller. Multiple three way calls may be connected by "chaining" the calls, provided the chaining is done by a non-controlling party in an established three way call. The chaining function is restricted when the System Option "Three Way Calling Originator Only" option has been enabled.
9. Wakeup Call allows a wakeup call to be set up to ring a customer's telephone at a pre-programmed time.
10. Calling Name Delivery allows the customer to associate a name with the calling number. The name is retrieved from a centralized database. If the calling party's name is not available, a letter "O" for out of area appears. If the name is restricted, a "P" for privacy will be transmitted (the customer's equipment will interpret the "O" and the "P" and display appropriate text). Calling Name Delivery cannot be set up not to additionally display Calling Name Delivery.
11. Calling Number Delivery allows the calling party Directory Number to be passed to the called party's line. The Directory Number is transmitted as a ten digit string. If the Directory Number not available, a letter "O" for out of area, or "P" for privacy will be transmitted (the customer's equipment will interpret the "O" and the "P" and display appropriate text).
12. Caller ID enables the customer to view on a display unit the Calling Party Directory name and/or number (CPN) on incoming telephone calls.

When Caller ID is activated on a customer's line, the CPN of incoming calls are displayed on the called CPE during the first long silent interval of the ringing cycle.

Per line blocking for the blocking of CPN will be available upon request, at no additional charge, only to the following entities for lines over which the official business of the agency is conducted, including those at residences of the employees/volunteers of the agency, where an executive officer registers a need for blocking and provides the required certification to Alma Telephone Company: private, nonprofit, tax exempt, domestic violence intervention agencies and federal, state, and local law enforcement agencies. CPN will not be transmitted from a line equipped with this capability. Per line blocking is operational on a continuous basis but can be deactivated by the customer dialing an access code immediately prior to placing a call. Line blocking customer can unblock their CPN information on a per call basis, at no additional charge, by dialing access code *82 immediately prior to placing the call.

12. Caller ID (cont)

A customer may prevent delivery of their calling name and/or number to the called party by dialing an access code *67 immediately prior to placing a call. The access code will activate per call blocking, which is available at no additional charge. If the calling party activates blocking, the CPN will not be transmitted across the line to the called party. Instead, Calling Line Identification customers will receive an anonymous indicator notifying the Caller ID customer that the calling party has elected to block the delivery of their name and/or number. The blocking of CPN will not be provided on calls originating from Customer-Owned Pay Telephone Service. If the Caller ID customer also subscribes to Anonymous Call Rejection, the calling party will be routed to a recording advising the caller that the called party will not access calls for which CPN has been blocked.

