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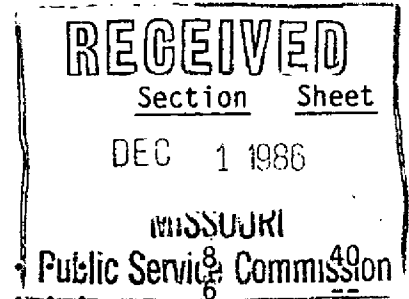
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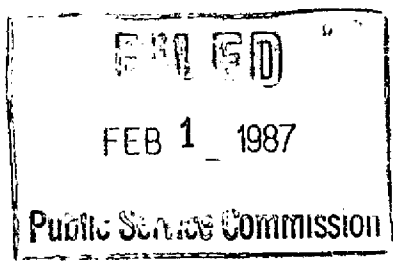
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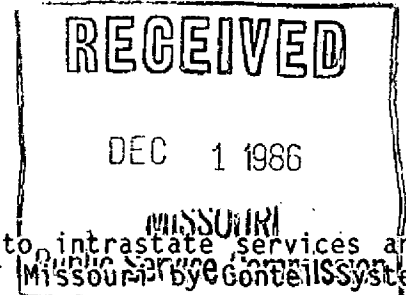
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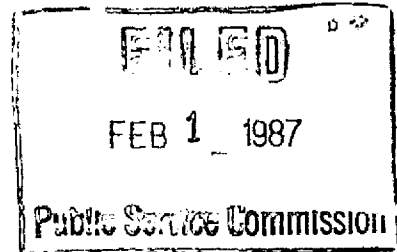
A. APPLICATION

1. General

- a. The regulations set forth herein apply to intrastate services and facilities furnished within the state of Missouri by ConTEL System of Missouri, Inc., hereinafter referred to as the Company, subject to the jurisdiction of the Missouri Public Service Commission.
- b. The regulations or conditions contained in the Local Exchange Tariff shall govern in the event of a conflict between these General Regulations and any conditions applicable to the General Exchange Tariffs and the Local Exchange Tariffs.
- c. These tariffs cancel and supersede all other tariffs of the Company issued and effective prior to the effective dates shown on individual sheets of this Tariff.
- d. When services and facilities are provided in part by the Company and in part by other companies, the regulations of the Company apply to that portion of the service or facilities furnished by it.

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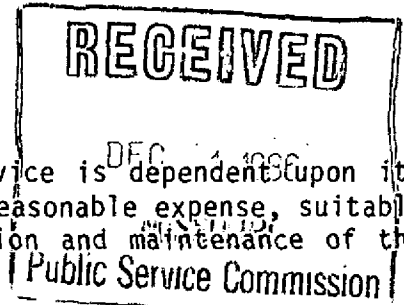
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GENERAL REGULATIONS

B. OBLIGATION AND LIABILITY OF THE COMPANY

1. Furnishing of Service

- a. The Company's obligation to furnish service is dependent upon its ability to secure and retain, without unreasonable expense, suitable facilities and rights for the construction and maintenance of the necessary circuits and equipment.
- b. Where special requirements of the customer involve unusual construction or installation, the customer may be required to pay additional costs as provided elsewhere in this Tariff.



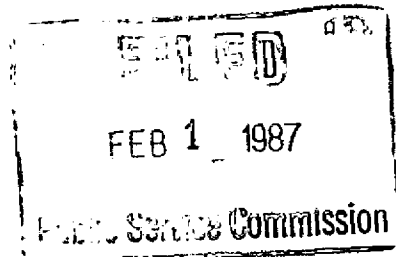
2. Transmitting Messages

The Company does not undertake to transmit messages but offers the use of its facilities, where available, for communication between parties subject to the terms and conditions specified in these Tariffs.

3. Maintenance and Repair

- a. All costs associated with the maintenance and repair of services furnished by the Company will be borne by the Company, except as specified elsewhere in this Tariff.
- b. The Company will be reimbursed for any loss or damage to its facilities on the customer's premises resulting from intentional destruction or any other cause, except from fire or unavoidable accidents.
- c. Access to customer's premises, at any reasonable hour, will be given to representatives of the Company for the purpose of inspecting, repairing, testing or removing any part of the Company's facilities.

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B. OBLIGATION AND LIABILITY OF THE COMPANY (Continued)

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4. Liability

- a. The liability of the Company for damages arising out of mistakes, omissions, interruptions, delays or errors or defects in transmission occurring in the course of furnishing service and not caused by negligence of the customer shall in no event exceed an amount equivalent to the proportionate charge to the customer for the period of service during which such mistakes, omissions, interruptions, delays or errors or defects in transmission occur in excess of 48 hours after notification has been made. (Except as noted under 4.,d. following.) (N)
- b. When a service or channel is temporarily surrendered by a customer at the request of the Company, credit determined as in a above will be allowed for the entire period surrendered. (N)
- c. The customer indemnifies and saves the Company harmless against the following:
 - 1) Acts or omissions of other companies when their facilities are used in connection with the Company's facilities to provide service. (N)
 - 2) Any defacement or damage to the customer's premises, resulting from the existence of the Company's facilities (demarcation point and drop) on such premises, or from the installation or removal thereof, when such defacement or damage is not the result of the negligence of the Company or its employees.
 - 3) Any accident, injury or death occasioned by its equipment or facilities when such is not due to negligence of the Company.
 - 4) Claims for libel, slander or infringement of copyright arising from the material transmitted or recorded over its facilities; claims for infringement of patents arising from combining with, or using in connection with, facilities of the Company, apparatus and systems of the customer; and all other claims arising out of any act or omission of the customer in connection with facilities provided by the Company.
 - 5) Liability for failure to provide service.
 - 6) Liability for telephone directories is covered elsewhere in this section under " Telephone Directories." (T)

4. Liability

- a. The liability of the Company for damages arising out of mistakes, omissions, interruptions, delays or errors or defects in transmission occurring in the course of furnishing service and not caused by negligence of the customer shall in no event exceed an amount equivalent to the proportionate charge to the customer for the period of service during which such mistakes, omissions, interruptions, delays or errors or defects in transmission occur.

 - 3) Any accident, injury or death occasioned by its equipment or facilities when such is not due to negligence of the Company.
 - 4) Claims for libel, slander or infringement of copyright arising from the material transmitted or recorded over its facilities; claims for infringement of patents arising from combining with, or using in connection with, facilities of the Company, apparatus and systems of the customer; and all other claims arising out of any act or omission of the customer in connection with facilities provided by the Company.
 - 5) Liability for failure to provide service.
 - 6) Liability for telephone directories is covered elsewhere in this section under "Directories."

 - 3) Any accident, injury or death occasioned by its equipment or facilities when such is not due to negligence of the Company.
 - 4) Claims for libel, slander or infringement of copyright arising from the material transmitted or recorded over its facilities; claims for infringement of patents arising from combining with, or using in connection with, facilities of the Company, apparatus and systems of the customer; and all other claims arising out of any act or omission of the customer in connection with facilities provided by the Company.
 - 5) Liability for failure to provide service.
 - 6) Liability for telephone directories is covered elsewhere in this section under "Directories."

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B. OBLIGATION AND LIABILITY OF THE COMPANY (Continued)

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4. Liability (Continued)

d. Service Guarantee Credit

- 1) The Company will provide credit for one month of local exchange service should the customer experience an "out of service" condition on the local access line over 24 hours from the time the "out of service" condition is reported to or discovered by the Company. The credit will be applicable to all single-line, business and residence service.
- 2) The credit will be applicable to one month's billing for all local exchange service charges.
- 3) For each repeat occurrence of a local access line "out of service" condition lasting over 24 hours from the time the outage is reported or discovered by the Company, the customer will receive an additional one month's credit.
- 4) The credit will not apply to "out of service" conditions resulting from the willful neglect, misuse or abuse by the customer. The credit will not apply to "out of service" conditions where the outage is in the customer's inside wire or customer's premises equipment. This credit will not apply to "out of service" conditions resulting from natural disasters, or circumstances beyond the control and knowledge of the Company. This credit also will not apply to "out of service" conditions where service has been temporarily or permanently discontinued for nonpayment of bills.

5) Service Guarantee Program Specifics

The following criteria will be used in the administration of the Contels Service Guarantee Program:

- a) Any customer experiencing an out-of-service condition that is not restored within 24 hours will be credited with one month's exchange service.
- b) Out-of-service is defined as not being able to receive calls OR not being able to make calls.

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B. OBLIGATION AND LIABILITY OF THE COMPANY (Continued)

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4. Liability (Continued)

d. Service Guarantee Credit (Continued)

5) Service Guarantee Program Specifics (Continued)

- c) The outage period will be measured from the time reported by the customer (or company detected) until the time cleared by repair service.
- d) One month exchange service is outlined as follows:

Includes:

- Access Line Charges
- Custom Calling features
- Touch Calling service
- Directory Listing Service
- Rotary Number Service
- Remote Call Forwarding

Excludes:

- Federal Access Charges
- Special Service/Private Line
- Directory Advertising
- Business System/Centrex Service
- Toll Plans (MOSP, COS, etc.)
- Toll Message Charges
- Usage Pricing Message Charges
- Installation charges (Service Charges)
- NSF check charges
- Late payment penalties

- e) The credit will be generated on a per-incident basis. There are no maximum number of credits per month.

- f) Service outages resulting from natural disasters, non-pay disconnect customers provided equipment failure, or customer abuse are excluded from receiving a Contel Guarantee credit.

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C. PROVISION OF EQUIPMENT

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1. All equipment necessary for the provision of a given service will be furnished and owned by the Company except as provided elsewhere in this Tariff. The customer may be required to provide suitable housing or other protective measures where equipment is to be installed in locations exposed to weather or other hazards. Commercial power will be furnished by the customer at a suitable outlet when and where required.
2. As mandated in F.C.C. Docket 79-105 and the Missouri Public Service Commission Case No. TO-85-267, the Company will not install or maintain Inside Wire on a regulated basis after January 1, 1987, except for Company Owned Public Access Coin Sets.
3. Equipment not owned by the Company may be attached to the facilities of the Company as provided in Section 7 of this Tariff. In case unauthorized attachment or connection is made, the Company shall have the right to discontinue the service.
4. The provisions of the preceding shall not be construed or applied to bar a customer from using devices which serve his convenience in his use of the facilities of the Company (such as a device to obtain quietness or privacy), provided any such device so used does not:
 - a. Endanger the safety of Company employees or the public.
 - b. Damage, require change in or alteration of, or ~~publicly~~ ^{publicly} ~~obstruct~~ ^{obstruct} electrical connection to the equipment or other facilities of the Company, unless as provided for elsewhere in this Tariff.
 - c. Interfere with the proper functioning of such equipment or facilities.
 - d. Impair the operation of the communication system.
 - e. Otherwise injure the public in its use of the Company's services.
5. Except as otherwise provided in this Tariff, ~~nothing~~ ^{nothing} ~~therein~~ ^{therein} shall be construed to permit the use of a recording device or of a device to interconnect any line or channel of the Company with any other communication line or channel of the Company or of any other person.
6. Facilities of an electric power company or oil, oil products or natural gas pipe line company, or railroad company, provided primarily to communicate with points located along a right-of-way (including premises of such company anywhere in cities, towns or villages along the right-of-way) owned or controlled by such company and extending between or beyond exchange areas of the Company, may be connected with Private Branch Exchange, station or private-line facilities furnished by the Company subject to the conditions stated in Sections 5, 7, and 8.

