A. Service Description

1. Metropolitan Calling Area (MCA) service is available in the Springfield MCA.
2. The basic local calling scope for each of these exchanges is the MCA-wide calling scope as described in Sections C.1 and C.2 of this tariff.
3. In selected exchanges, MCA service is an optional service which provides the subscriber with an optional local calling area which includes the respective Metropolitan Exchange and certain customers in other exchanges where MCA service is also available, as described in Section C.2 following.
4. In the Springfield MCA, exchanges [and Metropolitan Exchange Zones] are grouped into different MCA rate classifications. In the Springfield MCA, exchanges where Optional MCA Service is available are classified as MCA-2.

B. Availability of Service

1. Springfield MCA

- a. The Choctaw Telephone Company MCA-2 exchange where Optional MCA service is available is Halltown.

2. Service Implementation

MCA service is being implemented between August 21, 1993 and September 30, 1994. Service may not be available in or to all MCA exchanges during this time.

3. Contingency

This tariff is being filed subject to Choctaw Telephone Company's appeal of the MPSC order (Case No. TO-92-306) establishing MCA. The company reserves the right to withdraw this tariff in the event Choctaw's appeal of the MPSC order establishing MCA results in a final judicial order reversing the MPSC.

C. Calling Scope

1. Service Area - Springfield MCA

The total service area for the Springfield MCA is comprised of the following two groups of zones and exchanges:

- a. Southwestern Bell's Springfield Metropolitan Exchange, including the Principal Zone and the MCA-1 Zones of Rogersville, Strafford, Fair Grove, Willard, Republic and Nixa.
- b. MCA-2 includes the following: Southwestern Bell's exchanges of Walnut Grove, Ash Grove, Billings, Clever and Marionville; GTE's exchanges of Elkland, Marshfield, Fordland, Sparta, Ozark, Highlandville and Hurley; Missouri Telephone Company's Exchanges of Pleasant Hope and Morrisville; and Choctaw Telephone Company's exchange of Halltown.

2. Optional MCA Calling Scopes-Springfield MCA-2

The calling scope for MCA subscribers in MCA-2 exchanges includes all customers in the Springfield Metropolitan Exchange, and MCA subscribers in MCA-2 exchanges.

D. Regulations

1. Unless otherwise specified in these regulations, MCA is offered to all classes and grades of residence and business customers located in an MCA exchange. MCA service is also available in conjunction with Foreign Exchange Service in an MCA exchange.
2. Optional MCA Service is not offered in conjunction with Public, Semi-Public, Customer-Owned Pay Telephone, Cellular Service or any switched Feature Group A Service.

3. MCA is designed and intended for the exclusive use of the end user customers of the Telephone Company. MCA is not to be shared, resold or used in any configuration of customer-provided equipment with the intent of reselling the service. With the exception of Shared Tenant Service, as described in other tariffs of the Telephone Company, MCA is available to interexchange carriers or other telecommunications services providers for administrative trunks only.
4. In situations where multiple access lines share the same working telephone number, if one such line subscribes to MCA service, then all lines must subscribe to MCA service.
5. In situations where a hunting arrangement between access lines is provided by the Telephone Company, no MCA line may be configured to hunt to a non-MCA line.
6. Unless otherwise specified, MCA is subject to the Rules and Regulations applying to all customer contracts as specified in the General Exchange Tariff of the Telephone Company. Furthermore, all Rules and Regulations governing Local Exchange Service apply to MCA Service.
7. The minimum service period for subscription to Optional MCA Service is one month.
8. Rate Application
 - a. The MCA monthly rates specified in E.1, below, apply on a per-line basis, except for Plexar or Centrex type services which are billed on a PBX trunk equivalent basis, as specified in the General Exchange Tariff.
 - b. The MCA monthly rates are billed one month in advance.

