MISSOURI DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES' RESPONSE TO STAFF RECOMMENDATION

The Missouri Department of Natural Resources ("Department") by and through its undersigned counsel, appears, and for its response and recommendation in the above-styled matter, states:

- 1. On November 4, 2014, Kimberling City Water Company, ("KCWC") filed its *Application and if Necessary, Motion for Waiver* to obtain authorization from the Commission to transfer its water system assets to the Upper White River Basin Foundation, Inc. ("UWRBF"), and ultimately to the Ozark Clean Water Company ("OCWC").
- 2. On November 25, the Department filed its *Application to*Intervene in the above-captioned matter, for the purpose of ensuring that the Commission and Parties took specific note of the aged and deteriorated state of the public water system ("PWS").
- 3. On December 3, the Staff of the Missouri Public Service

 Commission ("Staff") filed its *Recommendation to Approve Sale of Assets*. The

 Recommendation asked the Commission to approve the sale, and transfer of

assets, property and easements, and included a supporting *Memorandum* as Appendix A.

- 4. On December 5, the Office of Public Counsel ("OPC") filed its Response to the Staff's Recommendation, not objecting to the transfer, and requesting a Local Public Hearing to provide a venue for customers to voice concerns, if any.
- 5. On December 8, KCWC filed its *Response* to both the Staff *Recommendation* and OPC's *Response and Request*.
- 6. On December 9, the Commission issued its Order granting the Department's *Application*.
- 7. The Department has reviewed materials regarding the PWS and the Staff's *Memorandum*.
- 8. Along with noting that the "storage tank is in poor condition, and an inspection and rehabilitation of that facility is the most critical of all issues pertaining to the system", the Staff's *Memorandum* further commented:
 - a. The distribution system is "of galvanized iron pipes of various sizes to transport water from the storage tank and high service pump to customers;"

- b. "OCWC has not yet formulated a specific schedule to undertake the work" to perform necessary rehabilitation, repairs and improvements to the PWS.
- 9. The Department does not object to the transfer of assets; nevertheless, the Department requests that the Commission include the following recommendations in its final Order granting transfer of assets, or that these recommendations are agreed to in writing by UWRBF and OCWC prior to the issuance of a final Order:
 - a. Prior to the transfer of any assets, a visual inspection is performed of the interior of the storage tank by a certified water storage tank inspector to evaluate both the interior and exterior condition of the tank, to inform what "specific schedule" should be adopted;¹
 - b. A complete "wash out" inspection of the interior of the tank, to be conducted by a certified water storage tank inspector, be scheduled as soon as possible;
 - c. The rehabilitation or replacement of the storage tower be scheduled to occur as soon as possible, as informed by the visual inspection, and that a formal deadline for rehabilitation or replacement

¹ The Department currently believes, and is unaware of any records or statements to the contrary, that a simple visual inspection of the interior of the tank has not occurred since at least some unknown date prior to 2007.

is adopted by OCWC and or incorporated in the Commission's a final Order;

d. Within one year, perform an inspection of at least 5% of the total distribution system for structural integrity and signs of corrosion.² WHEREFORE, The Department respectfully requests its recommendations be incorporated into the Commission's Order granting transfer of the assets.