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D. USE OF SERVICE AND FACILITIES

1. Use of Customer Service

Customer telephone service, as distinguished from public and coin box telephone service, is furnished only for use by the customer, his family, employees or business associates, or persons residing in the customer's household, except as the use of the service may be extended to joint users or to persons temporarily subleasing a customer's residential premises. The Company has the right to refuse to install customer service or to permit such service to remain on premises of a public or semi-public character when the telephone set is so located that the public in general, or patrons of the customer may make use of the service. At such locations, however, customer service may be installed provided the instrument is so located that it is not accessible for public use.

2. Use of Party-Line Service

Applications for party-line service are accepted by the Company with the understanding that each customer will so use the service as not to interfere with an equitable, proportionate use of the service by the other customers on the same line. When the duration or number of messages sent or received by a party-line customer is so great as to prevent an equitable, proportionate use of the line by other customers on the line, the Company shall have the right, upon thirty (30) days notice, to require the customer to contract for higher grade of service or to discontinue the service of the customer in question. The Company reserves the right to limit the continuous use of a party line for a local message to five minutes.

3. Telephone Numbers

The customer has no property right in the telephone number or any right to continuance of service from any specific central office, and the Company may assign or change the telephone number, the central office designation, or both, as is necessary in the conduct of its business.

4. Alterations

The customer agrees to notify the Company promptly whenever alterations or new construction on premises owned or leased by him necessitate changes in the Company's wiring or equipment; the customer agrees to pay the Company's current charges for such changes.

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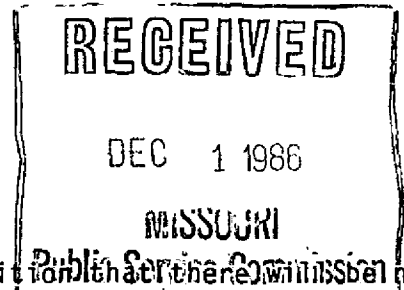

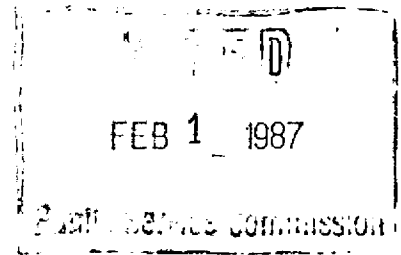
5. Abuse or Fraudulent Use of Service

The service is furnished subject to the condition that there shall be no abuse or fraudulent use of the service. Abuse or fraudulent use of service includes:

- a) The use of service or facilities of the Company to transmit a message or to locate a person or otherwise to give or obtain information without payment of the charge applicable for service.
- b) The obtaining, or attempting to obtain, or assisting another to obtain or to attempt to obtain service by rearranging, tampering with or making connection with any facilities of the Company, or by any trick, scheme, false representation or false credit device, or by or through any other fraudulent means or device whatsoever with intent to avoid the payment, in whole or in part, of the regular charge for such service.
- c) The use of service or facilities of the Company for a call or calls, anonymous or otherwise, if in a manner reasonably to be expected to frighten, abuse, torment or harass another.
- d) The use of profane or obscene language.
- e) The use of the service in such manner as to interfere unreasonably with the use of the service by one or more other customers.
- f) The impersonation of another.

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D. USE OF SERVICE AND FACILITIES (Continued)

6. Use of Service for Unlawful Purposes

The service is furnished subject to the condition that it shall not be used for the purpose of furnishing information in connection with any gambling scheme, business or device or for any similar unlawful purpose. Any customer whose service is to be discontinued or any applicant to whom service is to be denied under this regulation will be notified by the Company of his right to a hearing by the Missouri Public Service Commission to determine whether or not such service is being used, or will be used, in violation of this rule. Upon complaint to the Commission by any applicant or customer who is affected by the refusal or discontinuance of service in accordance with this rule, such service shall be provided, continued or restored if the Commission shall determine that the service has not been used or is not intended to be used in violation of this rule.

7. Resale of Service

The resale of any service provided by the Company is not permitted except as provided elsewhere in this Tariff or authorized by the Company in writing.

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E. APPLICATION OF BUSINESS AND RESIDENCE RATES

1. Business Rates Apply at the Following Locations:

- a. In offices, stores, factories and all other places of a strictly business nature.
- b. In boarding houses (except as noted under E.2.b.), offices of hotels, halls and apartment buildings, quarters occupied by clubs or lodges, schools, hospitals, libraries, churches, college fraternity houses and other similar institutions (but excluding dormitory rooms).
- c. At residence locations when the customer has no regular business telephone and the use of the service can be considered as more of a business than of a residence nature; or when such business use passes over to residence telephones; for example when, business places are ordinarily closed in compliance with the law or established custom.
- d. Where the place of business and residence of a customer are on the same premises and no telephone service is installed in the place of business, the business rate shall be charged for the telephone service installed in the residence.
- e. At residence locations, when a line termination is located in a shop, office or other place of business.
- f. At any location where the listing of service at that location indicates a business, trade or profession except as specified below.
- g. Service terminating solely on the answering service facilities of a telephone answering firm.

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- 2. Changes from business service to residence service are made only in the event of a change in the customer's arrangements which would entitle him to a residence classification of his service, as specified in paragraph E.3. following. The business telephone number may be continued for the residence service only if all the facts indicate that the service is no longer to be used substantially for business purposes.

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E. APPLICATION OF BUSINESS AND RESIDENCE RATES (Continued) DEC 1 1986

3. Residence Rates Apply at the Following Locations:

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- a. In private residences where business alphabetical or classified telephone directory listings are not provided.
- b. In private apartments of hotels, rooming houses or boarding houses where service is confined to the customer's use and elsewhere in rooming houses which are not advertised as a place of business or which have less than five rooms for roomers or which furnish meals to less than ten boarders, provided business telephone directory listings are not furnished.
- c. In the place of residence of a clergyman and in the place of residence of a physician, dentist, veterinary, surgeon or other medical practitioner, provided the customer does not maintain an office in the residence. In the residence of a Christian Science practitioner, nurse or midwife, or in the office of any of this group of persons, provided the office is located in the customer's residence and is not part of an office building. In any of such cases, the listing may indicate the customer's profession but only in connection with an individual name. If listings of firms, partnerships, etc., or additional listings of persons not residing in the same household are desired, business rates apply.
- d. Where the place of business and residence of a customer are in the same premises and no telephone is installed in the place of business, the business rate shall be charged for the telephone installed in the residence.
- e. College fraternity houses where members of the fraternity lodge within the house.
- f. Secretarial line terminations of residence main service termination as extension lines on the premises of a telephone answering bureau.
- g. Pastor's office in a church without a paid administrative employee.

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4. Changes from residence to business service may be made without change in telephone number if the customer so desires. Service connection charges applicable for such changes are quoted in Section 6 of this tariff.

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F. ESTABLISHMENT AND FURNISHING OF SERVICE - Business Only

1. Application for Service

- a. Applications for service may be made orally or in writing. These applications become contracts upon the establishment of service.
- b. The Company reserves the right to refuse service to any applicant who is found to be indebted to the Company for service previously furnished until satisfactory arrangements have been made for the payment of all such indebtedness. The Company may also refuse to furnish service to any applicant desiring to establish service for former customers of the Company who are indebted for previous service, regardless of the listing requested for such service, until satisfactory arrangements have been made for the payment of such indebtedness.
- c. If telephone service is established and it is subsequently determined that either condition in b. above exists, the Company may suspend or disconnect such service until satisfactory arrangements have been made for the payment of the prior indebtedness.
- d. Any change in rates or regulations prescribed by the Missouri Public Service Commission modifies the terms and regulations of contracts to the extent of such change.

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2. Advance Payments

- a. At the time an application for service is made, an applicant may be required to pay an amount equal to at least one month's service and/or service connection charges, which may be applicable, in addition to such special construction and service charges as are to be borne by the applicant. The amount of the first month's service is credited to the customer's account on the first bill rendered.
- b. Federal, state or municipal governmental agencies may not be required to make advance payments.

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(1) For applications including Customer-Provided Equipment, see Section 7.

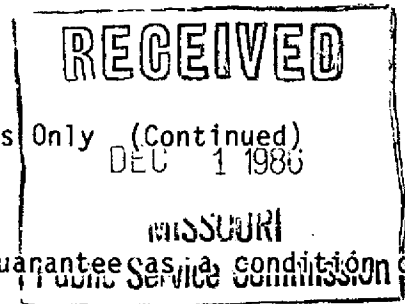
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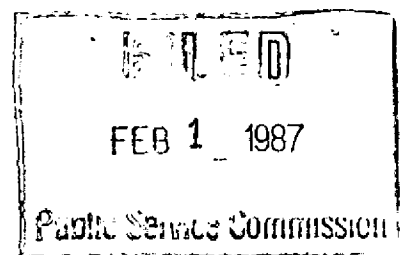
F. ESTABLISHMENT AND FURNISHING OF SERVICE - Business Only (Continued)

3. Deposits and Guarantees of Payment

- a. The Company may require a deposit or guarantee as a condition of service.
- b. No deposit or guarantee will be required by the Company because of race, sex, creed, national origin, marital status, age, number of dependents, condition of physical handicap, source of income, or geographical area of residence.
- c. A deposit is subject to the following terms:
 - 1) It will not exceed estimated charges for two months service based on the average bill during the preceding twelve months or estimated for the next twelve months by the customer and the Company.
 - 2) It will bear interest of 9 percent per annum which will be credited annually upon the account of the customer or paid upon the return of the deposit whichever occurs first. Interest will not accrue on any deposit after the date on which a reasonable effort has been made to return it to the customer.
 - 3) Upon discontinuance or termination, it will be credited, with accrued interest, to the charge stated on the final bill and the balance, if any, will be returned to the customer within 21 days of rendition of such final bill.

