41.1 GENERAL REGULATIONS

- A. ComCall allows single line customers to set up internal (intercom) communications between multiple telephone extensions. The customer establishes intercom calls by dialing a code and hanging up the telephone handset. The code activates distinctive ringing to alert intercom users of an intercom call.
- B. ComCall is available in conjunction with compatible residence and business service where proper technology and facilities are available.
- C. Three-Way Calling is necessary for the operation of ComCall. Three-Way Calling rates are shown in the Custom Calling Services section of this Tariff.
- D. Some customer provided terminal equipment may not recognize the distinctive ringing patterns associated with this service.
- E. If ComCall and Call Waiting are on the same line, the Call Waiting feature is deactivated for the duration of the intercom connection. During this time, an incoming call will receive a busy signal.
- F. In addition to the provisions of the General Exchange Tariff, Section 17, Paragraph 17.8, the Telephone Company shall not be liable for any loss or damages arising out of error, interruptions, defects, failure or malfunctions of ComCall or equipment. Damages arising out of such interruptions, defects, failures, or malfunctions of this service after the Telephone Company has been notified, and has had a reasonable time for repair, shall in no event exceed an amount equivalent to the charges made for the service for the period following notice from the customer until service is restored.