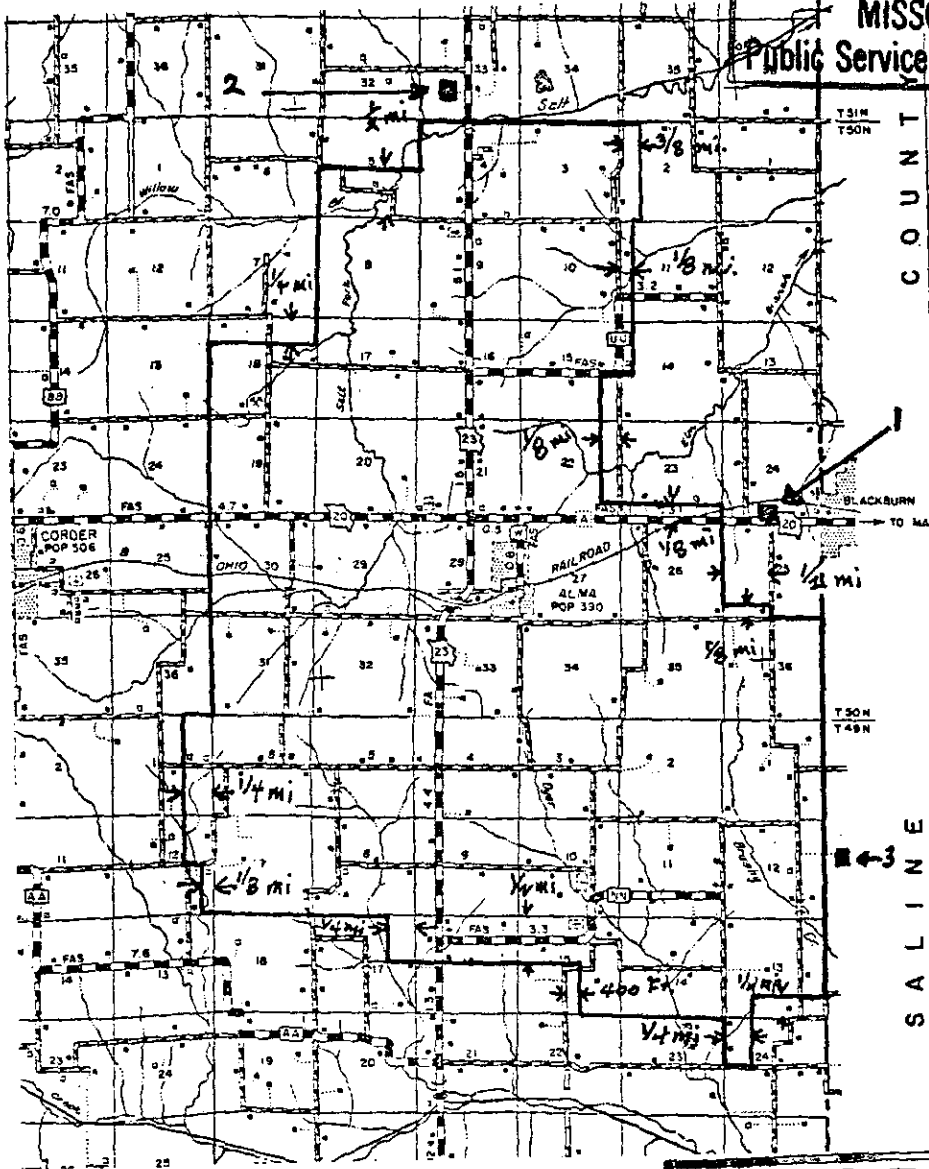

A. Service Connection Charges

JAN 15 1997

The term "Service Connection Charges" is used to define the nonrefundable charge made for the establishment of a class of telephone service or subsequent additions to that service and are in addition to any other scheduled rates and charges normally applying under the Tariffs.

Service Connection Charges may be payable at the time application is made for the particular service or facility, and prior to establishment of service or upon presentation of a bill.

Service connection charges do not apply to:

1. Hold for Future Use
2. Directory listings.
3. Service changed from a residence to a business classification, or vice versa.
4. Service reestablished after the destruction or partial destruction of the subscriber's premises by means beyond the control of the subscriber whether at the same or another location. However, if service is established at a new location and the subscriber later moves back to the old location, the Service Connection Charge is applied in connection with the reestablished service at the old location.

New Installations and Outside Moves receive the same treatment for charge purposes. An Outside Move is where the subscriber's service is changed from one premise to another, including the change from one trailer house to another at an identical location.

2. Transfer or Name Change where Service is in Place: charges apply where service in place is taken over by a new applicant and no change is made at the applicant's request in the type or location of the Demarcation Point*.	\$ 9.00	
3. Restoral of Service Charge after Suspension for which the Subscriber is Responsible.	\$ 19.00	(I)
4. Customer provided equipment when making a maintenance service call to customer premise and trouble is found in customer owned equipment, a \$10.00 trip charge will be made to the customer.		

*Demarcation Point – The point of connection, provided and maintained by the telephone company, at which the station wiring becomes dedicated to an individual customer's use. For an individual customer dwelling this point of connection will generally be the modular jack incorporated into the customer side of the Network Interface Device (NID). The drop wire and the network protector will continue to be provided by, and remain the property of, the telephone company. The demarcation point is usually the point at which the telephone company wiring connects with the customer's wiring.