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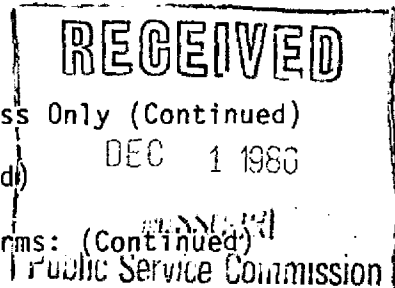
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F. ESTABLISHMENT AND FURNISHING OF SERVICE - Business Only (Continued)

3. Deposits and Guarantees of Payment (Continued)

d. A deposit is subject to the following terms: (Continued)

4) Upon satisfactory payment of all undisputed charges during the last twelve billing periods, it will, with accrued interest, be promptly refunded or credited against charges stated on subsequent bills. Payment of a charge is satisfactory if received prior to the date upon which the charge becomes delinquent provided it is not in dispute. The Company may withhold refund of a deposit pending the resolution of a dispute with respect to charges secured by such deposit.

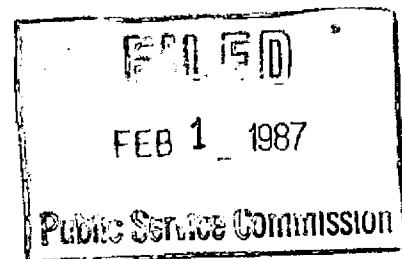
5) Each customer posting a deposit will receive a receipt in writing at that time or within ten days.

6) The Company will provide means whereby a person entitled to a refund of a deposit is not deprived of the refund even though he may be unable to produce the receipt for the deposit, provided he can produce identification to ensure that he is the person entitled to the refund.

7) The Company will permit a customer, concurrent with the beginning of service, to post a deposit in two equal monthly installments or as otherwise agreed upon.

e. In lieu of a deposit the Company may accept a written guarantee. The limit of the guarantee will not exceed the amount of a cash deposit.

f. A guarantor will be released upon satisfactory payment of all undisputed charges during the last twelve billing periods. Payment of a charge is satisfactory if received prior to the date upon which the charge becomes delinquent provided it is not in dispute.



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F. ESTABLISHMENT AND FURNISHING OF SERVICE - Residential Only

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4. Application for Service

- a. Applications for service may be made orally or in writing. These applications become contracts upon the establishment of service.
- b. Upon a request for service and at the time a contract for service is entered into with a prospective residential customer, the Company will use a prepared statement to inform a prospective customer of the lowest cost service available.
- c. Any change in rates or regulations prescribed by the Missouri Public Service Commission modifies the terms and regulations of contracts to the extent of such change.
- d. The Company reserves the right to refuse service to any applicant who is found to be indebted to the Company for service previously furnished until satisfactory arrangements have been made for the payment of all such indebtedness. The Company may also refuse to furnish service to any applicant desiring to establish service for former customers of the Company who are indebted for previous service, regardless of the listing requested for such service, until satisfactory arrangements have been made for the payment of such indebtedness.
- e. If telephone service is established and it is subsequently determined that either condition in d. above exists, the Company may suspend or disconnect such service until satisfactory arrangements have been made for the payment of the prior indebtedness.

5. Advance Payments

- a. At the time an application for service is made, an applicant may be required to pay an amount equal to at least one month's service and/or service connection charges, which may be applicable, in addition to such special construction and service charges as are to be borne by the applicant. The amount of the first month's service is credited to the customer's account on the first bill rendered.
- b. Federal, state or municipal governmental agencies may not be required to make advance payments.

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(1) For applications including Customer-Provided Equipment, see Section 7.

- a) Home ownership, excluding mobile homes
- b) Vehicle ownership - car or truck
- c) Is fifty or more years of age
- d) Has been employed two years or more with the current employer
- e) Has a savings account (N)
- f) Has a checking account (N)
- g) Has an existing loan from a financial institution not considered delinquent by the creditor

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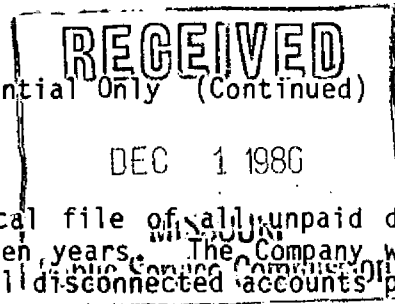

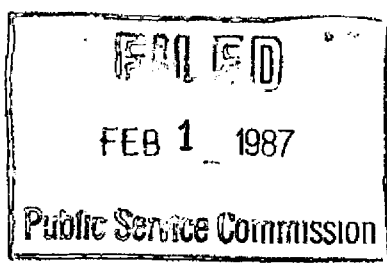

6. Deposits and Guarantees of Payment

- a. The Company will maintain an alphabetical file of all unpaid disconnected accounts for a period of seven years. The Company will also maintain an alphabetical file of all disconnected accounts paid in the past six months.
- b. The Company may require an applicant for service to post a deposit if:
 - 1) The applicant is unable to establish that he had a previous account with a telephone utility for a period of at least twelve months for which all undisputed charges were satisfactorily paid; or
 - 2) The applicant has not previously had telephone service for a twelve month period and does not meet at least two of the following criteria:
 - a) Home ownership, excluding mobile homes
 - b) Vehicle ownership - car or truck
 - c) Is fifty or more years of age
 - d) Has been employed two years or more with the current employer
 - e) Has an existing loan from a financial institution not considered delinquent by the creditor

6. Deposits and Guarantees of Payment (Continued)

c. A present customer may be required to post a deposit or guarantee as a condition of continued service if undisputed charges in two out of the last twelve billing periods have become delinquent. If a customer has had service discontinued under G.1.a. and/or G.1.b. of this section at any time during the preceding twelve billing periods.

d. No deposit or guarantee or additional deposit or guarantee will be required by the Company because of race, sex, creed, national origin, marital status, age, number of dependents, condition of physical handicap, source of income, or geographical area of residence.

e. The amount of deposit for a new applicant will be twice the average monthly bill for all residence subscribers. If, within the first six months of establishing service, the customer incurs toll or other charges in any one billing period which are greater than 400% of the amount of the deposit previously required, an additional deposit may be required.

f. The amount of deposit for a present customer will be twice that customer's average monthly billing for exchange and long distance charges. The average monthly billing will be based on the actual billing for the immediate months preceding the request for the deposit, not to exceed twelve months.

g. On deposits held thirty days or more, simple interest at the rate of nine percent per annum shall be credited annually to the account of the customer or paid upon the return of the deposit, whichever occurs first. Interest will not accrue on any deposit after the date on which a reasonable effort has been made to return it to the customer.

h. An applicant for service, or a present customer, may satisfy a deposit requirement by providing a Contract of Guaranty in an amount not to exceed the requested deposit, from a present customer with at least two years of established service whose service has not been suspended for nonpayment within the last twelve months. The guaranty contract shall be on a form provided by the Company which shall include the Company's right to transfer charges to the limit of the guaranty, from a defaulted bill of the customer, from whom a deposit or a Contract of Guaranty was required, to the guarantor's account or accounts and the further right to suspend the guarantor's service. A guarantor shall be released upon satisfactory payment by the customer of all undisputed charges during the last twelve billing periods.

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F. ESTABLISHMENT AND FURNISHING OF SERVICE - Residential ~~Only~~ (Continued)

6. Deposits and Guarantees of Payment (Continued)

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- i. The fact that a deposit has been made, or a guaranty provided, shall in no way relieve the customer from his responsibility to pay undisputed charges prior to their becoming delinquent nor constitute a waiver or modification of the provisions set forth in this Tariff providing for the temporary suspension of service or the termination of the service for nonpayment of undisputed, delinquent charges.
- j. Upon termination of the service, the amount of the deposit with accrued interest, shall be applied in payment of any unpaid charges for exchange or long distance service and the balance, if any, shall be returned to the customer within twenty-one days of the rendition of the final bill.
- k. Upon satisfactory payment of all undisputed charges during the last twelve billing periods, it will, with accrued interest, be promptly refunded or credited against charges stated on subsequent bills. Payment of a charge is satisfactory if received prior to the date upon which the charge becomes delinquent provided it is not in dispute. The Company may withhold refund of a deposit pending the resolution of a dispute with respect to charges secured by such deposit.
- l. Each customer posting a deposit will receive a receipt at that time or within ten days.
- m. The Company will provide means whereby a person entitled to a refund of a deposit is not deprived of the refund even though he may be unable to produce the receipt for the deposit provided he can produce identification to ensure that he is the person entitled to the refund.
- n. The Company will permit a customer, concurrent with the beginning of service, to post a deposit in two equal monthly installments or as otherwise agreed upon.
- o. A guarantor will be released upon satisfactory payment of all undisputed charges during the last twelve billing periods. Payment of a charge is satisfactory if received prior to the date upon which the charge becomes delinquent provided it is not in dispute.

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F. ESTABLISHMENT AND FURNISHING OF SERVICE

7. Billing and Payment

- a. The Company will during the first billing period in which a customer receives service provide the customer with an itemized account of charges for the service for which he has contracted. The Company will render a separate bill for concurrent residence service unless otherwise requested by the customer.
- b. The Company will after the initial bill for new service render a bill during each billing period for monthly recurring charges in advance and toll charges in arrears. Special billing arrangements may be established for service provided to governmental agencies.
- c. The customer is responsible for all charges in conjunction with the services furnished him including collect toll messages which have been accepted at the customer's telephone.
- d. The Company will render bills on a cyclical basis whereby the customer receives his bill on or about the same day of each month. Billing cycles may be altered by sending an insert or other written notice explaining the alteration not less than 30 days prior to the effective date of the alteration. This notification is not required when a customer requests a number change or when the customer disconnects and reconnects service or transfers service from one premises to another, which may affect the customer's billing cycle.
- e. Bills are due as specified on the bill and may be paid at any business office of the Company or at any agency authorized to receive such payments.
- f. The customer shall have at least 21 days from the rendition of a bill to pay the charges stated. However, when the customer has had service discontinued within the last 12 months or where the customer incurs toll or other charges at any time during the billing period which are equal to at least 400% of the amount of the deposit or guarantee previously required from the customer, payment may be demanded for the toll charges by a telephone call to the customer followed by written notification of such demand sent by first class mail. If the toll charges remain unpaid for 10 days from rendition of written notification or a mutually established late payment arrangement date or 21 days from rendition of the bill, such charges will be deemed delinquent.
- g. For billing purposes, each month is presumed to have 30 days.
- h. Retroactive billing adjustments may be made for a period not to exceed three years.