1. A discount from standard monthly rates for business service may be allowed in connection with service furnished through the Missouri School Discount Program, pursuant to the Video Instructional Development and Educational Opportunity Program, as enacted by the Missouri State Legislature.
2. Upon the customer's request, a discount of twenty percent (20%) from standard monthly access line rates may be allowed to educational institutions within the Company's certified area, as determined in Paragraph 3, following.
3. An educational institution shall be defined either as an accredited public school, or an accredited private school which is tax exempt pursuant to 26 U.S.C. § 501(c)(3). Persons operating home schools, as defined in § 167.031 RSMo, shall not be eligible for this school discount program. Private schools must be accredited by either the Missouri Chapter of the National Federation of Non-Public Schools Accrediting Association, Independent Schools Association of the Central States, North Central Association of Colleges and Schools, and/or the University of Missouri-Columbia. Public Schools must be accredited by the Department of Elementary and Secondary Education for the State of Missouri and/or the North Central Association of Colleges and Schools.
4. The qualifying discount will be permitted only on the local exchange access line. All other features, ancillary services or options, relative to the particular service, shall continue to be billed at the appropriate tariffed rates.
5. The qualifying discount will be permitted only where the predominant use is providing educational and instructional programs and for the educational institutions' administrative use. The discount is not allowed to residential complexes associated with the institution.
6. In addition to meeting the qualification specified in Paragraph 3 preceding, an eligible customer must sign an affidavit certifying that the qualification is met. The affidavit will be retained on file with the Company.
7. The customer should request to receive the discount on all subsequent additions of eligible services which are ordered. There will be no additional affidavits required.
8. The following local exchange services are eligible for discount under this program:
 -Flat Rate, business one-party service.

2. The level of discount available will mirror the discount percentage level available to the school or library through the Federal Universal Service Fund program. The discount will be applied against the intrastate service rate otherwise applicable under this tariff. The discount only applies to the extent funds are available to the eligible school or library, through the Federal Universal Service Fund.

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Additional Listing - Directory information which may provide a name and/or address of a customer within the same exchange.

NOV 19 1997

Demarcation Point - The point of connection, provided and maintained by the telephone utility to which the station wiring becomes dedicated to an individual customer's use. For an individual customer dwelling, this point of connection will generally be the modular jack incorporated into the customer side of the Network Interface Device (NID). The drop wire and the network protector will continue to be provided by, and remain the property of, the telephone company. The demarcation point is usually the point at which the telephone company wiring connects with the customers wiring.

Extension Service - An extension is an additional station connected to the same access line as the main station, and having the same telephone number as the main station.

Premise - All of the buildings or the adjoining portions of a building occupied and used by the subscriber as a place of business or residence, which are located on a contiguous plot of ground not intersected by a public thoroughfare.

Primary Listing - A primary listing in the directory is furnished as part of a customer's local telephone service. The primary listing may include the name, address and telephone number of the individual, organization, firm, or corporation contracting for the service.

Qualifying Low-Income Subscriber - A "qualifying low-income subscriber" is a subscriber who participates in one of the following programs: Medicaid; food stamps; supplemental security income; federal public housing assistance; or Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Program.

Toll Blocking - "Toll Blocking" is a service provided by carriers that lets customers elect not to allow the completion of outgoing toll calls to the Long Distance Message Telecommunications Network, this would include 1+, 0+ and/or 0- operator handled calls.

Toll Restriction - Central office arrangement that would allow the placing of local calls however all outgoing long distance calls and operator service calls would be blocked.

Custom Calling Features are provided by the Telephone Company to enhance the utility of Local Exchange Service to the end user.

(A) General Description

Custom Calling Features are provided in conjunction with Local Exchange Services and includes the following:

- (1) Call Forwarding - an arrangement whereby incoming calls may be transferred to another telephone number by signaling a prefix code and the telephone number of the service to which calls are to be transferred. Calls forwarded by this feature are subject to applicable long distance message charges. These calls are also subject to transmission limitations.
- (2) Call Waiting - An arrangement whereby an end user who is using an exchange access line arranged for call waiting is alerted, by means of a tone signal, when another caller is trying to reach that line. The customer, by flashing the switchhook, is able to have alternative conversation between parties.
- (3) Speed Call - an arrangement which provides for the calling of a telecommunications network telephone number by dialing an abbreviated code. Two arrangements are available, either an eight-code capacity or a thirty-code capacity, but not both on the same line.

