- 1 PROCEEDINGS
- JUDGE STEARLEY: Good morning. Today is
- 3 Monday, March 9th, 2009, and we're here for a prehearing
- 4 conference in the case captioned Jacor Contracting,
- 5 Incorporated, Complainant, versus Nuvox Communications of
- 6 Missouri, Incorporated and Southwestern Bell Company,
- 7 doing business as AT&T, are the Respondents, and this is
- 8 File No. CC-2009-0238 (sic).
- 9 My name is Harold Stearley and I'm the
- 10 presiding officer over this matter, and our court reporter
- 11 this morning is Pat Stewart.
- 12 We shall begin by taking entries of
- 13 appearance, beginning with Jacor Contracting.
- 14 MR. SKEENS: This is David Skeens of
- 15 Walters, Bender, Strohbehn & Vaughan on behalf of Jacor
- 16 Contracting.
- 17 JUDGE STEARLEY: Thank you, Mr. Skeens.
- Nuvox Communications.
- 19 MR. LUMLEY: Good morning. Let the record
- 20 reflect the appearance of Carl Lumley on behalf of Nuvox
- 21 Communications of Missouri, Inc.
- 22 And, Judge, I think you may have misspoke
- 23 about the case number.
- 24 JUDGE STEARLEY: Oh. Did I read that off
- 25 wrong?

- 1 MR. LUMLEY: Unless it's changed.
- JUDGE STEARLEY: Pardon me. I certainly
- 3 did. 0128.
- 4 Thank you for calling my attention to that.
- 5 I tend to recycle our documents, and that will happen
- 6 occasionally.
- 7 AT&T Missouri.
- 8 MR. GRYZMALA: Good morning, Your Honor.
- 9 Bob Gryzmala on behalf of Southwestern Bell Telephone
- 10 Company d/b/a AT&T Missouri.
- 11 Thank you.
- 12 JUDGE STEARLEY: Thank you, Mr. Gryzmala.
- 13 Staff of the Missouri Public Service
- 14 Commission.
- 15 MS. HERNANDEZ: Jennifer Hernandez on behalf
- 16 of the Staff of the Missouri Public Service Commission.
- 17 Thank you.
- JUDGE STEARLEY: Thank you, Ms. Hernandez.
- 19 And let the record reflect that no one is
- 20 present for the Office of Public Counsel.
- 21 Briefly let me kind of run through the
- 22 status of the case as it stands now.
- 23 From my understanding Jacor has had an issue
- 24 with service disruptions, which has now been corrected,
- 25 but Nuvox -- or Nuvox in addressing their complaint has

- 1 asked that we dismiss their complaint and has filed a
- 2 cross-complaint against AT&T. AT&T has asked us to
- 3 dismiss Jacor's complaint and has filed a cross-claim
- 4 against Nuvox. And Staff has not really expressed a
- 5 position on Jacor's complaint but has spoken of possibly a
- 6 separate complaint of its own regarding potential
- 7 violations of Section 392.200.
- 8 Is that a pretty fair summary of where we're
- 9 at right now?
- 10 MS. HERNANDEZ: I believe that's correct,
- 11 Your Honor.
- 12 JUDGE STEARLEY: Okay. I guess at this
- 13 point the Commission, in wanting to figure out how it's
- 14 going to go with this, wants to kind of focus back on
- 15 Jacor's original complaint to begin with.
- 16 And, Mr. Skeens, I guess I'm going to direct
- 17 some homework to the parties here so we can figure out
- 18 where we're going.
- MR. SKEENS: Okay.
- 20 JUDGE STEARLEY: You all will have an
- 21 opportunity once I leave the room, of course, to discuss
- 22 this fully, and you may reach some other decisions on how
- 23 you may wish to proceed.
- 24 But if you decide to proceed with your
- 25 individual complaint, what I'd like you to do is file a

