JUDGE WOODRUFF: All right. That motion will also be granted, and I'll issue a written order on that as well.

MR. LOWERY: Thank you, Judge.

JUDGE WOODRUFF: Then we get to the main point of this proceeding today is establishment of a procedural schedule. Again, Ameren Missouri filed a proposed procedural schedule at the time they filed their application leading to a hearing in October, I believe. Anyone wish to be heard regarding that proposed procedural schedule?

MR. LOWERY: Your Honor, I know that OPC and Staff had no issue with the dates. We indicated that before we filed it. Mr. Mills indicated that MIEC also didn't. I hadn't had a chance to consult with everybody else. I'm hoping that's unanimous and that the schedule is okay as it is.

JUDGE WOODRUFF: And the suggestion was to 9 10 have a local public hearing in Schuyler, I believe. 11 MR. LOWERY: Yeah, there's a community R-I 12 high school. Actually a local public hearing was held 13 in the first Mark Train Transmission CCN case there. 14 It's really quite close to every landowner that would be 15 impacted by this wind facility. Most of it is in 16 Schuyler. A little bit of the facility is in Adair but 17 that's right there on the border. So it seemed like a 18 very central place to have it. I know it accommodates a 19 local public hearing because we used it for that in Mark 20 It has a gym and worked pretty well. If you can Twain. 21 get it. 22 JUDGE WOODRUFF: If we can get it. 23 MR. LOWERY: Right. 24 JUDGE WOODRUFF: Summertime it may be harder 25 to get a school.

MR. LOWERY: Yeah. Well, if it's after August 17, they'll be back. There's probably not as many indoor sports going on maybe in the fall as there would be like basketball season. So hopefully you can.

Okay. Anything else we need to take up while we're on the record?

Just briefly, Your Honor, and Mr. MR. MILLS: Lowery and I talked about this briefly off the record. The proposed procedural schedule includes an expedited response to data requests, and I think given the fairly ambitious schedule overall for the case I think that's really going to be necessary for the case to be able to to be processed in the amount of time that the applicant I think, you know, I have every confidence that Ameren will do its best to try to accommodate this commitment to data request responses. I'm a little concerned just given the sheer number of cases that Ameren has pending or about to be pending, some of which also have accelerated procedural schedules. wanted to note on the record that I think part of the reason that MIEC is willing to go along with this expedited procedural schedule is the expedited discovery response, and I think that's a critical part of the whole package.

I guess what I'll say, Your 1 MR. LOWERY: 2 Honor, is we intend to honor the expedited discovery response that we proposed. We, of course, have the 3 ability in an individual case to say we need more time 4 and we will do that if we have to. We're going to be 5 judicious about doing that to the maximum extent 6 7 possible. 8 As I told Mr. Mills, at least some aspects of 9 this case we're dealing with different people at Ameren 10 to a large extent than we are in some of these other 11 So there's not complete overlap, and hopefully 12 that will help us, though. We're going to do our best. We didn't just put it out there with the intention of 13 14 just disregarding it. We're going to do our best to 15 adhere to it. JUDGE WOODRUFF: It looks like it will be a 16 17 busy summer for you. 18 MR. LOWERY: It's going to be a busy summer. 19 JUDGE WOODRUFF: Anything else we need to take 20 up while we're on the record? All right. Then I will 21 adjourn this on-the-record portion and leave you to your 22 discussions if you have any. 23 MR. LOWERY: Thank you. 24 (Off the record.)