- (4) Three-way Calling - an arrangement which permits an existing call to be held and a second call to be established and added to the connection for conferencing. Conference calls made with this service are subject to transmission limitations and applicable toll charges.
- (5) Toll Restriction - an arrangement which permits the end user to dial local service area calls but does not permit the origination of long distance calls. In addition this arrangement denies the user access to "ZERO" (Operator) dialing.
- (6) Coded Ringing - an arrangement whereby a ringing pattern different than the regular ringing pattern is used to notify an end user the call is for a certain person in the end user's premise. The distinctive ring is an interrupted ring using a seven digit number separate from the end user's regular telephone number.
- (7) Cancel Call Waiting - an arrangement that allows a subscriber to prevent, on a per-call basis, any incoming calls from Call Waiting on his or her line. Incoming calls to the station receive busy treatment. This feature ensures that the Call Waiting indication tones will not interrupt important calls or disrupt data transmissions.

- (8) Call Privacy - an arrangement that allows the subscriber to inhibit the use of any overriding feature for the duration of the call.
- (9) Do Not Disturb - an arrangement that allows a subscriber to place their telephone in an apparent busy condition to all incoming calls without affecting outgoing features of the line. The feature is set up and removed as required by the subscriber. Special Busy Tone is required if a line in a Do Not Disturb (DND) condition is called.
- (10) Home Intercom - an arrangement that allows a subscriber to use any extension in a home or business as an intercom device to call other extensions connected to the same line.
- (11) Last Number Redial - an arrangement that allows a subscriber to automatically redial the last number dialed at their telephone when the appropriate feature code is entered.
- (12) Verification - Denied - An arrangement that prevents a line from being verified by an Operator. This feature could be assigned to a dedicated data line to prevent interference with data transmission. Since this feature is an assigned Service Category option, it is in effect for as long as the line has this Service Category option assigned to it.

- (13) Wakeup Call - an arrangement that allows a wakeup call to be set up to ring a subscriber's telephone at a pre-programmed time.
- (14) Make Busy - an arrangement that allows a subscriber who is a member of a hunt group to temporarily remove their directory number from hunt operations directed towards the group.
- (15) Line Hunting - an arrangement which allows for the selection of the end user's next available line when the line associated with the called number and the end user is busy.
- (16) Selective Toll Restriction - an arrangement that allows a subscriber to selectively remove toll restrictions through the use of a personal account code (PAC).
- (17) Number Referral Service - an arrangement which allows for interception of a disconnected directory number, with a digital voice recording telling the intercepted party the new directory number that has replaced the disconnected number.

(18) Nuisance Traps - Nuisance Traps provide the capability of capturing and recording the telephone number of the calling party for each local telephone call to the customer's telephone number. The calling party's number is captured by telephone company switching equipment and is transmitted to a local law enforcement agency where a report is printed containing the time of the call and the calling party. Nuisance traps will not be installed unless requested by the customer through a law enforcement agency of the local, state, or federal government. Results of the nuisance trap will only be disclosed to appropriate law enforcement agencies in accordance with applicable law.

Unusual expenses such as overtime or prolonged work incurred in gathering data for nuisance trapping will be charged to the particular customer at the company's current loaded labor rate. This charge will not apply to law enforcement agencies making requests.

(B) Limitations

- (1) The acceptance of long distance collect call messages is not restricted by the use of Toll Restriction.
- (2) Custom Calling Features are only available on single party service.

(b) Feature Descriptions:

(1) Automatic Call Return - Automatic Call Return permits the subscriber to place a call to a telephone number associated with the most recent incoming call whether or not the call was answered or the telephone number is known by the subscriber. If the called line is available, the call is immediately completed. If the called line is not available, a queuing process, which may last up to thirty minutes, takes place. When both lines are available, the calling subscriber is notified via a distinctive ring that the network is ready to place the call. When the subscriber picks up the telephone, the call is automatically placed.

(2) Automatic Redial - Automatic Redial allows the subscriber to automatically redial the last number dialed from the subscriber's telephone regardless of the completion status of the last number dialed. If the called line is available, the call will be placed immediately. If the redialed line is available, the call will be placed immediately. If the redialed line is busy, the network will queue the request for thirty minutes and process the call when both the called and calling party lines are idle. When the call can be completed, a distinctive ring will be provided to the caller's line to alert the subscriber that the requested callback is ready. When the subscriber picks up the telephone, the call is automatically placed. This feature cannot be activated for calls originating from a line that is forwarded.