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F. ESTABLISHMENT AND FURNISHING OF SERVICE (Continued)

7. Billing and Payment (Continued)

- i. Charges for service normally furnished on a monthly basis (except those involving a minimum billing period) shall be prorated in excess of, or less than, a billing month will be prorated by the ratio of the number of days in the period in question to the number of calendar days in the billing month.

8. Disputes

- a. A residential customer may advise the Company that all or part of a charge is in dispute by written notice, in person, or by a telephone message directed to the Company prior to the delinquent date of the charge.
- b. When a residential customer advises the Company that all or part of a charge is in dispute, the Company shall: record the date, time and place the inquiry is made; investigate the inquiry promptly and thoroughly; and, attempt to resolve the dispute in a manner satisfactory to both parties.
- c. Failure of a residential customer to participate with the Company in efforts to resolve an inquiry which has the effect of placing charges in dispute shall constitute a waiver of the customer's right to continuance of service under the provisions of this tariff.
- d. If a residential customer disputes part of a charge, he shall pay an amount to the Company equal to that part of the charge not in dispute unless otherwise agreed to by the parties.
- e. If a residential customer fails to pay the amount of a delinquent charge not in dispute within five (5) days from the date such charge becomes delinquent, the Company may discontinue service as specified in section G.1.
- f. If an inquiry which places a charge in dispute is resolved in favor of the customer, amounts due the customer shall be refunded or credited promptly.

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9. Settlement Agreements

- a. When a residential customer is unable to pay a charge in full when due, the Company shall permit him to enter into an initial settlement agreement under which such charge may be paid as mutually agreed to by both parties. A copy of the settlement agreement shall be delivered or mailed to the customer upon request by the customer.

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F. ESTABLISHMENT AND FURNISHING OF SERVICE (Continued)

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8. Settlement Agreements (Continued)

b. Matters treated by a settlement agreement shall not constitute a basis for a discontinuance as long as the terms of the settlement agreement are followed.

10. Telephone Directories

a. The Company will furnish to its customers, without charge, its directory as necessary for the efficient use of the service. Copies of other directories may be provided at a nominal charge.

b. Directories regularly furnished to customers shall remain the property of the Company. No binder, holder or auxiliary cover, except as provided or authorized by the Company, shall be used in conjunction with any directory furnished by the Company.

c. No liability for damages arising from errors in or omissions of directory listings or listings obtained from Directory Assistance shall attach to the Company. In the case of additional or extra listings for which a charge is made, the Company's liability shall be limited to the monthly rate for each such listing for the charge period during which the error or omission continues.

d. In accepting listings as prescribed by applicants or customers, the Company will not assume liability for the result of their publication in its directories nor will the Company be a party to controversies arising between customers or others as a result of listings published in its directories.

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GENERAL REGULATIONS

G. DISCONTINUANCE OF SERVICE

1. The Company may discontinue the service and remove its equipment under the following circumstances, provided suitable notice has been given to the customer, as required:

- a. Nonpayment of an undisputed delinquent charge.
- b. Failure to post a required deposit or guarantee.
- c. Unauthorized use of Company facilities in a manner which creates an unsafe condition or creates the possibility of damage or destruction to such equipment which may tend to injuriously affect the efficiency of the Company's plant, property, or service.
- d. Failure to substantially comply with the terms of a settlement agreement.
- e. Refusal after reasonable notice to permit inspection, maintenance or replacement of telephone utility equipment.
- f. Material misrepresentation of identity in obtaining telephone utility service, and use of the service in such a manner that, in the opinion of the Company, constitutes abuse or fraud.
- g. As provided by state or federal laws.
- h. Nonpayment of undisputed, delinquent state or long distance service charges billed by the Company or undisputed, delinquent exchange service charges including any FCC-approved end user charge or both.
- i. The failure to pay charges not subject to commission jurisdiction shall not constitute cause of a discontinuance of service, except as noted in a 1.h. above.

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- 2. Service shall not be disconnected under G.1. unless written notice by first class mail is sent or delivered to the customer at least 5 days prior to the date of proposed discontinuance.
- 3. At least 24 hours preceding a discontinuance, the Company will make reasonable efforts to contact the customer to advise of the proposed discontinuance and what steps must be taken to avoid discontinuance.
- 4. Service may be discontinued during normal business hours on or after the date specified in the notice of discontinuance. Service will not be discontinued on a day when the offices of the Company are not available to facilitate reconnection of service, or on a day immediately preceding such a day. Service will not be discontinued for nonpayment of delinquent charges within five days after a charge has become delinquent, except as provided under G.7 of this section.

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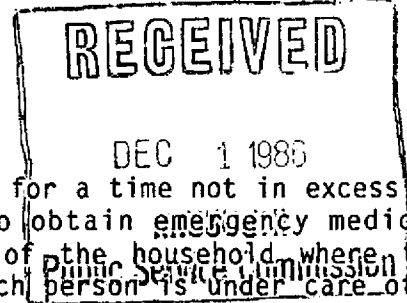
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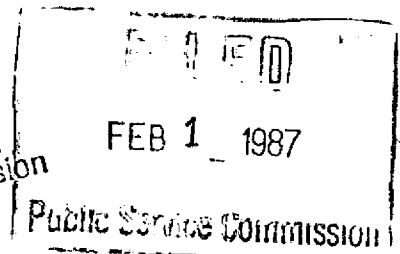

5. The Company will postpone a discontinuance for a time not in excess of 21 days if the telephone is necessary to obtain emergency medical assistance for a person who is a member of the household where the telephone service is provided and where such person is under care of a physician. Any person who alleges such emergency shall, if requested, provide the Company with reasonable evidence of such necessity.
6. The Company will restore service upon the customer's request when the cause for discontinuance has been eliminated.
7. Notwithstanding any of the preceding provisions in this section, service to a customer may be discontinued at any time after written notice has been sent, certified mail, to such customer at his last known address and at the address where the service to be discontinued is provided if such a customer:
 - a. Incurs charges not covered by a deposit or guarantee and evidences an intent not to pay such charges when due.
 - b. Damages or evidences an intent to damage Company facilities.
 - c. Upon written objection to the furnishing of a service made in writing by or on behalf of any governmental law enforcement agency acting within its jurisdiction on the grounds that such service is, or will be, used for an illegal purpose.
 - d. The notice required in 7.a. and 7.b. will state how the customer has evidenced his intent not to pay or to damage Company facilities.
8. Restoral of Service
 - a. Payment may be made by the customer for restoration of service in any reasonable manner including personal check. A personal check may be refused if a customer check for payment of service has been dishonored, excepting bank error, within the last twelve months.

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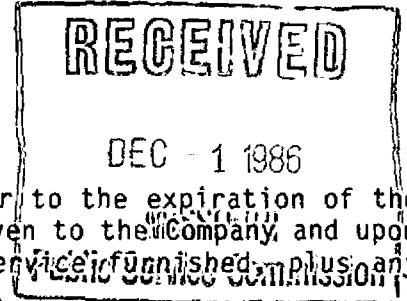


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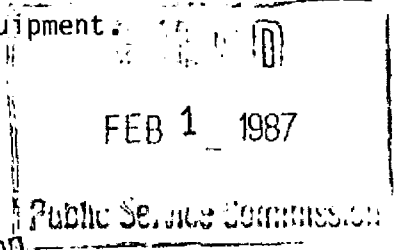

H. TERMINATION OF SERVICE

1. Contracts for service may be terminated prior to the expiration of the contract period provided advance notice is given to the Company, and upon agreement to pay all charges due for the service furnished, plus any termination charges which might be applicable.
2. No minimum or termination charge will apply (unless otherwise stated specifically in this Tariff) where a new customer takes over the service of the former customer, provided the service is to be furnished at the same location without interruption and that the new customer assumes all unpaid charges on the original contract. Minimum and termination charges will apply for any service furnished under the original contract which is not retained by the new customer.
3. Where a contract for service with a one-month minimum period is canceled before establishment of the service is completed, a charge not to exceed the service charge specified is applied if all or a portion of the facilities have been installed.
4. No minimum or termination charge will apply in the event the service is terminated because of condemnation, destruction or damage to property by fire or other cause beyond the control of the customer.
5. Concurrent with the effective date of this tariff, interconnection of automatic dialing and answering-announcing devices where the intended use of such devices is for telephone solicitation shall not knowingly be allowed by the Company where calls initiated by the device cannot be terminated at will by the called party and dial tone restored to the called party promptly upon termination of the call by the called party.
 - a. Any prerecorded message issued by an automated dialing-announcing device shall be preceded by an announcement which states:
 - 1) The name and address of the calling party.
 - 2) The purpose of the message.
 - 3) The message is coming from automated equipment.

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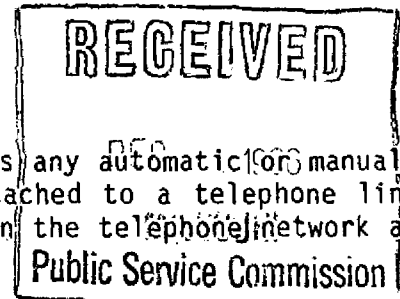

5. b. An automatic dialing device is defined as any automatic or manually dialed-announcing device which when attached to a telephone line, has the capability of initiating calls on the telephone network and incorporates the following features:

- 1) Storage capability of multiple numbers to be called; or
- 2) A random or sequential number generator that produces numbers to be called; and
- 3) Has the capability, working alone, or in conjunction with other equipment, of disseminating a pre-recorded message to the number called; and

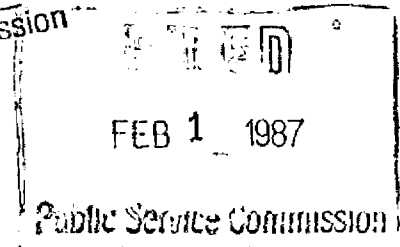
c. This regulation shall remain in effect and be subject to such changes or modifications as the Missouri Public Service Commission may direct in the exercise of its jurisdiction.

I. MINIMUM CONTRACT PERIODS

1. Except as specified elsewhere in this Tariff, the minimum contract period is one month from the date service or additions to service are established and the minimum charge is the authorized rate for one month. For purposes of rate administration, each month is considered to have 30 days.
2. The Company may require a contract period longer than one month at the same location in connection with special types or arrangements of equipment or for unusual construction necessary to meet specific demands for service.

