SOUTHWESTERN BELL TELEPHONE COMPANY'S CONCURRING STATEMENT

In its Order regarding Application for Rehearing and Stay issued August 5, 1998 in this case, the Missouri Public Service Commission directed the Applicants in this case to file a pleading setting out: (A) the exact nature of the stay requested and remedies sought; (B) the nature of any "protest" or "challenge" to the assessment payments and whether the protests goes only to the increased portion of the assessment or the entirety of the assessment; (C) details setting out the total amount of "Article X" distribution received by each Applicant to date; and (D) legal authority in support of the respective applicant's argument(s) on each issue, e.g. authority in support of the stay, the protest and other legal issues.

In conformance with the Commission's August 5 Order, the Applicants filed their Responsive Statement of Joint Applicants on August 31, 1998. At the September 2, 1998 prehearing conference, the Commission granted intervention to various parties, including Southwestern Bell Telephone Company. In addition, the Commission requested the parties to whom it granted intervenor status to file pleadings providing their position on the questions it posed to the Applicants in its August 5 Order. In conformance with the Commission's request at the September prehearing, Southwestern Bell respectfully states:

A. <u>Nature of the Stay Requested and the Remedy Sought</u>. Southwestern Bell concurs with the Applicants that the Commission should stay the effectiveness of its June 29, 1998

Supplemental Order No. 52 in Commission Case No. 11,110 given the nature of the questions presented concerning the proper administration of the Public Service Commission Fund.

Southwestern Bell agrees that it would be appropriate for the Commission to stay the effectiveness of its assessment order to the extent that the assessments have been increased by the Article X transfers. Southwestern Bell also concurs that the ultimate remedy sought is that the Commission, after conducting an appropriate proceeding concerning the propriety of the assessments, issue a new supplemental order consistent with the evidence presented and the applicable law. Southwestern Bell also believes that a full evidentiary hearing may not be necessary because the basic facts will likely not be in dispute. It may therefore be possible to present the matter to the Commission on a stipulation of facts and brief the legal issues.

- B. Nature of the Protest. Southwestern Bell's primary concern is with the increase in utility assessments due to Article X transfers. Like the Applicants, Southwestern Bell questions the propriety of using monies regulated utilities have paid into the Public Service Commission Fund to facilitate tax refunds to the general public mandated by Mo. Const. Art. X, Sections 16-24 (the Hancock Amendment).
- C. Article X Distributions Received. Southwestern Bell concurs with the Applicants that the total amount of Article X distributions received by the Applicants and Intervenors is irrelevant to whether the Article X transfers out of the fund by the Commission were authorized by law, and whether the Article X transfers are expenses "to be incurred" by the Commission in the coming fiscal year or are "reasonably attributable to the regulation of public utilities" as those phrases are used in Section 386.370.1 RSMo (1997 Supp.). But without waiving these objections

to the relevance of the information requested, the total amount of Article X distributions received by Southwestern Bell Telephone Company for the 1995 and 1996 tax years are as follows:

1995 - \$628,586 1996 - \$667,452

D. <u>Legal Authority</u>. Southwestern Bell concurs with the citation of legal authority provided by joint Applicants in their August 31, 1998 Responsive Statement of Joint Applicants. Southwestern Bell also reserves the right to raise additional issues and provide legal authority as they may come to its attention.