During the time that the incoming call is placed, the calling number is forwarded from the central office to a compatible customer provided Customer Premises Equipment (CPE) Display Unit associated with the customer's local exchange service. The calling telephone number is then delivered to the display device during the first silent interval of ringing.

The calling number is not available when incoming calls have been handled by an operator or charged to credit cards. Number delivery for calls originating from a PBX will display the main PBX number only. If the caller's number is not part of the CLASS network, is a multi-party line, or is blocked, the number will not be displayed.

Subscription to Calling number delivery on EBS access lines is only available on the customer group level and not on a per line basis. Rates and charges, however, will apply on a per line basis.

Telephone numbers transmitted via Caller ID by Number may not be sold or given to another party without the caller's consent. Caller ID by Number information may only be used for:

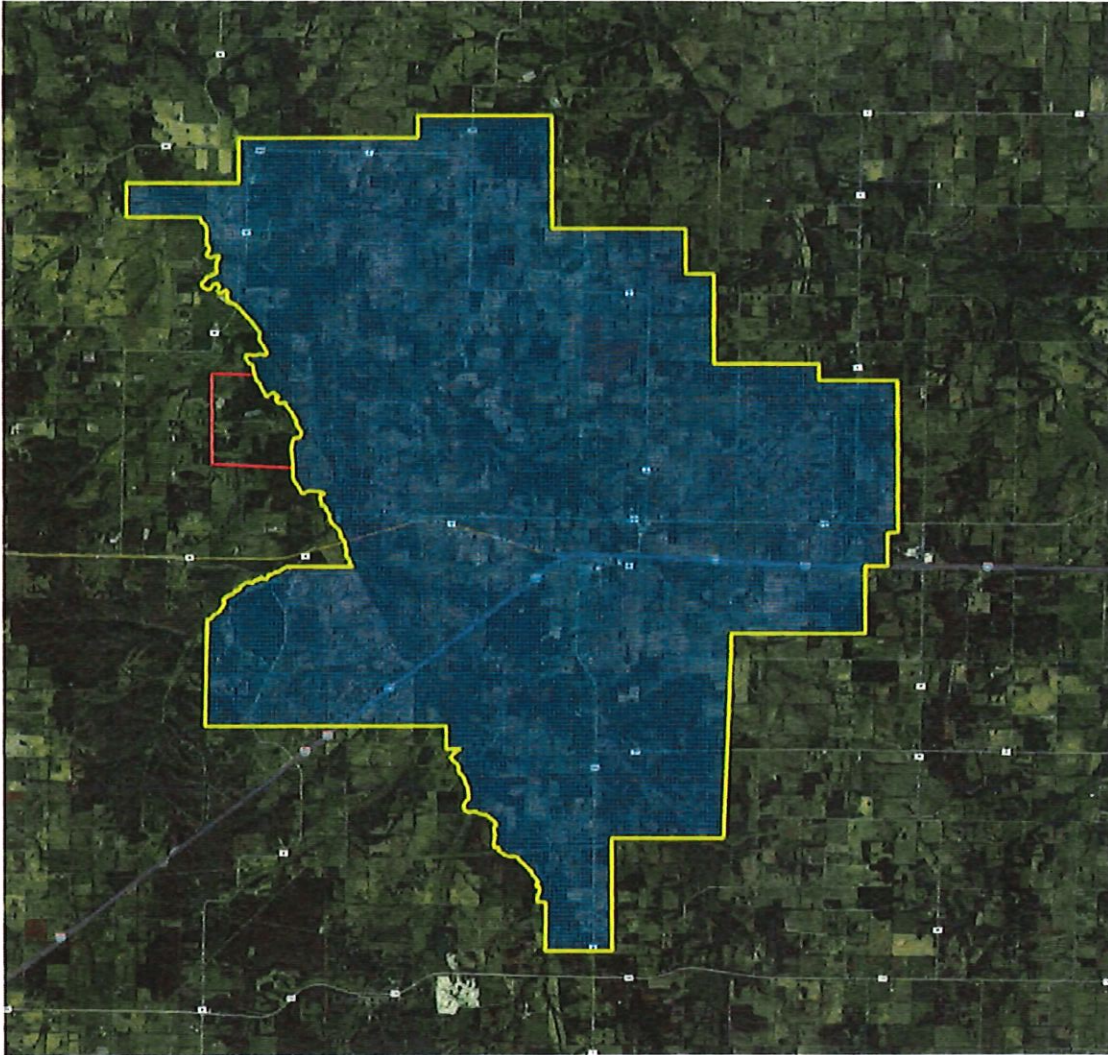

APPLICATION OF BUSINESS AND RESIDENCE RATES Public Service Commission

A. Business Rates Apply at the Following Locations:

1. In offices, stores, shops, factories and all places of a strictly business nature.

2. In boarding houses, except as noted in B-2 below, offices of hotels, halls, and offices of apartment buildings; quarters occupied by clubs; public, private or parochial schools or colleges, hospitals, libraries, and other similar institutions where the principal usage indicated is for administrative purposes.

3. CONSTRUCTION AND SPECIAL INSTALLATION CHARGESMISSOURI
Public Service Commission

A. General

The regulations stated herein apply (a) when the service requested requires the installation or extension of facilities which would not, but for the applicant's request, be needed in the Telephone Company's plant, and (b) to special wiring or type of construction requested by the Subscriber.

All facilities constructed by the Telephone Company and used by it in the furnishing of telephone service, including those facilities to which special charges may apply, shall remain the property of the Telephone Company.

B. Extension of Facilities

For extensions required where the proposed service is temporary and the plant to be put in place would not all be of value to the Telephone Company in the general conduct of its business upon discontinuance of that service, the customer shall be charged the estimated cost of construction and removal of the plant (including circuits, pole line or conduit as required) which is not of value to the Telephone Company, less the estimated immediate net recovery value of the material used.

If it is necessary to use private right of way and this cannot be obtained by the Telephone Company without expense to it, the subscriber shall obtain or pay the expense of obtaining the required right of way.

1. Applications for Service

a. Applications for service shall constitute a contract when accepted in writing by the Telephone Company or upon the establishment of service. This initial minimum period for which charges shall apply will be 30 days.

2. Telephone Numbers.