1. General

- a. Construction charges are applicable under the conditions set forth in this section, and are in addition to other charges specified in this tariff.
- b. Construction charges are payable upon application for service or when billing is rendered by the Company, at the option of the Company. A deposit on construction charges may be required before construction work is started.
- c. When construction is provided by a connecting company, charges made to the customer will be based on the charges of the connecting company.
- d. When a customer is so located that it is necessary to use a private right-of-way to furnish service, the applicant may be required to pay the costs incurred in securing, clearing and retaining such right-of-way.
- e. When attachments are made to poles of other companies in lieu of providing new pole line construction, the attachment rental charges to the Company may be assessed to the applicant(s) in whole or in part as the particular circumstance may warrant.
- f. Title to all construction, where the customer pays all or any part of the cost of construction is to be vested in the Company.
- g. The word "cost", when used in this section, means the in-plant cost consisting of labor, materials, supervision and other overhead expenses associated with the construction(*). Actual cost will be (T) used.

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(*) Loaded labor includes costs which are direct in nature, such as the wages of (N) craft personnel, and also includes indirect overhead costs which cannot be specifically assigned to projects. These indirect overhead costs include supervision, vehicle, house services, pension and payroll tax expenses. Other indirect costs such as vacation, sick time and meetings are also included. These costs are accumulated in a pool of costs and then are distributed as actual hours are worked by craft personnel. (N)

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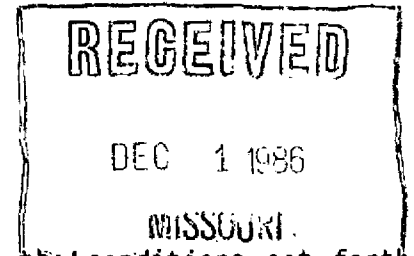

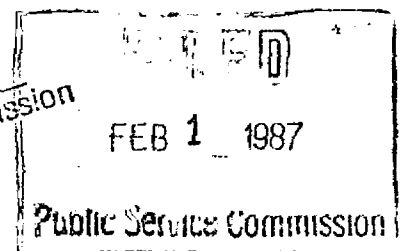

2. Private Property

- a. An average amount of entrance and distribution facilities may be furnished by the Company provided the facilities are of the standard type normally furnished for the particular location or kind of service.
- b. The applicant shall be required to pay the costs over and above those applicable for a normal installation under the following terms:
 - 1) If additional entrance or distribution facilities are required.
 - 2) If the conditions are such as to require special equipment, maintenance or methods of construction.
 - 3) If the stability of the customer has not been established.
 - 4) If the construction costs are excessive as compared with the revenue to be derived for any other reason.
 - 5) Charges will include materials, contract services, and loaded labor.(*)
 - 6) The Company will provide an estimate of actual charges to the customer prior to the start of construction.
- c. The customer will provide the Company, without charge, written permission for the placing of the Company's facilities on the property.

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(*) Loaded labor includes costs which are direct in nature, such as the wages of craft personnel, and also includes indirect overhead costs which cannot be specifically assigned to projects. These indirect overhead costs include supervision, vehicle, house services, pension and payroll tax expenses. Other indirect costs such as vacation, sick time and meetings are also included. These costs are accumulated in a pool of costs and then are distributed as actual hours are worked by craft personnel.

3. Installation of Telephone Lines within Subdivisions
 - a. Telephone lines constructed, installed and owned by the Company in subdivisions shall be installed underground.
 - b. For the purposes of this underground service rule only, the following terms shall have the meanings indicated for them:
 - 1) Applicant: The developer, builder or other person, partnership, association, firm, private or public corporation, trust, estate, political subdivision, governmental agency or other legal entity recognized by law applying for the construction of an underground telephone system in a subdivision.
 - 2) Building: A single structure, roofed and enclosed within exterior walls, built for permanent use, erected, framed of component structural parts and unified in its entirety, both physically and in operation for single-family residential occupancy in a subdivision.
 - 3) Multiple-occupancy building: A structure which stands alone, enclosed with exterior walls or which is cut off from adjoining structures by fire walls, built for permanent use, erected, framed of component structural parts and unified in entirety, both physically and in operation for reasonably permanent occupancy as two or more single-family residences in a subdivision.
 - 4) Development-subdivision: A lot, tract or parcel of land divided into two or more lots, plots, sites or other divisions for use for new residential buildings or the land on which is constructed new multiple-occupancy buildings per recorded plat thereof if such recordation is required by law.
 - 5) Distribution line: A main-line facility within the development, directly or indirectly connecting the customers in a development to the telephone central office.
 - 6) Service line: That portion of the circuit or line extending from a pedestal or pole to the point of demarcation.

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J. SPECIAL CONSTRUCTION (Continued)

3. Installation of Telephone Lines within Subdivisions (Continued)

- c. All distribution and service lines, except pedestals, installed within a development shall be installed underground; shall conform to the Company's construction standards; and shall be owned and maintained by the Company. Such installation shall be performed by the Company or by such other entity as the Company may authorize to do the work.
- d. Temporary facilities may be installed to provide service when necessary, for a maximum period of one year.
- e. The applicant for telephone service to a development or a lot therein shall:
 - 1) At his own cost, provide the Company with easements satisfactory to the Company for installation, maintenance, alteration, replacement and repair of distribution and service lines and related facilities.
 - 2) At his own cost, clear the ground, in which the aforesaid facilities are to be installed, of trees, stumps and other obstructions. It is understood that the telephone facilities may be installed in the same trench as facilities to be installed for the purpose of providing other utility service to the development if installed in accordance with the National Electric Safety Code as from time to time amended.
 - 3) Applicant shall keep the trenches in which the facilities are to be installed or the path to be utilized for installation of underground facilities by "plowing in" (as distinguished from "trenching") clear of machinery and other obstructions during the installation and will otherwise cooperate with the Company to avoid unnecessary costs.

3. Installation of Telephone Lines within Subdivisions (Continued)

e. (Continued)

4) Advances by applicant

- a) Where due to the manner in which a subdivision is developed, the utility is required to construct an underground telephone distribution system through a section or sections of the subdivision where service will not be connected for at least two years, then the utility may require a reasonable advancement for the construction from the applicant before construction is commenced in order to guarantee performance.
- b) Upon request, the applicant shall deposit with the Company, prior to the commencement of the installation of the facilities referred to above, an advance payment in an amount equal to the Company's estimated costs of installing the facilities within the development. Such advance payment is conditioned upon the agreement of the Company to refund semiannually without interest to the applicant for each customer located within the development receiving telephone service from the Company within the period of ten years from the date of installation of facilities that percentage of the total advance payment that each lot bears to the total number of lots in the development.
- c) Any portion of an advance remaining unrefunded ten years from the date the utility is first ready to render service will be retained by the utility and credited to the account for contribution in aid of construction.
- d) If after the acceptance of application for service, the design of the development is changed in a manner which requires recomputation of the Company's estimated installation costs or the estimated costs of installation are increased for any other reason not the fault of the Company, the advance referred to above may be increased and the Company may defer or discontinue installation of facilities until such time as the additional amount of the deposit has been received by the Company.

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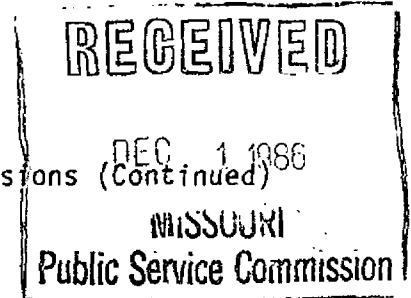

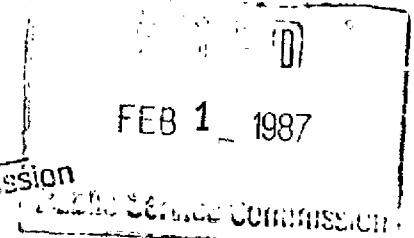

4) Advances by applicant (Continued)

- e) Reimburse the Company for damage to, or destruction or removal of, Company underground facilities within the development during the period of development by persons, firms or corporations other than the Company or its agents, employees or contractors.
- f. At the expense of the applicant; underground service will be provided on a temporary basis during the construction of residential or commercial properties. If all or part of the facilities are utilized in providing service to the residence or commercial property, an adjustment of costs will be made.
- g. The Company proposes to replace existing overhead facilities with underground facilities as said existing overhead facilities are replaced in the normal operation of the Company. If a customer or customers request the removal and replacement of existing overhead facilities with underground facilities prior to the time for normal replacement, such replacement and removal will be done at the expense of the customer or customers.
- h. Underground service connections to new individual residences, new mobile homes and new apartments containing less than five family units, which are not in a subdivision, from existing overhead facilities will be provided at the request of the customer if the customer provides to the Company easements adequate for the installation, maintenance, alteration, replacement or repair of distribution and service lines and related facilities.
- i. Underground service to shopping centers and other commercial developments will be provided on the same basis as underground service to residential developments as hereinabove set out.

- j. In circumstances where the application of these rules appears impracticable or unjust to applicant or the Company or discriminatory to other customers; e.g., difficult rock conditions, the Company or applicant shall refer the matter to the Missouri Public Service Commission for special ruling or for the approval of special conditions which may be mutually agreed upon prior to commencing construction.
- k. These rules and regulations shall not amend or supersede the Company's line extension policy set out in other rules and regulations on file with the Missouri Public Service Commission except in residential subdivisions.

4. Temporary Service

Where plant construction (either inside or outside the Base Rate Area) is required to provide any service or facility, temporary in character, or where it is necessary to place temporary construction in advance of permanent construction in order to meet the customer's requirements, or when in the judgment of the Company the service or facilities cannot be reused in the event the customer disconnects the service or facilities, the Company may require the applicant to pay the non-recoverable costs of the temporary construction or to contract for service beyond the initial period, or both.

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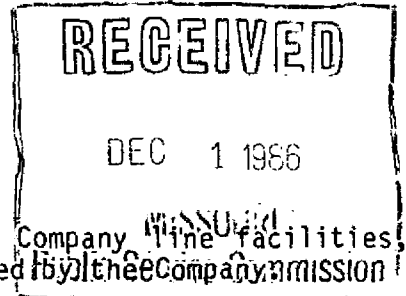

5. Extension of Facilities

a. General

Extension of facilities are additions to Company line facilities, such extensions will be owned and maintained by the Company.

b. Application

- 1) Charges for extension of facilities apply only within the Suburban Area of an exchange.
- 2) Mileage is computed from existing Company facilities up to the drop pole or pedestal.
- 3) Mileage is computed using actual route mileage.
- 4) Each premises of an applicant is treated as a separate application for purposes of mileage and charge computation.
- 5) Any footage allowance will apply only once per premises.
- 6) Charges for extension of facilities for an individual project will be assessed and collected once per premises only.

c. Charges

Extension of facilities charges are due and payable prior to commencement of construction. This charge applies to any other applicable charge or rate in this tariff.