B. MOVES AND CHANGES CHARGES

The charges specified herein for Moves and Changes do not contemplate work being performed by the Telephone Company employees involved at a time when overtime wages apply, due to the request of the customer, nor does it contemplate work once begun being interrupted by the customer. If the customer requests that overtime labor be performed or interrupts work once begun, an additional charge, based on the additional costs involved, applies.

1. Moves and Changes charges apply where access service is transferred from one demarcation point to another demarcation point on the same premises where there is no interruption of the service other than is incident to the work involved. ----- \$9.00
2. Move Outside of Building receives same treatment as New Installation as far as charge purposes are concerned. An Outside Move is where the subscriber's service is changed from one premises to another, including rearrangement or rewiring of outside wiring made necessary because of relocation of a trailer. ----- \$18.00

Moves and Changes Charges do not apply to:

1. Moves or changes required for the proper maintenance of the service.

A. General Regulations

1. Payphone Service includes lines to which coin, coinless, card reader or a combination of coin/card reader telephones may be attached.
2. Payphone Service is a two-way or, optionally, one-way originating only business exchange access line composed of the serving central office line equipment, all outside plant facilities needed to connect the serving central office with the customer's premises, and the Network Interface Device at the demarcation point. These facilities are Company-provided and maintained and provide access to and from the telecommunications network for long distance service and local calling.
3. In the case of one-way service, intercept treatment will be provided.
4. A maximum of one customer-provided instrument may be connected to any one Instrument or CO implemented coin line.
5. General Rules and Regulations found in other sections of this tariff are applicable to the provision of Payphone Service.
6. Directory listings may be provided under the regulations governing the furnishing of listings for business subscribers.

2. Upon the customer's request, a discount of twenty percent (20%) from standard monthly access line rates may be allowed to educational institutions within the Company's certified area, as determined in Paragraph 3, following.
3. An educational institution shall be defined either as an accredited public school, or an accredited private school which is tax exempt pursuant to 26 U.S.C. § 501(c)(3). Persons operating home schools, as defined in § 167.031 RSMo, shall not be eligible for this school discount program. Private schools must be accredited by either the Missouri Chapter of the National Federation of Non-Public Schools Accrediting Association, Independent Schools Association of the Central States, North Central Association of Colleges and Schools, and/or the University of Missouri-Columbia. Public Schools must be accredited by the Department of Elementary and Secondary Education for the State of Missouri and/or the North Central Association of Colleges and Schools.
4. The qualifying discount will be permitted only on the local exchange access line. All other features, ancillary services or options, relative to the particular service, shall continue to be billed at the appropriate tariffed rates.
5. The qualifying discount will be permitted only where the predominant use is providing educational and instructional programs and for the educational institutions' administrative use. The discount is not allowed to residential complexes associated with the institution.
6. In addition to meeting the qualification specified in Paragraph 3 preceding, an eligible customer must sign an affidavit certifying that the qualification is met. The affidavit will be retained on file with the Company.
7. The customer should request to receive the discount on all subsequent additions of eligible services which are ordered. There will be no additional affidavits required.

A. APPLICATION

The rules and regulations specified herein are in addition to those contained in the Local Exchange Service Tariffs, the General Exchange Service Tariffs and the Long Distance Service Tariffs. They apply to the intrastate services and facilities furnished in Missouri by the Alma Telephone Company, hereinafter referred to as the Telephone Company, or Company. Failure on the part of the subscribers to observe these rules and regulations of the Telephone Company, after due notice of such failure, automatically gives the Telephone Company the privilege to cancel the contract and discontinue the furnishing of service.

In the event of a conflict between any rate, rule, regulations or provision contained in these General Rules and Regulations and any rate, rule, regulation or provision contained in the Local Exchange Service Tariffs, the General Exchange Service Tariffs or the Long Distance Service Tariffs, the rate, rule, regulation or provision contained in the specific Tariffs shall prevail.

These Tariffs cancel and supersede all other Tariffs of the Telephone Company issued and effective prior to the effective dates of this Tariff.

