It shall also be the responsibility of the IP to provide adequate electrical power, wiring, and electrical outlets necessary for the proper operation of Carrier's equipment on the IP's premises.
- The equipment and facilities which are connected with those of the Carrier shall be constructed, operated, and maintained by those providing same so as to work satisfactorily with the service furnished by the Carrier. Such equipment and facilities shall be suitable to avoid hazard or damage to Carrier's plant or of injury to Carrier's employees or to the public because of the character or location of such equipment or facilities and sources of power to which it is connected. In cases in which additional protection equipment is required, this shall be provided by the IP or by the Carrier at the IP's expense.

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

Approval for child-related programming may be withheld by Carrier for any reason including that the programming is exploitative or unsuitable. Charges for child-related programming may not exceed levels established by the Carrier. When the review and approval requirement is implemented, the IP must submit the proposed programming and proposed formats for Live Programming to the Carrier a minimum of thirty (30) days before the proposed first date of dissemination.
- IP may be required to change its telephone program number whenever the subject matter of the programming and/or format of the Live Programming is different than that which was originally used and/or approved by the Carrier and could result in end-user complaints brought about by the subject matter changes. IP is required to sign a new service order prior to changing its number.

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It shall be the obligation of the IP to notify the Carrier of any interruption in service. Before giving such notice, the IP shall ascertain that the trouble is not being caused by any action or omission of the IP or is not in IP-provided wiring or equipment connected to the terminal of the Carrier.

A communications translation assistant at the center establishes the call and provides the translation. The calling or called party shall bear no charges for calls originating and terminating within the caller's same toll-free local calling scope, including optional expanded calling plans of the LEC for those users subscribing to such plans. If the call is a long-distance call, it is rated as a call from the originating telephone number (calling station) to the terminating telephone number (called station). 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### 4.1 900 Services

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Public Service Commission

900 Services are telecommunications services available to Information Providers (IP) who provide information to end-users via a telephone number (1-900-XXX-XXXX) which is assigned to the IP by the Carrier. The end-user's charge for the call is determined by the IP and will appear on the end-user's local exchange telephone company invoice.
