#### A. GENERAL

- Public Sacios Community:

  1. Community Optional Service (COS) is a service offered to customers in qualifying petitioning exchanges whereby they have the option to purchase local calling service to a designated target exchange in lieu of having their calls rated by the appropriate Message Toll Service Tariff. This service is available only on intraLATA interexchange routes.
- In order to qualify for COS, customers in the petitioning exchange must demonstrate that a community of interest exists with customers in the target exchange.
  - a) A petition to the Missouri Public Service Commission (PSC) to request COS may be initiated by any or all of the following parties:
    - 1) By twenty-five (25) or more customers in the petitioning exchange;
    - By the presiding official(s) of the appropriate city, town, village or county, served by the petitioning exchange;
    - The Office of the Public Counsel on behalf of the customers in the petitioning exchange;

The telephone company serving the customers in the petitioning exchange.

b) Petitions requesting COS must specify the target exchange with which COS calling is requested. This exchange may be served by another telephone company.

- c) Upon issuance of a Missouri Public Commission Order directing a calling study, the telephone company will conduct a study covering a one month billing period of Message Toll Service traffic from the petitioning exchange to the target exchange. (1)

- d) A community of interest exists when the traffic studies show that both of the following criteria are met:
  - 1) Customers in the petitioning exchange make an average of six (6) calls per access line per month to the target exchange;
  - 2) Two-thirds (2/3) of the customers in the petitioning exchange make two (2) or more calls per month to the target exchange.
- e) The petitioning exchange will be certified as a COS qualifying exchange and service will be implemented on a time schedule approved by the PSC, once the above criteria have been satisfied.
- 3. COS subscribers in a qualifying exchange, in addition to having service to the target exchange, will also have service to the EAS points of the target exchange. This combination of target exchange and EAS points is known as the "Calling Scope" of the qualifying exchange.
- 4. COS Options:
  - a) One-Way Flat Rate COS Provides unlimited outward calling from the qualifying exchange to its Calling Scope.
  - b) Two-Way Flat Rate COS Provides unlimited outward calling to, and inward calling from, the Calling Scope of the qualifying exchange. In addition, this option provides a listing in and a copy of the target exchange's white pages directory.

- COS is designed and intended for the exclusive use of the end user customers of the telephone company. With the exception of Shared Tenant Service, COS is not to be shared or resold.
- The COS monthly rates and EAS additives as specified in the rates and charges section in paragraph C. below apply on a per line basis, and are to be billed in advance.
- 10. COS must be purchased on all access lines for an account which is combined billed. A multiline customer cannot mix One-Way and Two-Way Flat Rate COS on the same account.
- 11. COS subscribers are required to dial 1+NXX-XXXX when placing calls to telephone numbers in their Calling Scope.