2. Interruptions of Service

If service is interrupted for more than 36 hours other than by the negligence or wilful act of the subscriber, an allowance at the minimum rate for the telephone facilities and class of service affected at the time of the interruption shall be made for the time such interruption continues, after notice and demand to the Company. No other liability shall in any case attach to the Company.

3. Directory errors and Omissions

- (a) The Telephone Company's liability for damages on account of interruptions to service due to errors or omissions in directory listings will be limited to a pro rate abatement of the charge for such of the subscriber's service as is affected, the maximum abatement not to exceed one-half the service charges for the period from the date of issuance of the directory in which the mistake occurred to the date of issuance of a new directory containing the proper listing.

 - b. The customer has had service disconnected for non payment of a delinquent charge or failed to post a required deposit or guarantee.
- B. In lieu of a deposit the Company may accept a written guarantee. The guarantee shall not exceed the amount of a cash deposit that the Company could request under this section. (C)
- C. As a condition of continued service to an existing customer the Company may require a deposit or guarantee if undisputed charges in two out of the last twelve (12) billing periods becomes delinquent. (C)

7. Discontinuance of Service for Failure to Establish Credit

Service may be discontinued for failure to establish, or maintain, credit, as authorized above. At least ten (10) days prior to the date of the proposed discontinuance, the company will mail, by first class mail, or deliver a written notice by hand to the customer at least ninety-six (96) hours prior to discontinuance, a statement of the reasons for the proposed discontinuance. The statement of discontinuance shall contain the following information:

- A. Name, address, and telephone number of the customer.
- B. Reason for the proposed discontinuance and the cost for reconnection.
- C. Date after which service will be discontinued and how the customer may avoid the discontinuance.
- D. Customer's right to enter into a settlement agreement if the claim is for a charge not in dispute and the customer is unable to pay the charge in full at one time.
- E. Telephone number where the customer may make an inquiry.
- F. Statement that the notice will not be effective if the charges involved are part of an unresolved dispute.
- G. Statement of the exception for medical emergency, as related in sheet 50-23.1 section 6.

8. Service Reconnection Charge

Where service has been discontinued for failure to establish credit, as authorized above, the regular charge to restore service will be made and collected by the Telephone Company.

Access Line

Communication facilities from the customer premises to the central office for the provision of communication services.

Access Service

The provision of access to the communication facilities of the telephone company.

Channel (See Circuit)

Circuit

A term applies to a channel used for the transmission of electrical energy in the furnishing of access service.

Connecting Company

A corporation, association, partnership or individual owning or operating one or more exchanges and with whom traffic is interchanged.

Contract

The term "contract" refers to the service agreement between a customer and the Telephone Company under which services and facilities are furnished in accordance with the provisions of the applicable tariffs.

Customer (See Subscriber)

Demarcation Point

The point of connection, provided and maintained by the Telephone Company, at which the station wiring becomes dedicated to an individual customer's use. For an individual customer dwelling this point of connection will generally be the modular jack incorporated into the customer side of the Network Interface Device (NID). The drop wire and the network protector will continue to be provided by, and remain the property of, the Telephone Company. The demarcation point is usually the point at which the Telephone Company wiring connects with the customer's wiring.

Exchange

A basic unit for the administration of communication service in a specified area, called the exchange area which usually embraces a city, town, or village and its environs. It usually consists of one or more central offices, together with the associated plant used furnishing communication service to the general public within that area.

Exchange Area

The territory served by an Exchange.

Extra Listing

Any listing of a name or information in connection with a subscriber's telephone number beyond that to which the subscriber is entitled in connection with his regular service.

Individual Line

An exchange line designed for the connection of only one main station. (Not a private branch exchange trunk line).

DEFINITIONS (CONTINUED)

Installation Charge

A nonrecurring charge made for the furnishing of telephone access service, which may apply in place of or in addition to access service connection and other applicable charges for service.

Local Message

A communication between a calling access line and any other access line within the same local service area of the calling access line.

Local Access Service Area (See Local Service Area)

Local Service Area

The area throughout which communication access service is rendered to a calling access line without the application of toll charges.