The subscriber has no property right in the telephone number and the Telephone Company may change any number at any time whenever it deems it advisable in the conduct of its business.

3. Alterations

The subscriber agrees to notify the Telephone Company promptly whenever alterations or new construction on premises

owned or leased by him will necessitate changes in the Telephone Company's wiring and equipment; and the subscriber agrees to pay the Telephone Company's current charges, if any, for such changes.

4. Responsibility of Subscriber for Payment

The subscriber is required to pay all charges for exchange services and facilities and for toll messages in accordance with provisions contained elsewhere in these Tariffs. The subscriber is held responsible for all charges for telephone service rendered at his telephone, both exchange and toll, including charges for toll messages on which the charges have been reversed.

5. Maintenance and Repair

If the equipment or wiring is rearranged, disconnected or removed, the Telephone Company shall have the right to make a charge in accordance with the rules and regulations then in effect.

6. Unusual Installation Cost

B. ESTABLISHMENT OF CREDIT

1. The Company is not obligated to establish, furnish, or continue to furnish basic local telecommunication service to any individual or firm that owes for such service previously rendered at the same or a different address, until arrangements have been made to liquidate such previous indebtedness to the Company.

C. DEPOSITS

1. The Company may require a deposit or guarantee prior to providing new service or as a condition of continued service. The Company may require a deposit or guarantee as a condition of continued service if:

 - b. The customer has had service disconnected for nonpayment of a delinquent charge or failed to post a required deposit or guarantee.

- 4. The Company shall, permit a customer, concurrent with the beginning of service, to post a deposit in two equal monthly installments or as otherwise agreed upon.
- 5. The amount of a deposit shall not exceed estimated charges for two (2) months service based on the average bill during the preceding twelve (12) months or in the case of new applicants for service, the average monthly bill for all subscribers within a customer class.

guarantors will be released or deposits with accrued interest will be refunded or credited against charges on subsequent bills. - +8. The deposit shall bear interest at a rate which is equal to one percent (1%) above the prime lending rates as published in the *Wall Street Journal*. This rate shall be adjusted annually on December 1 using the prime lending rate, as published in the *Wall Street Journal* on the last business day of September of each year, plus one percent (1%). The interest shall be credited annually upon the account of the customer or paid upon the return of the deposit, whichever occurs first. Interest shall not accrued on any deposit after th date on which a reasonable effort has been made to return it to the customer.
9. At the option of the Company, a cash deposit may be refunded or credited to the customer at any time prior to termination of service or the customer's twelfth billing period. In the case of a cash deposit interest is paid for the period during which the deposit is held by the Company.