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1) Unit of Charge

A Unit of Charge is determined by multiplying the total of the Basic Local Exchange Rate plus any applicable Suburban Mileage amount by 12.

2) Application of Charge Unit

- a) First 1/2 mile
- b) 1/2 to 3/4 mile
- c) 3/4 to 1 mile
- d) 1 to 1 1/2 miles
- e) 1 1/2 to 2 1/2 miles

c. Charges (Continued)

3. Applicants are divided into two groups. This first group includes all applicants whose collective allowance equals or exceeds the construction required to serve them. No charge is made to such applicants. The second group includes all remaining applicants on the project. The overall charge for the project to serve the second group in excess of the allowance is divided equally among all applicants in the second group.

4. Exception:

No applicant is required to pay a higher charge than he would if the project were established for him alone. Any difference between this charge and the average for the group is absorbed by the Company.

5. Charges to Subsequent Applicants

When a new applicant is secured who can be served from a completed project, within three years from the date service was initially established for such project, the charges for the entire project are recomputed to include the new applicant. The new applicant pays a prorata of the line extension charge based upon the number of months (a fraction of a month is counted as a full month) remaining in the original three-year term, the time to be computed from the date service is established for the new applicant. In no case, however, will existing customers who are served from an existing project be required to pay additional line extension charges.

6. Adjustment in Charges when Additional Applicants are Connected

When a project is refigured as described in Condition d. above, existing customers will be refunded a prorata of the difference between the original charges and the refigured charges, based on the remainder of the three-year term.

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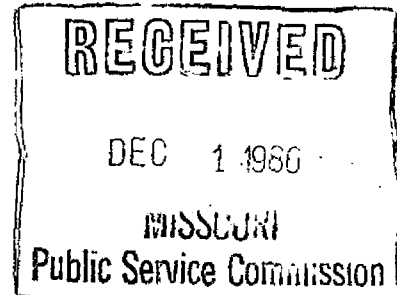

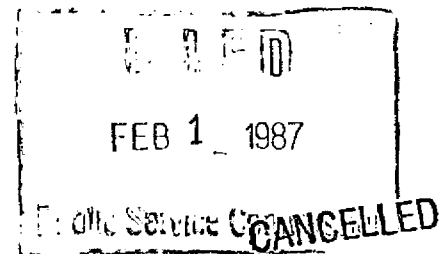
7. Disconnects



When one or more customers on a project disconnect, no refund is made of the line extension charge, except as described in e. above. Charges to remaining customers are not affected by disconnects.

8. Reuse of Facilities

- a. When a customer disconnects service or moves off the project and service is established for a new applicant at the same location, any adjustment in charges is a matter for negotiation between the original customer and the new applicant.
- b. Where a customer is disconnected for any reason and subsequently reapplies for service from the same premises, the customer will not be required to pay any additional line extension charges in addition to his total original obligations.
- c. Where a customer has paid line extension charges for service at a premises on a given project and subsequently applies for service at a different premises on the same project, the customer will not be assessed additional line extension charges unless additional construction is required.

d. Refund of Charges

Customers who have paid extension of facilities charges will be credited one charge unit described in c. on each yearly anniversary of their in-service date beginning with the first anniversary, until either: 1. the entire advance payment has been refunded, or 2. the customer ceases to retain the service for which the extension of facilities charges were assessed.

e. Grouping of Applicants

At the option of the Company, applicants may be grouped in a project subject to the following conditions:

- 1) Grouping may be done only at the inception of a project.
- 2) No applicant will be included in a group project when doing so would result in a higher charge than individual application.
- 3) Computation of group project mileage: total route mileage will be determined by the Company, collective free footage allowance will be subtracted therefrom and the remaining footage will be divided equally among the total number of applications.

f. Contracts

Contracts covering a maximum of three years of service may be required by the Company as a condition precedent to the establishment of service. Such contracts will not require payments in excess of those otherwise required by this schedule and shall not interfere with the Company's right to collect amounts as provided for elsewhere in its tariff schedules.

g. Saving Clause

Arrangements may be made, other than as provided for above in this schedule, in the following cases subject to prior authorization of the Public Service Commission of the state of Missouri, when required:

- 1) Where the applicant requests a particular type of construction or a specific route for extensions to meet the applicant's special requirements and where the construction or route so requested differs from the normal standards of the Company and is not required by law.
- 2) Extension of facilities involving underground crossings of railroads, highways or power lines, submarine cable or long river crossings.
- 3) Any other extension of facilities involving unusual or disproportionately large construction expenditures.

* Loaded labor includes costs which are direct in nature, such as the wages of craft personnel, and also includes indirect overhead costs which cannot be specifically assigned to projects. These indirect overhead costs include supervision, vehicle, house services, pension and payroll tax expenses. Other indirect costs such as vacation, sick time and meetings are also included. These costs are accumulated in a pool of costs and then are distributed as actual hours are worked by Craft Personnel.

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L. TAX ADJUSTMENTS

1. All excise taxes including gross receipts taxes, franchise taxes, occupation taxes, license taxes, etc., imposed by a city, town or village or other local governmental agency shall be added as a separate item to the charges for local exchange service rendered to and for persons located within the limits of the city, town or village imposing such tax, as follows:

a. Taxes based on receipts or income and calculated on a percentage thereof.

1) Where any excise tax imposed by a city, town or village is based on a percentage of gross receipts, revenue or income, a pro rata portion of such tax shall be added as a separate item to the customer's statement for local exchange service rendered and shall be calculated by applying thereto a percentage factor equivalent to the percentage factor of the tax.

b. Taxes consisting of a stated amount in dollars and cents.

1) When a tax imposed by a city, town or village is a stated amount, a pro rata portion of such tax shall be added as a separate item to the customer's statement for local exchange service rendered and shall be calculated by applying thereto the same percentage factor as the total annual amount of the tax bears to the gross receipts of the Company from local service rendered during the preceding calendar year to the persons located within the taxing municipality.

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ACCESS LINE - The termination of a central office line on a customer's premises, usually at a protector.

ADDITIONAL LISTING - Any listing of a name or other authorized information in connection with a customer's telephone number in addition to that which he is entitled in connection with his regular service.

AUTHORIZED USER - A person, firm or corporation (other than the customer) on whose premises a telephone, PBX or private-line service or channel is located and who may communicate over such channels in accordance with the terms of the Tariff.

BASE RATE - A rate for urban grades of exchange service available to customers located within a Base Rate Area.

BASE RATE AREA - A specific area within which local telephone exchange service, other than rural-line or suburban service, is furnished at rates quoted in the Local Exchange Service Tariffs without extra mileage charges.

BILL - A written demand for payment for service or equipment and the taxes and franchise fees related thereto.

BILL INSERT or INSERT - A written notice which is enclosed with a bill.

BILLING PERIOD - A normal usage period of not less than 28 nor more than 31 days.

BUSINESS SERVICE - Telephone service furnished to customers where the actual or obvious use is principally or substantially of a business, professional or occupational nature.

CENTRAL OFFICE - A switching unit in a telephone system which provides service to the general public, having the necessary equipment and operating arrangements for the terminating and interconnecting customer lines and trunks or trunks only. There may be more than one central office in a building or exchange.

CENTRAL OFFICE CHARGE - The charge for work associated with the central office including but not limited to central office connections, cable cross connections and central office program work.

CENTRAL OFFICE LINE - A circuit directing an individual or party-line main station, PBX switchboard, or an intercommunicating system with a central office.

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DEFINITIONS

CHANNEL - A path for communication between two or more stations, or central offices, furnished in such a manner as the Company may elect, whether by wire, radio, or a combination thereof, and whether or not by a single physical facility or route.

CHARGE - An amount due for service or equipment and taxes and franchise fees related thereto.

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CIRCUIT - A channel used for the transmission of electrical energy in the furnishing of telephone and other communication services.

CLASS OF SERVICE - The various categories of service generally available to the customer such as business, residence, public or semipublic service.

COIN BOX TELEPHONE SERVICE - A telephone set, equipped with a coin-collecting device, designed for a combination of customer and public use provided at the option of the Company at locations more or less public in character. The customer will be in control of the key to the coin collection receptacle and will collect all monies from the coin receptacle. Coin Box Telephone Service is considered a form of customer service.

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COIN TELEPHONE SERVICE - See "PUBLIC TELEPHONE."

COMMISSIONS - A percentage of amounts handled paid as a fee in consideration of service rendered to the Company.

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COMPANY - Contel System of Missouri, Inc.

CONNECTING COMPANY - A corporation, association, partnership or individual owning or operating one or more exchanges and with which communications services are interchanged.

CUSTOMER PREMISES EQUIPMENT - Customer premises equipment is defined for this tariff as all equipment provided by the Company and located on the customer premises except over voltage protection equipment, inside wiring, coin operated or pay telephones, and multiplexing equipment to deliver multiple channels to the customer.

CUSTOMER-PROVIDED COMMUNICATIONS SYSTEMS - Channels and other facilities provided by a customer which are capable, when not connected to Company private line channel service or the telecommunications network, of communications between customer-provided terminal equipment or Company stations.

CUSTOMER-PROVIDED TERMINAL EQUIPMENT - Devices or apparatus and their associated wiring provided by a customer which do not constitute a communications system and which, when connected to the communications path of the telecommunications system, are so connected either electrically, acoustically or inductively.

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CONNECTOR - See "SWITCH."

CONNECTION CHARGE - See "SERVICE CHARGE."

CONSTRUCTION CHARGE - A separate nonrecurring charge made for the construction of facilities in excess of those contemplated under the rates quoted in the Exchange Tariffs.

CONTINUOUS PROPERTY - The plot of ground, together with any building thereon, occupied by the customer, which is not divided by public highways or separated by property occupied by others. Where a customer occupies property on both sides of a street, alley, highway, body of water, railroad right-of-way, etc., and the properties would otherwise be continuous, such properties are treated as continuous property provided local wire or cable facilities are used and the customer furnished all local distribution pole line facilities or underground conduit required in connection therewith.

CONTRACT - The agreement between a customer and the Company under which service and facilities are furnished in accordance with the applicable provisions of the Tariffs.

CORD SWITCHBOARD - See "PBX SERVICE."

CORDLESS SWITCHBOARD - See "PBX SERVICE."

COST - The cost of labor and materials, which includes appropriate amounts to cover the Company's general operating and administrative expenses.

CUSTOMER - A person responsible for payment for service.

CYCLE BILLING - A system which results in the rendition of bills to various customers on different days of a month.

DATA ACCESS ARRANGEMENT - A protective connecting arrangement for use with the network control signaling unit, or in lieu of the connecting arrangement, an arrangement to identify a central office line and protective facilities and procedures to assure proper operation and protection of the telecommunications network.

