ORDER SCHEDULING A PROCEDURAL CONFERENCE

On January 30, 2013, the Complainants filed a complaint against Kansas City Power & Light Company (KCP&L). That complaint alleges that KCP&L is out of compliance with Commission Rule 4 CSR 240-20.100(7)(B)1.F in that its 2012-2014 RES Compliance Plan fails to include a detailed explanation of the RES retail impact limitation or one percent cost comparison. KCP&L filed its answer to that complaint on March 4. The Commission now must determine how to proceed to consider that complaint.

To assist in that determination, the Commission will schedule a procedural conference at which the parties may discuss whether there are any factual matters in dispute, whether an evidentiary hearing is necessary, and when any such hearing or other procedure shall occur. This procedural conference will be held in conjunction with procedural conferences regarding similar complaints against KCP&L Greater Missouri

Operations Company in Case No. EC-2013-0380, Ameren Missouri in Case No. EC-2013-0381, and The Empire District Electric Company in Case No. EC-2013-0382.

THE COMMISSION ORDERS THAT:

1. A procedural conference is scheduled for March 28, 2013, at 10:30 a.m., at the Commission's office at the Governor Office Building, 200 Madison Street, Jefferson City, Missouri, Room 305. This building meets accessibility standards required by the Americans with Disabilities Act.