6. The regular restoral of service charge will be made for reconnecting services which have been discontinued for nonpayment of undisputed charges due. No allowance will be made for loss of service during the period service is disconnected for nonpayment if payment is made and service reconnected before the completion of an order to terminate service. a discontinuance of basic local telecommunication service.

3. The Telephone Company may place global toll blocking and eliminate any optional, non-basic calling features and functions for customer nonpayment of delinquent charges for other than basic local telecommunications service.
4. Subject to the requirements of this chapter, service may be discontinued during normal business hours on or after the date specified in the notice of discontinuance. - (G) A statement that this notice will not be effective if the charges involved are part of an unresolved dispute; and

Any person who alleges such emergency, if requested, shall provide the Telephone Company with reasonable evidence of such necessity.

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E. OBLIGATION AND LIABILITY OF THE TELEPHONE COMPANY

1. Availability of Facilities

The Telephone Company's obligation to furnish exchange and toll service is dependent upon its ability to secure and retain without unreasonable expense, suitable facilities and rights for the construction and maintenance of the necessary circuits, equipment, etc.

2. Interruptions of Service

If service is interrupted for more than 48 hours other than by the negligence or wilful act of the subscriber, non-payment of bill, Acts of God and excluding Saturday, Sunday and holidays, and it remains out of order for an additional 24 hour period of time after being reported or found to be out of order, adjustments, credit or refunds shall be made to the customer. The refund may be accomplished by a credit on the subsequent bill for service. No other liability shall in any case attach to the Telephone Company on account of interruptions of service.

3. Directory Errors and Omissions

The Telephone Company issues directories to assist in furnishing prompt and efficient service and it does not guarantee to its subscribers correct listings therein. Every precaution is taken to prevent errors in, and omissions of, directory listings but they may occur. If such errors or omissions do occur the Telephone Company's liability therefor shall be limited to an adjustment of the directory charges, if any, for the directory period. The Telephone Company will not be a party to controversies arising between subscribers or others as a result of listings published in its directories.

4. Transmitting Messages

The Telephone Company does not transmit messages but offers the use of its facilities for communications.

1. Payphone Service includes lines to which coin, coinless, card reader or coin/card reader telephones may be attached.

Payphone Service is a two-way or, optionally, one-way originating only business exchange access line composed of the serving central office line equipment, all outside plant facilities needed to connect the serving central office with the customer's premises, and the Network Interface Device at the demarcation point. These facilities are Company-provided and maintained and provide access to and from the telecommunications network for long distance service and local calling.
3. In the case of one-way service, intercept treatment will be provided.
4. A maximum of one customer-provided instrument may be connected to any one Instrument or CO implemented coin line.
5. General Rules and Regulations found in other sections of this tariff are applicable to the provision of Payphone Service.
6. Directory listings may be provided under the regulations governing the furnishing of listings for business subscribers.
7. A Network Interface Device will be installed at a location mutually agreed upon by the Payphone Service Provider and the Company. The Network Interface Device is a company-provided jack or its equivalent. It is the point of connection between the telephone company owned wiring and wiring owned by the Customer.
8. One directory will be distributed to the Payphone Service Provider without charge for each payphone business exchange line.
9. Installation Charges and the appropriate Network Interface Device (NID) material charge are applicable for the installation, move or rearrangement of the NID on the customer's premises to establish or reestablish network access.

10. Installation Charges and the appropriate NID material charge apply when a premises visit is made for the sole purpose of installing a customer requested NID.
11. The Company shall not be liable for shortages of coins collected and deposited at the subscriber's equipment. The limit of the Company's liability for end user fraud of whatever nature occurring at or in association with the subscriber's equipment shall be governed by provisions of this Tariff and rule or regulations of the Missouri Public Service Commission. In case of conflict between the tariff provisions and Commission rules and regulations, the rule or regulations shall prevail.
12. Off-Premise Extensions are not permitted.
13. Hold for Future Use +
14. The Multiline Business Subscriber Line Charge, found in the interstate access tariff, is applicable to all payphone Instrument and CO Implemented coin lines.