DATA SET - A device designed to accept from and/or impart to customer-provided data transmitting and/or receiving terminal equipment, material in the form produced and/or accepted by the customer-provided terminal equipment into a form acceptable for transmission over Company facilities.

DELINQUENT CHARGE - A charge which is not paid in full on which payment is due.

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DEMARCATIION POINT - That point at which the Company's responsibility for installation and maintenance on a tariffed basis ends and the customer's option to install and/or maintain inside wire begins.

For Simple Inside Wire the demarcation point is the first penetration at or inside a customer's premises on the customer's side of the protector where inside wiring becomes dedicated to an individual customer's use. For an individual customer's dwelling, this point of connection will generally be twelve inches on the customer's side of the protector. In those locations where there is a Company-provided plug-in jack within twelve inches of the customer's side of the protector, that plug-in jack will serve as the demarcation point. The drop and block, including the protector, will continue to be provided by and remain the property of the Company.

For Complex Inside Wire the demarcation point is the first jack or inter-connection strip on the customer's side of the Company Network Terminal. This jack or interconnection strip is generally located within twenty-five (25) feet of the customer's common equipment, i.e., any telecommunications apparatus in which two or more business lines terminate which facilitates pick up. This jack or interconnection strip remains the property of the Company.

DEPOSIT - A money advance to the Company for the purpose of securing payment of delinquent charges which might accrue to the customer who made the advance.

DIAL SWITCHING EQUIPMENT - A unit of electromechanical or electronic switching equipment used in a central office or in connection with a PBX system.

DIRECTORY LISTING - A publication in the Company's alphabetical directory of information relative to a customer's name or other identification and telephone number.

DISCONNECT NOTICE - The written notice sent to a customer following billing notifying him that his service will be discontinued if charges are not satisfied by the date specified on the notice.

DISCONTINUANCE OF SERVICE or DISCONTINUANCE - A cessation of service not requested by a customer.

DISPUTE - See "IN DISPUTE."

DROP WIRE - That portion of a wire between the pole line or cable distributing box and the point of demarcation on or at the building in which the station or switchboard is located.

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DEFINITIONS

EXCHANGE - A geographical area established for the administration of telephone service in a specified area, called the "exchange area," which usually embraces a city, town or village and its environs. It may contain one or more central offices together with the associated plant, equipment and facilities used in furnishing communication service within that area.

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EXCHANGE AREA - The territory served by an exchange.

EXCHANGE LINE - Any circuit connecting an exchange station with a central office.

EXCHANGE SERVICE - The furnishing of facilities for the telephone communication within an exchange area, in accordance with the regulations and charges specified in the Local or General Exchange Tariffs. Exchange facilities are used to establish and maintain connection between an exchange and the other telephone plant and facilities in connection with long-distance calls or Extended Area Service calls.

EXTENDED AREA SERVICE - Interexchange telephone service furnished at a flat rate between two or more exchange areas.

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EXTENSION AND PBX STATION MILEAGE - See "MILEAGE."

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EXTENSION LINE - See "LINE EXTENSION"

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EXTENSION STATION - See "TELEPHONE SET."

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EXTRA EXCHANGE LINE MILEAGE - The measurement on which charges are based for that portion of the circuit extending beyond the Base Rate Area but within the Exchange Area, which is used to furnish urban classes of service in the Suburban or Rural Area.

EXTRA LISTING - See "ADDITIONAL LISTING."

FLAT RATE SERVICE - Service furnished at a fixed monthly charge, including Extended Area Service where applicable.

FOREIGN ATTACHMENT - Lines, instruments, appliances or apparatus not owned or furnished by the Company.

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FOREIGN CENTRAL OFFICE - Any central office other than that which serves the area in which the customer is located.

FOREIGN EQUIPMENT - See "FOREIGN ATTACHMENT."

FOREIGN EXCHANGE LINE MILEAGE - The measurement applying to that portion of a central office line connecting a customer with a foreign central office, from the common boundary line to the customer's station, for which a monthly charge is made in addition to the base rate for exchange service.

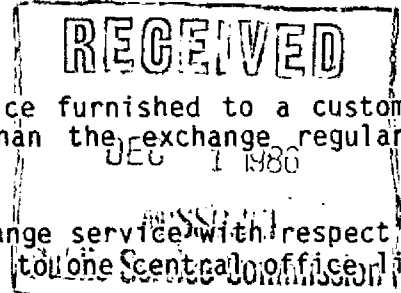

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FOREIGN EXCHANGE SERVICE - Telephone exchange service furnished to a customer through a central office of an exchange other than the exchange regularly serving the area in which the customer is located.

GRADE OF SERVICE - The term used in describing exchange service with respect to the number of main terminals which may be connected to one central office line (one-party, two-party, four-party, multi-party).

GRANDFATHERED EQUIPMENT - Equipment so designated by the F.C.C. which may be connected to services of the Company.

GUARANTEE - A written promise from a responsible party to assume liability up to a specified amount for delinquent accounts which might accrue to a particular customer.

IN DISPUTE - Any matter regarding a charge or service which is the subject of an unresolved inquiry.

INDIVIDUAL LINE - An exchange line designed for the connection of a telephone set.

INITIAL SERVICE PERIOD - The minimum length of time for which a customer is obligated to pay for service, facilities and equipment whether or not retained by the customer for such minimum length of time.

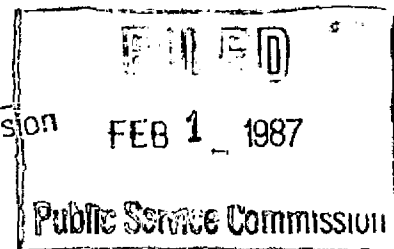
INQUIRY - Any written or oral comment or question regarding a charge or service which is directed to a telephone utility by a customer or prospective customer.

INSERT - See "BILL INSERT."

INSTALLATION CHARGE - A nonrecurring charge made at the time of installation of communications service or equipment, which applies in addition to service charges and other applicable charges for service or equipment unless specifically excepted.

INTERCOMMUNICATING SYSTEM - An arrangement involving two or more stations which enables a user to signal and connect ~~CANCELLED~~ stations in the system.

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JOINT USER SERVICE - An arrangement whereby an individual whose telephone needs are not such as to justify the provision of separate customer service, is permitted to use the service of a customer.

KEY EQUIPMENT - An arrangement of equipment, including keys and associated wiring, used to provide various general services in connection with telephone sets.

KEY TELEPHONE SET - A telephone set equipped with keys or buttons in the mounting.

LINE EXTENSION - A circuit extending from a main terminal to an auxiliary terminal such as a line from a PBX switchboard to a telephone set or to a key.

LINE FINDER - See "SWITCH."

LOCAL CHANNEL - That portion of a channel which connects a station to an inter-exchange channel or channel connecting two or more stations within an exchange area.

LOCAL EXCHANGE SERVICE - Telephone communications within a Local Service Area in accordance with the provisions of the Company's tariffs.

LOCAL MESSAGE - A completed communication between stations located within the same Exchange Area or Local Service Area.

LOCAL SERVICE AREA - The area within which telephone service is furnished under a specific schedule of rates without the application of specific charges for each message.

LONG DISTANCE MESSAGE - See "TOLL MESSAGE."

MAIN TERMINAL - The termination of a central office customer's premises, usually at a protector.

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MESSAGE - A completed customer call.

MESSAGE RATE SERVICE - A service for which charges are based upon the number of originated messages placed by the customer to stations within the same local or message rate calling area.

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MESSAGE TOLL TELEPHONE SERVICE - See "TOLL MESSAGE."

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JOINT USER SERVICE - An arrangement whereby an individual, firm or corporation whose telephone needs are not such as to justify the provision of separate customer service, is permitted to use the service of a customer.

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LONG DISTANCE MESSAGE - See "TOLL MESSAGE."

MAIN TERMINAL - The termination of a central office line on a customer's premises, usually at a protector.

MAINTENANCE OF SERVICE CHARGE - The charge applied for time spent by a Company employee on a repair visit to determine the source of trouble on customer-provided equipment.

MESSAGE - A completed customer call.

MESSAGE RATE SERVICE - A service for which charges are based upon the number of originated messages placed by the customer to stations within the same local or message rate calling area.

MESSAGE TOLL TELEPHONE SERVICE - See "TOLL MESSAGE."

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DEFINITIONS

MILEAGE - The measurement upon which charges are computed for Foreign Exchange, extension, tie and private lines and for lines serving exchange stations located outside of the Base Rate Area or outside the central office (area of the serving central office).

MINIMUM CONTRACT PERIOD - The minimum length of time for which a customer is obligated to pay for service, facilities and equipment whether or not retained by the customer for such minimum length of time.

MOBILE TELEPHONE SERVICE - A communication service provided by means of radio frequencies through a land radiotelephone base station. Connections may be established between a wire station and a mobile or fixed unit or between two mobile or fixed units.

MULTIPARTY LINE - A single central office circuit furnishing exchange service to a number of main terminals outside of the Base Rate Area.

NETWORK ACCESS POINT - A connector, outlet, or wiring termination on a customer's premises which affords connection to the network and facilities of the Company.

NETWORK CONTROL SIGNALING UNIT - The terminal equipment furnished, installed and maintained by the Company for the provision of network control signaling.

NONRECURRING CHARGE - A one-time charge associated with a specific item of equipment. This charge applies to installation and to subsequent maintenance.

NOTICE - See "DISCONNECT NOTICE."

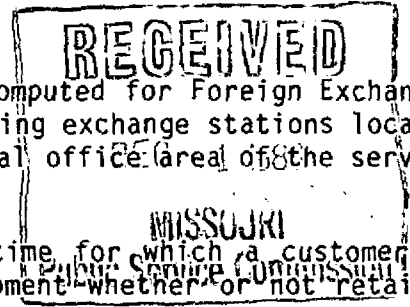
NRC - See "NONRECURRING CHARGE."

OPERATOR'S SET - A headset used by an operator at a switchboard consisting of a receiver, transmitter and necessary cords.

PARTY LINE - An exchange line designed for the connection of more than one line termination with the central office. (See also "Multiparty Line.")

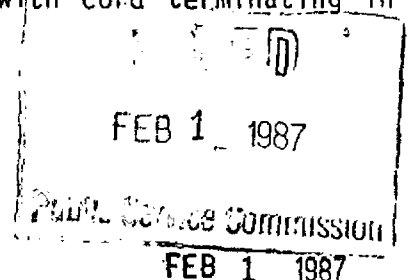
PERSON - An individual, partnership, corporation or other legal entity.

PORTABLE TELEPHONE SET - A telephone set equipped with cord terminating in a plug.



