Dear Judge Woodruff:

The Commission issued an Order Approving Stipulations and Agreements on March 9, 2022, effective March 19, 2022, and issued a *Report and Order* in this general rate case on April 6, 2022, effective April 16, 2022. Compliance tariff sheets were submitted and approved and are now in effect, implementing Liberty's authorized annual revenue requirement increase of \$35,515,913.

Liberty, however, requested an effective date of October 15, 2022, for its transportation electrification tariff sheets. Those tariff sheets have not yet been approved. On June 17, 2022, Staff made its filing recommending approval of the transportation electrification tariff sheets. So that Liberty may begin educating its customers regarding the transportation electrification program, Liberty requests that the Commission approve the transportation electrification tariff sheets at this time, but with the tariff sheets to take effect October 15, 2022.

Additionally, the Company discovered that a revised tariff sheet was inadvertently not filed to reflect the updates associated with the settlement terms pertaining to Liberty's Low Income Pilot Program (paragraph 11 of the fourth stipulation). To implement these changes, Liberty is submitting the following revised tariff sheet with a proposed effective date thirty days after filing (July 31, 2022): PSC MO No. 6, Section 4, 1st Revised Sheet No. 24. A redlined version is attached hereto for reference and was provided in advance of filing for review by the Staff of the Commission and the Office of the Public Counsel.