B. Responsibility of the Customer

1. The Customer for the purposes of this tariff is defined as the Payphone Service Provider.
2. The customer shall be responsible for the installation, operation and maintenance of the customer-provided instrument, plus all ancillary equipment, such as booths, shelves, lighting, directories, etc., used in connection with this service. The customer is responsible for complying with the requirements set forth in the American With Disabilities Act of 1990.

The customer-provided instrument must be registered in compliance with Part 68 of the FCC's Registration Program. In addition, the customer must comply with the Missouri Public Service Commission's Rules and Regulations regarding the use of customer-provided pay telephones.

D. Instrument Implemented Payphone Service

Instrument Implemented Payphone Service is offered for use with a customer provided pay telephone. All attachments of a customer provided instrument to the network must be made pursuant to the rules and regulations set forth in this Tariff and as required by State and Federal commissions.

E. Central Office (CO) Implemented Coin Line

1. Central Office Implemented Coin Line provides coin signaling. It is a line side connection from the local exchange switch to the point of demarcation at the customer premise.
2. Features are additives to the operation of a flat rate access line that provide for CO Implemented coin line service. The Company offers those features that are provided by the functionality of the Company's switches. These include coin supervision, coin control (collect and return of coins, if applicable), and answer supervision. CO implemented coin line features that are implemented by the functionality of an operator service provider, such as coin rating, coin refund, repair referral, and operator call screening, are the responsibility of the Payphone service provider (Customer).
3. CO Implemented Coin Line features, including coin line signaling, coin collect and return (where applicable) and answer supervision, are provided by the Telephone Company per the technology available from the Company's facilities. It shall be the responsibility of the CO Implemented Coin Line payphone owner to assure technical and operational compatibility with the coin line features offered by the Telephone Company.

F. Features and Functions

1. Answer Supervision provides signaling on the line notifying the line that has answered. This feature is an additive to the CO Implemented Coin Line.
2. Coin Collection and Return provides an electrical signal on a CO Implemented Line indicating to the payphone equipment to collect coin(s) from or return coin(s) to the calling party. This feature is an additive to the CO Implemented Coin Line.
3. Special Number Assignment is a specific number requested by the customer. This service is available where facilities are accessible and it is technical feasible to provide. This feature is an additive to the CO Implemented Coin Line or to the Instrument Implemented Payphone Service.
4. Selective Class of Call Screening will be provided where such facilities are available at the customer's option. 5. Validation may be performed through Originating-Line Screening (OLS). 811 ONE-CALL SERVICE

A. Description

1. 811 Service is a three-digit abbreviated local dialing arrangement which allows local exchange end-users to reach the providers of Missouri's One Call Notification System (811 Customer). 811 Service is used by the One Call Notification System to provide notice of excavation activities to operators of underground facilities. 811 Service determines the central office service the calling party, translates the dialed digits to an 811 Customer provided designated toll free telephone number, and routes the call to that number.

B. Terms and Conditions

1. The Company and 811 Customer will negotiate the installation date for the 811 Service.
2. There can be only 811 Customer for each stand-alone, host, or remote central office NAP-NXX serving area.
3. The Company will route calls based upon the serving central office.
4. The 811 Customer must provide a toll-free number to the Company to ensure that toll charges are not incurred by the end-user. At all times it shall be the obligation of the 811 Customer to test and be aware of any translation errors or other mistakes in routing 811 calls to the customer provided toll free number.
5. 811 Service can only be accessed by end-users who subscribe to the Company's local exchange service. 811 Service will not complete calls dialed using 0 + 811 or 1 + 811. 811 calls are not permitted where local calling is restricted.
6. 811 Service does not include operator assisted calls, and will only be available to PBX, Centrex, and Key switching systems when those systems have been correctly programmed. The Company does not undertake to perform, nor shall it be responsible, for such programming.