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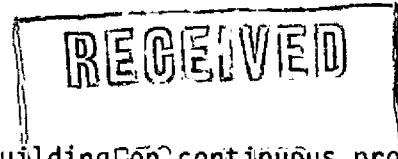
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PREMISES - The buildings, portion or portions of a building on continuous prop-
erty used and/or occupied at one time by the customer in the conduct of his
business or as a residence. Where floor space in adjoining buildings is made
continuous at one or more floor levels, all floor space in both buildings is
considered as the same premises insofar as the customer who uses and occupies
such continuous floor space is concerned, the two buildings otherwise being
considered as separate buildings.

PRIVATE BRANCH EXCHANGE SYSTEM - An arrangement of equipment consisting of
switching apparatus with attendant's telephone, trunks to a central office and
stations connected with the switching apparatus, providing for intercommunica-
tion between these stations and communication with the general exchange and
interexchange systems. Throughout this Tariff, the commonly used abbreviation,
"PBX", will be substituted for the words "Private Branch Exchange" and "PABX"
will be substituted for the words "Private Automatic Branch Exchange".

Any communications system or its components which has the capability to auto-
matically select or direct a line from a group or groups of lines in a **CANCELLED**
terminated fashion shall be classified as a PBX/PABX System.

A. PBX Trunk: A circuit connecting a PBX system with a central office. **SEP 15 1994**

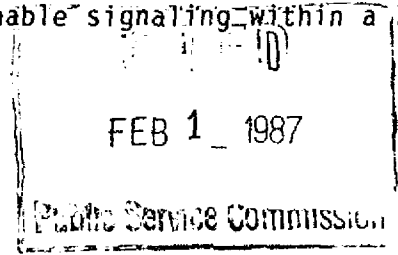
B. Switchboards: Switchboards are classified as follows: **BY 93-1**
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1. Cordless Switchboard (Key Switchboard): A switchboard on which all
lines terminate on keys which may be used to interconnect stations,
and stations and trunk lines.

2. Dial Switchboard: A switchboard on which interconnection of sta-
tions, and stations and trunk lines is established by means of
dialing.

C. Power Source: Power furnished for talking and for operating lamp or
visual signals and relays.

D. Ringing Current: Current furnished by means of a circuit from a central
office or some other source of supply to enable signaling within a PBX
system.



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PRIVATE BRANCH EXCHANGE TELEPHONE - Any telephone connected with a PBX system.

PRIVATE BRANCH EXCHANGE TRUNKS - See "PRIVATE BRANCH EXCHANGE SYSTEM."

PRIVATE LINE - A circuit provided to furnish communication between two or more telephones directly connected to it. Such telephones do not have access to the general exchange and interexchange networks.

PROSPECTIVE CUSTOMER - A person who has requested service but who has not yet entered into a contract for service.

PUBLIC TELEPHONE - A telephone set, either attended or equipped with a coin-collecting device, designed and placed for use by the public in general at locations chosen or accepted by the Company.

REGISTERED TERMINAL EQUIPMENT - Equipment registered in accordance with FCC regulations which may be connected to access services of the Company.

RENDITION OF A BILL - The date a bill is mailed to a customer.

RESIDENCE SERVICE - Telephone service furnished to customers where the use or obvious use is for domestic purposes.

RURAL SERVICE - See "SUBURBAN AREA."

SELECTOR - See "SWITCH."

SERVICE - The provision by the Company of communications service.

SERVICE CHARGE - The nonrecurring charge a customer is required to pay for establishing telephone service or subsequent modification of that service.

SERVICE ORDER CHARGE - The charge for receiving and recording information from a customer or applicant.

SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT - A written agreement between a customer and the Company which provides for the payment of undisputed charges over a period longer than the customer's normal billing period.

SUPPLEMENTAL FACILITIES OR SERVICES - Services or facilities other than primary service.

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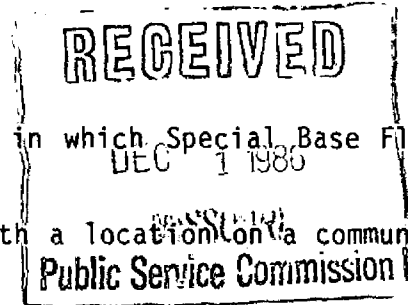

SPECIAL RATE AREA - A portion of an exchange area in which Special Base Flat Rates apply.

STATION - Specific identifying number associated with a location on a communications system.

SUBSCRIBER - See "CUSTOMER."

SUBURBAN AREA - The territory surrounding the Base Rate Area and/or Special Rate Area in which suburban and rural services are furnished and in which urban classes of service are furnished at established rates plus extra exchange line mileage charges.

SUBURBAN SERVICE - Service furnished to customers outside the Base Rate or Special Rate Area(s) but within the exchange area.

SWITCH - A unit of dial switching equipment which provides interconnection between station lines or trunks.

SWITCHBOARD - See "PRIVATE BRANCH EXCHANGE SYSTEM."

TARIFF - The schedule of rates and charges, rules and regulations adopted and filed by the Company and approved by the Missouri Public Service Commission.

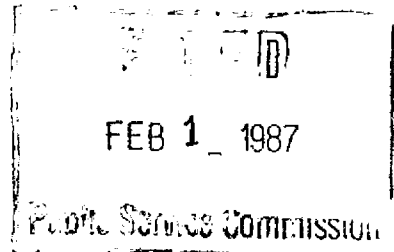
TELEPHONE COMPANY - See "COMPANY."

TELEPHONE SET - A telephone instrument consisting of a transmitter, receiver, and associated apparatus connected to permit transmission and receipt of telephone messages.

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TELEPHONE UTILITY - See "COMPANY."

TELETYPEWRITER - A teletypewriter consists of apparatus designed for the sending and receiving, or receiving only, of typewritten messages transmitted electrically.

TERMINAL EQUIPMENT - Equipment at the terminal of a communication circuit.

TERMINAL EQUIPMENT ACCESSORIES - Apparatus and associated wiring, which do not constitute a communications system and which, when connected to the telecommunications system of the Company are connected either electrically, acoustically or inductively.

TERMINATION CHARGE - A charge applied under certain conditions when a contract for service is terminated by the customer before the expiration of the minimum contract period.

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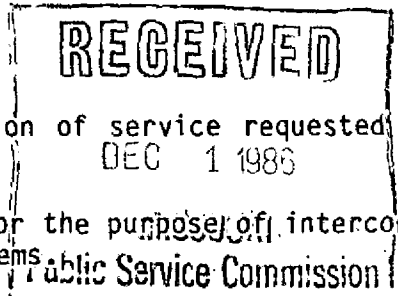

TERMINATION OF SERVICE or TERMINATION - A cessation of service requested by a customer.

TIE LINE - A circuit connecting two PBX systems for the purpose of interconnection between the stations connected with such systems.

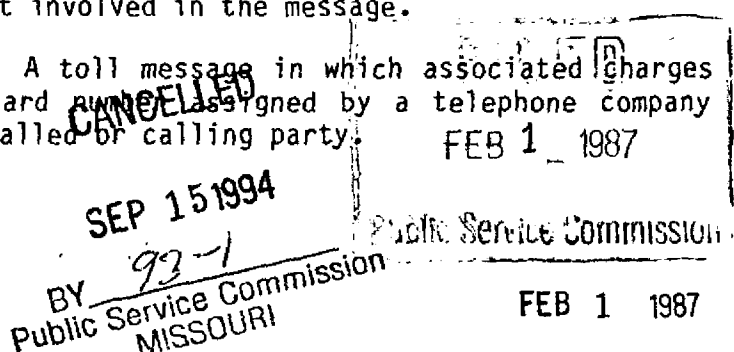
TIE LINE MILEAGE - The measurement on which the rates for tie lines connecting customers' switchboards are based.

TOLL CENTER - A telephone switching center at which the operations function (message timing, switching and recording) takes place in connection with the provision of toll message service.

TOLL LINE - A circuit used exclusively for the transmission of messages between points located in different exchange areas where specific charges for each such message are applicable.

TOLL MESSAGE - A message between stations in different exchange areas and furnished under the provisions of the applicable Toll Tariff.

- A. Person-to-Person Toll Message: A toll message in which the user stipulates a desire for communication with a specified person or extension station at a specified location.
- B. Station-to-Station Toll Message: A toll message in which the user stipulates a desire for communication only with a specified telephone or switchboard.
- C. Collect Message: A toll message in which the charge may be reversed provided the charge is accepted at the called station. A collect call may be billed to a Credit Card or third-party number. In case of a public or semi-public coin telephone the charges must be billed to a Credit Card or third-party number, or the call may be reoriginated from the called station.
- D. Third Number Message: A toll message in which associated charges are billed neither to the calling station nor to the called station but rather to a station not involved in the message.
- E. Credit Card Message: A toll message in which associated charges are billed to a credit card assigned by a telephone company and issued to either the called or calling party.



DEFINITIONS

TROUBLE ISOLATION CHARGE - The charge applied for time spent by a Company employee on a repair visit to determine the source of trouble on customer-provided equipment. (N)

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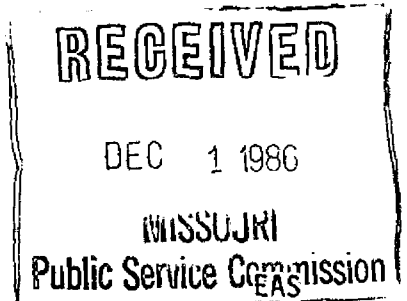
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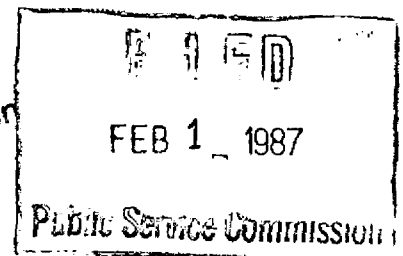

- 2) As the Company completes upgrading, as shown on approved "Local Exchange Service Offerings" sheets and/or maps, only business and residence individual line flat rate service will be available. One-party rates will be effective for each customer on the date the customer's service is upgraded to one-party service.

The fire system causes all interconnected firemen's one-party line telephones to ring with a continuous distinctive ringing tone, except those lines which are busy. On busy firemen's lines, a special tone is applied informing such persons of the incoming fire call. When the busy fireman's line is made free, the system begins ringing such stations with continuous ring tone also.
- b. The calling party reports the emergency situation to the first fireman to answer the fire call and then disconnects. Even after a fireman, or firemen, have answered the fire call, the equipment will continue to ring the unanswered firemen's stations with continuous ringing tone until the completion of the equipment timing cycle.