Network Interface Device (NID)

A device wired between the telecommunications protector and the inside wiring to isolate the customer's equipment from the network.

Premises

The term "same premises" shall be interpreted to mean all portions of the same building occupied by the same customer.

Service Connection Charge

A charge applied to establishing access service, changing or relocating service on the subscriber's premises.

Subscriber

The individual, partnership, association, or corporation which contracts for telephone service and is responsible for the payment of charges and compliance with the rules and regulations of the Telephone Company.

Toll Message

A message from a calling access line to an access line located in a different local access service area.

V. UNIVERSAL EMERGENCY NUMBER SERVICE (911)

1. Universal Emergency Number Service (911)

1.1 General

- A. Universal Emergency Number Service, also referred to as 911 Service, is a telephone exchange communication service whereby one or more Public Safety Answering Points (PSAP) designated by the customer may receive telephone calls dialed to the telephone number 911. 911 Service includes a line and equipment necessary (excluding CPE) for the answering, transferring and dispatching of public emergency telephone 911 calls originated by persons within the serving area. 911 Trunking Service involves the provision of interoffice trunks from the Telephone Company Central Office to connect with the PSAP location.
- B. The 911 emergency number is not intended to replace the telephone service of the various Public Safety Agencies which may participate in the use of this number. The 911 customer must subscribe to additional local exchange service at the PSAP for administrative purpose, for the placing of outgoing calls and for receiving other emergency calls, including any which might be related by Company operators.
- C. 911 Trunking Service is offered subject to availability of facilities.
- D. The 911 Trunking Service customer may be a municipality or other state or local government unit, or an authorized agent of one or more municipalities or other state or local governmental units to whom authority has been lawfully delegated. The customer must be legally authorized to subscribe to the service and have public safety responsibility by law to respond to telephone calls from the public for police, fire or other emergency services within the telephone Central Office area arranged for 911 calling.

1. Universal Emergency Number Service (911) (Cont'd)

1.1 General (Cont'd)

- E. The Company may enter into a contract or contracts with the 911 customer or with other telephone companies in order to effectuate the Company's provision of 911 Service in accordance with, pursuant to, and subject to the terms, conditions and limitations of the Tariff. Any such contract(s) shall incorporate by reference the terms, conditions and limitations of this Tariff.
- F. The rates and charges contained herein are in addition to all other applicable rates and charges located in other parts of this tariff.

1.2 Conditions

- A. 911 Trunking Service is provided solely for the benefit of the customer operating the PSAP. The provision of 911 Trunking Service by the Company shall not be interpreted, construed or regarded, either express or implied, as being for the benefit of or creating any Company obligation toward any third person or legal entity other than the customer.
- B. The Company does not undertake to answer and forward 911 calls, but furnishes the use of its facilities to enable the customer's personnel to respond to such calls on the customer's premises.
- C. Temporary or vacation suspensions of service are not provided for any part of the 911 Trunking Service.
- D. 911 Service information consisting of the names, addresses and telephone numbers of Subscribers whose listings are not published in directories or listed in the Directory Assistance records is treated as strictly confidential.
- E. End Users dialing 911 forfeit the privacy afforded by nonpublished and unlisted telephone number service to the extent that the telephone number, address and name associated with the originating station location may be furnished by a PSAP. Information will be provided only for the purpose of responding to emergency calls.

