



B. OBLIGATION AND LIABILITY OF TELEPHONE COMPANY (Cont'd)

4. Transmitting Messages

The Telephone Company does not transmit messages, but offers the use of its facilities for communications between patrons. If because of transmission difficulties the operator, in order to accommodate the subscriber, repeats messages, she is deemed to be acting as the agent of the persons involved and no liability shall attach to the Telephone Company because of any errors made by the operator or misunderstandings that may arise between subscribers because of the errors.

5. Use of Connecting Company Lines

When suitable arrangements can be made by other telephone companies, may be established by establishing wire connections to points not reached by this Company's lines. In establishing connections with the lines of other companies, the Telephone Company is not responsible or liable for any action of the Connecting Company.

6. Defacement of Premises

The Telephone Company shall exercise due care in connection with all work done on subscriber's premises. No liability shall attach to the Telephone Company by reason of any defacement or damage to the subscriber's premises resulting from the existence of the Telephone Company's instruments, apparatus, and associated wiring on such premises, or by the installation or removal thereof, unless such defacement or damage is the result of the sole negligence of the Telephone Company.

C. USE OF SERVICE AND FACILITIES

1. Ownership and Use of ^{Services} Equipment

^{Tel. Co. Services}
Equipment, instruments, and lines ^{Services} of the Telephone Company on the premises of a subscriber are the property of the Telephone Company, whose agents and employees shall have the right to enter said premises at any reasonable hours for the purpose of installing, inspecting, maintaining, or repairing the ~~equipment, instruments and lines~~, or for the purpose of making collections from coin boxes or upon the termination of the service, for the purpose of removing such ~~equipment, instruments and lines~~. Such ~~equipment, instruments and lines~~ are not to be used for performing any part of the work of transmitting, delivering, or collecting any message where any toll or consideration has been or is to be paid any party other than the Telephone Company; without the written consent of the Telephone Company.

If the installation and maintenance of service are requested at locations which are, or may become hazardous or dangerous to the Telephone Company's employees, or to the public, or at locations where the Telephone Company's property is subject to malicious damage, or vandalism, or is exposed to conditions damaging to the Telephone Company's property, such as, moisture, chemicals, elements, or any deteriorating effects, the Telephone Company may refuse to install and maintain such service, and, if such service is furnished, may require the subscriber to install and maintain such service and may also require the subscriber to indemnify and hold the Telephone Company harmless from any claims, loss or damage by reason of the installation and maintenance of such service.

1. Ownership and Use of ^{Service} ~~Equipment~~ (Continued)

Where the Telephone Company is required to install and maintain service and equipment at such locations as described in the above paragraph, the Company may make additional charges, or may require the subscriber to reimburse the Company for damage to the Company's property, or both.

2. Unauthorized Attachments or Connections

The Telephone Company shall not be required to attach its equipment or lines to wiring not owned and installed by it, nor shall equipment, apparatus, circuits, or devices not furnished by the Telephone Company be attached to or connected with facilities furnished by the Telephone Company, whether physically, by induction, or otherwise, unless provided for elsewhere in the tariffs. In case any such unauthorized attachment or connection is made, the Telephone Company shall have the right to disconnect the same or to suspend the service during the continuance of said attachment or connection, or to terminate the service.

3. Use of Subscriber Service

Subscriber telephone service, as distinguished from public telephone service, is furnished only for the use by the subscriber, his family, employees or business associates, or persons residing in the subscriber's household, except as the use of the service may be extended to persons temporarily subleasing a subscriber's residential premises. 4. Use of Party Line Service

Applications for party line service are accepted by the Telephone Company with the understanding that each subscriber will so use the service as not to interfere with an equitable proportionate use of the service by the other subscribers on the same line. When the duration or number of local messages sent or received by a party line subscriber is so great as to prevent an equitable proportionate use of the line by other subscribers on the line, the Telephone Company shall have the right to require the subscriber to contract for a higher grade of service, or to discontinue the service of the subscriber in question. The Telephone Company reserves the right to limit the continuous use of a party line for a local message to five minutes.

charge, the Telephone Company reserves the right to limit the continuous use of the line for local messages to five minutes.

6. Tampering with Equipment

The Telephone Company may refuse to furnish or may deny telephone service to any person, firm, or corporation on whose premises is located any telephone equipment owned by the Telephone Company which shows any evidence of tampering, manipulation, or operation, or use of any device whatsoever, for the purpose of obtaining telephone service without payment of the charges applicable to the service rendered.

Where evidence of tampering, or manipulating, of Telephone Company property is discovered, the cost of restoring this property to its original state, or condition, shall be borne by the subscriber.

7. Use of Profane Language or Impersonation of Another

The Telephone Company may refuse to furnish or may deny telephone service to any persons, firm, or corporation who, over the facilities furnished by the Telephone Company, uses or permits to be used, foul, abusive, obscene, or profane language; or impersonates or permits others to impersonate any individual with fraudulent or malicious intent.

messages in accordance with provisions contained elsewhere in these General Rules and Regulations. The subscriber is held responsible for all charges for telephone service rendered at his telephone both exchange and toll, including charges for toll messages on which the charges have been reversed.

5. Maintenance and Repairs

All ordinary expense of maintenance and repairs, unless otherwise specified in the Company's Tariff, is borne by the Telephone Company. The subscriber agrees to take good care of the instruments and all accessories connected therewith. In case of loss of, damage to, or destruction of, any of the Company's instruments or accessories, not due to ordinary wear and tear, the subscriber is held responsible for the cost of restoring the equipment to its original condition, or for the cost of replacing the equipment destroyed, except where such damage is not occasioned by the negligence of the subscriber.