- 1) Universal Emergency Number Service, also referred to as 911 Service, is a telephone exchange communication service whereby one or more Public Safety Answering Points (PSAP) designated by the customer may receive telephone calls dialed to the telephone number 911. 911 Service includes a line and equipment necessary (excluding CPE) for the answering, transferring and dispatching of public emergency telephone 911 calls originated by persons within the serving area. 911 Trunking Service involves the provision of interoffice trunks from the Telephone company Central Office to connect with the PSAP location.
- 2) The 911 emergency number is not intended to replace the telephone service of the various Public Safety Agencies which may participate in the use of this number. The 911 customer must subscribe to additional local exchange service at the PSAP for administrative purpose, for the placing of outgoing calls and for receiving other emergency calls, including any which might be related by Company operators.
- 3) 911 Trunking Service is offered subject to availability of facilities.
- 4) The 911 Trunking Service customer may be a municipality of other state or local government unit, or an authorized agent of one or more municipalities or other state or local government units to whom authority has been lawfully delegated. The customer must be legally authorized to subscribe to the service and have public safety responsibility by law to respond to telephone calls from the public for police, fire or other emergency services within the telephone Central Office area arranged for 911 calling.
- 5) The company may enter into a contract or contracts with the 911 customer or with other telephone companies in order to effectuate the Company's provision of 911 Service in accordance with, pursuant to, and subject to the terms, conditions and limitations of the Tariff. Any such contract(s) shall incorporate by reference the terms, conditions and limitations of this Tariff.
- 6) The rates and charges contained herein are in addition to all other applicable rates and charges located in other parts of this tariff.

- 12) Application for 911 Trunking Service must be executed in writing by each customer. If application for service is made by an agent, the Company must be provided in writing with satisfactory proof of appointment of the agent by the customer. At least one local law enforcement agency must be included among the participating agencies in any 911 offering.

In the event of any interruption of the service, the Company shall not be liable to any person, corporation or other entity for any loss or damage in an amount greater than an amount equal to the pro rata allowance of the tariff rate for the service or facilities provided to the 911 customer for the time such interruption continues, after notice to the Company. No allowance shall be made if the interruption is due to the negligence or willful act of the 911 customer.

Upon receipt of notification from the 911 customer that a Telephone Company subscriber's street address is not accurate or consistent with the MSAG, the Telephone company may suspend the subscriber's basic local service until notified by the 911 customer that the subscriber's address has been made changed and assimilated into the MSAG.

C) Rates

- 1) The rates and charges for 911 Trunking Service set out below are for the provision by the Company of its facilities for trunking calls for the Company's central offices to the PSAP, or between Central Offices within the State of Missouri. The customer is responsible to order connecting trunking facilities from other telephone companies when necessary to extend the trunks to a PSAP beyond the Telephone Company serving area.

A. GENERAL

Public Service Commission

1. Definition - Message toll telephone service is that of furnishing facilities other than and in addition to local facilities for telephone communications between local service areas.

2. Undertaking of the Telephone Company - The Telephone Company does not undertake to transmit messages but offers the use of its facilities for communications between its customers.

3. Priority of Service - In case of a shortage of facilities at any time either for temporary or protracted periods, the establishment of message toll telephone service shall take precedence over all others.

4. Limited Conversation - The Telephone Company reserves the right to limit the length of conversations when necessary in time of emergency resulting in shortage of facilities.

B. LIABILITY OF THE TELEPHONE COMPANY

In view of the fact that the customer has the exclusive control of his communications over the facilities provided him by the Telephone Company, and of the other uses for which facilities may be furnished him by the Telephone Company, and because of unavoidableness of errors incident to the services and to the use of such facilities of the Telephone Company, the services and facilities furnished by the Telephone Company are subject to the terms, conditions and limitations herein specified.

The liability of the Telephone Company for damages arising out of mistakes, omissions, interruptions, delays, errors or defects in transmission occurring in the course of furnishing service, or facilities and not caused by the negligence of the customer, or of the Telephone Company in

Where, due to the manner in which a subdivision is developed, the Telephone Company is required to construct an underground telephone distribution system through a section or sections of the subdivision where service will not be connected for at least two years, then the Telephone Company may require an advance payment equal to the estimated cost of construction from the applicant before construction is commenced.