1.2 Conditions (Cont'd)

- F. The Company's entire liability to any person for interruption or failures of 911 Trunking Service shall be limited to the terms set forth in this section and other sections of this tariff.
- G. The customer shall have the responsibility of discovering all errors, defects and malfunctions, in the transmission of calls and data, data base(s), and overall operation of the system. The customer shall make such operational tests as, in the judgment of the customer, are required to determine whether the system is functioning properly for its use. The customer shall promptly notify the Company in the event the system is not functioning properly.
- H. The Company's liability for any loss or damage arising from errors, interruptions, defects, failures or malfunctions of this service or any part thereof whether caused by the negligence of the Company or otherwise shall not exceed an amount equivalent to the pro-rata charges for the service affected during the period of time that the service was fully or partially inoperative.
- I. Each customer also agrees to release, indemnify and hold harmless the Company from any and all loss, claims, demands, suits or other action, or any liability whatsoever, whether suffered, made, instituted or asserted by the customer or by any other party or person, for any personal injury to or death of any person or persons, or for any loss, damage or destruction of any property, whether owned by the customer or others.
- J. The customer also agrees to release, indemnify and hold harmless the Company for any infringement or invasion of the right of privacy of any person or persons, caused or claimed to have been caused, directly or indirectly by the installation, operation, failure to operate, maintenance, removal, presence, condition, occasion or use of 911 Trunking Service features, the equipment associated therewith, or by any services furnished by the Company in connection therewith, including, but not limited to, the identification of the telephone number, address or name associated with the telephone used by the party or parties accessing 911 Trunking Service

J. (Cont'd)

hereunder, and which arise out of the negligence or other wrongful act of the Company, the customer, its user, agencies or municipalities, or the employees or agents or any one of them.

K. Because the Company serving boundaries and political subdivision boundaries may not coincide, it is the obligation of the customer to make arrangements to handle all 911 calls that originate from telephones served by Telephone Company Wire Centers served by the PSAP whether or not the calling telephone is situated on property within the geographical boundaries of the customer's public safety jurisdiction.

L. Application for 911 Trunking Service must be executed in writing by each customer. If application for service is made by an agent, the Company must be provided in writing with satisfactory proof of appointment of the agent by the customer. At least one local law enforcement agency must be included among the participating agencies in any 911 offering.

M. The customer is required to furnish the Company its agreement to the following terms and conditions:

1. That all 911 calls will be answered in a 24-hour day, seven-day week basis.
2. That that customer has responsibility for dispatching the appropriate emergency service vehicles within the 911 Service area, or will undertake to transfer all 911 calls received to the governmental agency with responsibility for dispatching such services, to the extent that such services are reasonably available.
3. That the customer will develop an appropriate method for responding to calls for non-participating agencies which may be directed to the 911 PSAP by calling parties.
4. That the customer will provide CPE with a capacity adequate to handle the number of incoming 911 lines recommended to be installed by the Company. It is the customer's responsibility to ensure its CPE is compatible with the service(s) provided by the Company.

1.2 Conditions (Cont'd)

- N. This service is offered solely as an aid in handling assistance calls in connection with fire, police and other emergencies and does not create any relationship or obligation, direct or indirect, to any person other than the 911 customer contracting for 911 Trunking Services. In the event of any interruption of the service, the Company shall not be liable to any person, corporation or other entity for any loss or damage in an amount greater than an amount equal to the pro rata allowance of the tariff rate for the service or facilities provided to the 911 customer for the time such interruption continues, after notice to the Company. No allowance shall be made if the interruption is due to the negligence or willful act of the 911 customer.
- O. The rates charged for 911 Trunking Service do not contemplate the constant monitoring or inspection of facilities to discover errors, defects and malfunctions in the service, nor does the Company undertake such responsibility. The 911 customer shall make such operational tests as, in the judgment of the customer, are required to determine whether the system is functioning properly for its use. The customer shall notify the Company in the event the system is not functioning properly.
- P. In the absence of willful misconduct or gross negligence, no liability for any death or injury to any person or for any damage to property shall attach to the Company, its employees, agents or representatives as a result of or in connection with any situation in which the Company may be requested, required, have undertaken or participated in the tracing of a 911 call.
- Q. The customer recognizes that the addresses provided to it by the Company are the same addresses that the Company maintains for its ordinary service, billing or directory records and the Company cannot unconditionally guarantee their existence or accuracy in emergency situations. Therefore, the customer recognizes that addresses should, where circumstances permit, be verified from a 911 calling party. The customer shall make the correction within a reasonable time under the circumstances.

1.3 Rates

- A. The rates and charges for 911 Trunking Service set out below are for the provision by the Company of its facilities for trunking calls for the Company's central offices to the PSAP, or between Central Offices. The customer is responsible to order connecting trunking facilities from other telephone companies when necessary to extend the trunks to a PSAP beyond the Telephone Company serving area.