Subscribers may not rearrange, disconnect, or remove, or permit others to rearrange, disconnect, or remove any apparatus or wiring installed by the Telephone Company, except upon the written consent of the Telephone Company.

III. Establishment of Credit

- A. The Company is not obligated to establish, furnish, or continue to furnish service to any individual or firm that owes for service previously rendered at the same or a different address, until arrangements have been made to liquidate such previous indebtedness to the Company. In order to insure the payment of all charges due for its service, the Company may require any customer to establish and maintain his credit in one of the following ways:

1. By furnishing acceptable credit references to the Company.
2. By providing a suitable guarantee in writing, in a form prescribed by the Company.
3. By means of a cash deposit.

- B. The Company shall be the sole judge as to whether or not the references or guarantee in writing are acceptable.

C. Deposits

1. The Company may require an applicant or an established customer to make a deposit to be held by the Company as a guarantee of the payment of charges subject to the following conditions;
2. The Company may require a deposit or guarantee as a condition of service if the customer or applicant is unable to establish that he or she had a previous service account with a telephone utility for a period of at least twelve (12) months for which all undisputed charges were satisfactorily paid; or

III. ESTABLISHMENT AND MAINTENANCE OF CREDIT

1. Establishment of Credit

The telephone company is not obligated to furnish service to any individual or firm that has an unpaid and undisputed delinquent account for service previously rendered by the company at the same or different address, until arrangements have been made to liquidate such previous indebtedness to the company.

2. Deposits or Guarantees

- a. The telephone company may require a deposit or guarantee as a condition of service if the customer or prospective customer has an unpaid and undisputed account with a telephone utility which accrued within the last two (2) years or if such delinquent account was paid within the last six (6) months.
- b. In lieu of a deposit the company may accept a written guarantee.
- c. As a condition of continued service to an existing customer the company may require a deposit or guarantee if undisputed charges in two out of the last twelve (12) billing periods becomes delinquent.
- d. No deposit or guarantee will be required because of race, sex, creed, national origin, marital status, age, number of dependents, source of income or geographical area of residence.

3. Amount of Deposit or Guarantee

The deposit or guarantee shall not exceed estimated charges for two (2) months service based on the average bill during the preceeding twelve (12) months or estimated for the next twelve (12) months by the customer and the company. Concurrent with the establishment of new service, the customer may post a deposit in two (2) equal monthly installments or as otherwise agreed upon.

A. ESTABLISHMENT OF CREDIT

1. The Telephone Company is not obligated to furnish service to any individual or firm that owes for service previously rendered at the same or a different address, until arrangements have been made to liquidate such previous indebtedness to the Company. In order to insure the payment of all charges due for its service, the Telephone Company may require any subscriber to establish and maintain his credit in one of the following ways:

- a. By furnishing acceptable references to the Telephone Company which represent, in the opinion of the Company, an approvable credit rating.
- b. By providing a suitable guarantee in writing, in form prescribed by the Telephone Company.
- c. By means of a cash deposit.

B. AMOUNT OF DEPOSITS

The amount of the deposit required for the purpose of establishing a subscriber's credit shall not exceed his estimated bill for exchange service and toll charges for one normal billing period plus thirty days. The Telephone Company may require the subscriber to increase the amount of the deposit at any time, if in its opinion, the charges billed against the subscriber are found to warrant such an increase.

3. If the customer or applicant had no previous service account or previous service of less than twelve (12) months, the Telephone Company may require a deposit if the applicant does not meet at least two (2) of the following criteria:

- Home ownership, excluding mobile home
- Vehicle Ownership - car or truck
- Has a local charge card
- Has a savings account
- Has a checking account
- Is fifty (50) or more years of age
- Has been employed two years or more with the same employer
- Has an existing loan from a financial institution not considered delinquent by the creditor
- Has a valid major national charge card
- Has a valid major national oil company charge card

4. No deposit or guarantee shall be required by the Company because of race, sex, creed, national origin, marital status, age, number of dependents, source of income, condition of physical handicap, or geographical area of residence.

5. The Company shall permit a customer, concurrent with the beginning of service, to post a deposit in two (2) equal monthly installments or as otherwise agree upon.

6. The amount of deposit shall not exceed estimated charges for two (2) months service based on the average bill during the preceding twelve (12) months or in the case of new applicants for service, the average monthly bill for all subscribers within a customer class.

7. A deposit or guarantee may be required as a condition of continued service if undisputed charges in two (2) out of the last twelve (12) billing periods become delinquent.

4. Interest to be Paid in Deposit

The deposit will bear interest of six (6) percent per annum which will be credited annually upon the account of the customer or paid upon the return of the deposit, whichever occurs first. 





VIII. EXTENSION STATIONS

A. GENERAL REGULATIONS

1. Extension stations may be provided in connection with all classes of urban exchange service except Public Telephone Service. In connection with Subscriber Coin Box Service, extension stations are only furnished when they are essential to the efficient handling of service.
2. Extension stations may be furnished in connection with rural line service, provided they are located on the same premises as the main station. Extension stations on rural lines are provided only when such stations will not interfere with the satisfactory operation of the line.
3. Separate telephone numbers or other distinctive designations are not assigned to extension stations, nor is code ringing permitted. 



- A. A discount of fifty percent of the Local Exchange Service Rate will be allowed to subscribers having any class of service within the Initial Rate Area who wish to be away from the premises where their telephone is located, but do not want their service terminated.