Trunks between Central Offices and PSAP	\$25.00

B. Database Records Charges

These charges are applicable to the work necessary for Company customer records to support E911 Service. The initial record charge is for work necessary to complete the initial upload to the E911 provider, which includes verification of records to the Master Street Address Guide ("MSAG"). Customer updates beyond the initial upload would include new requests for service in the Company's serving area, orders that change a customer's name, telephone number and/or address, and will include verification to the MSAG. A record update(s) generated due to a Company error will not be assessed a Database record charge. If an error is due to inaccurate information provided by a 911 customer, a charge will be assessed.

811 SERVICES

SECTION 1. DESCRIPTION

811 Service is a three-digit abbreviated local dialing arrangement which allows local exchange end-users to reach the providers of Missouri's One Call Notification System (811 Customer). 811 Service is used by the One Call Notification system to provide notice of excavation activities to operators of underground facilities. 811 Service determines the central office serving the calling party, translates the dialed digits to an 811 Customer provided designated toll free telephone number, and routes the call to that number.

SECTION 2. TERMS AND CONDITIONS

- 2.0 The Company and the 811 Customer will negotiate the installation date for the 811 Service.
- 2.1 There can be only one 811 Customer for each stand-alone, host, or remote central office NAP-NXX serving area.
- 2.2 The Company will route calls based upon the serving central office.
- 2.3 The 811 Customer must provide a toll-free number to the Company to ensure that toll charges are not incurred by the end-user. At all times it shall be the obligation of the 811 Customer to test and be aware of any translation errors or other mistakes in routing 811 calls to the customer provided toll free number.
- 2.4 811 Service can only be accessed by end-users who subscribe to the Company's local exchange service. 811 Service will not complete calls dialed using 0 + 811 or 1 + 811. 811 calls are not permitted where local calling is restricted.
- 2.5 811 Service does not include operator assisted calls, and will only be available to PBX, Centrex, and Key switching systems when those systems have been correctly programmed. The Company does not undertake to perform, nor shall it be responsible, for such programming.
- 2.6 811 Service is provided as a community service. There will be no recurring or non-recurring charges for the service.

SECTION 3. LIMITATION OF LIABILITY

- 3.0 811 Service is provisioned solely for the benefit of the 811 Customer. The provision of such service shall not be interpreted, construed, or regarded as being for the benefit of or creating any obligation toward, or any right of action on behalf of, any third person or other legal entity, including but not limited to end-users of the Company or any other providers of telecommunications service.
- 3.1 The Company will make commercially reasonable efforts to route 811 calls to the toll-free number provided by the 811 Customer, however the Company will not be responsible, or held responsible, for routing mistakes and errors, interruptions of service, or intervening Acts of God or other acts that interfere with telephone service and/or routing. The Company's obligation under this 811 Service applies solely to the transmission of the call to the toll-free number provided, and ends upon translation of an 811 call to the Customer provided toll free number.
- 3.2 The Company does not undertake to transmit messages under the terms of 811 service.
- 3.3 The Company will have no liability for any damages arising from damages arising out of mistakes, omissions, interruptions, delays or errors or defects in transmission occurring in the course of furnishing 811 service.
- 3.4 The Company's failure to provide or maintain service shall be excused by government orders, civil commotions, acts of God and other circumstances beyond the Company's reasonable control.
- 3.5 The Company shall not be liable for any act or omission of any entity, and shall not be liable for any accident, injury to person or property, including death, libel, slander, infringement of intellectual property rights, nor shall the Company be responsible for any direct, indirect, incidental, special, consequential, exemplary, or punitive damages.
- 3.6 The 811 Customer shall defend the Company at the 811 Customer's expense, indemnify, and hold the Company harmless against any and all loss, claims, suits, or other action, or any liability whatsoever, whether suffered, made, instituted or asserted against the Company as directly or indirectly arising from the provision of 811 Service.