- 1 status report with the Commission by next Monday, the
- 2 16th, and I'd like you to state in that status report with
- 3 particularity the grounds of your continued complaint and
- 4 what you're requesting for relief.
- 5 MR. SKEENS: Okay.
- JUDGE STEARLEY: And as you probably know,
- 7 the other parties may contest what relief is available to
- 8 you through this Commission.
- 9 If you're going to proceed, then I'm going
- 10 to ask Staff to file this, but all of the parties will
- 11 file with the Commission a joint stipulation of all
- 12 noncontested material facts regarding your complaint no
- 13 later than March 30th.
- 14 And if you believe there are disputed issues
- 15 or factual issues of material fact for us, I want you to
- 16 individually file a list of what you believe is disputed
- 17 with the Commission by April the 6th.
- 18 That way the Commission can decide if we're
- 19 looking at issues of fact which require a hearing or if
- 20 we're just looking at legal issues which can be decided
- 21 without a hearing.
- Now, with regard to Nuvox and AT&T in your
- 23 cross-complaints, by Monday, March 16th I will direct you
- 24 to show cause why your cross-complaints shouldn't be
- 25 handled in a separate case as opposed to continuing

- 1 forward with Jacor's case.
- Obviously, you're asking for this case to be
- 3 dismissed, their complaint to be dismissed, and it seems
- 4 that your complaints could be handled in a separate
- 5 matter.
- And I give the same assignment to Staff. If
- 7 you're wanting to file a separate complaint for alleged
- 8 statutory violations, it may involve Jacor for issues of
- 9 fact, perhaps for witnesses for your case, that the
- 10 Commission is not sure that that needs to continue under
- 11 this case file.
- 12 So I'll ask that you file a pleading stating
- 13 if you intend to seek your complaint in a separate action
- 14 or if you want it to go forward under this case as
- 15 captioned and, if so, why.
- 16 So, once again, we have parties asking that
- 17 this case be dismissed.
- 18 MS. HERNANDEZ: What date was that again?
- 19 JUDGE STEARLEY: March 16th, next Monday.
- MS. HERNANDEZ: Thank you.
- 21 All right. Do any of you have questions for
- 22 me regarding those instructions?
- MR. GRYZMALA: Just a recap for AT&T, Your
- 24 Honor, just to make sure.
- On behalf of AT&T and, presumably, Nuvox,

- 1 our operating deadline is March 16 --
- JUDGE STEARLEY: Right.
- 3 MR. GRYZMALA: -- to show cause why our
- 4 particular matters of dispute can't be handled separately
- 5 rather than in this particular file number?
- JUDGE STEARLEY: Correct.
- 7 MR. GRYZMALA: Thank you.
- JUDGE STEARLEY: And it could be -- I mean,
- 9 in terms of you showing cause, if you decide that you will
- 10 go forward in a separate matter, you can simply dismiss
- 11 your complaints under this case caption and go ahead and
- 12 proceed to file something. Whatever is more expedient for
- 13 you in addressing that. I don't want to make you all
- 14 repeat your work.
- 15 Any other clarifications?
- 16 MR. LUMLEY: Judge, just kind of thinking
- 17 hypothetically. If we end up with some filings on
- 18 April 6th of remaining disputed facts, do you also want us
- 19 to work at that time on some kind of schedule, or are we
- 20 going to save that for later?
- JUDGE STEARLEY: I'd save that for later,
- 22 because the Commission may decide based on your filings
- 23 that it may not have a hearing. So at that point we'll go
- 24 from there and see what your filings reflect.
- 25 If it appears the Commission wants to have a

- 1 hearing, we'll set another prehearing conference. And,
- 2 actually, at this point we'll just probably go ahead and
- 3 ask for a procedural schedule since we've already had the
- 4 opportunity to meet in this conference.
- 5 Mr. Skeens, are you clear with those
- 6 instructions?
- 7 MR. SKEENS: I believe I am, Your Honor.
- JUDGE STEARLEY: Okay. Are there any
- 9 matters that the Commission needs to address from you-all
- 10 at this time that we haven't discussed?
- MR. GRYZMALA: Your Honor, if I might add:
- 12 I noticed, if I wrote correctly, you had asked Jacor to
- 13 state with particularity the grounds of their complaint
- 14 and the relief that they're requesting by March 16th.
- 15 I wonder if the court -- if Your Honor means
- 16 also to encompass in that discussion why Jacor might
- 17 believe that its claim would survive AT&T's motion --
- 18 JUDGE STEARLEY: Exactly. And that's what I
- 19 was getting at by stating with particularity, because we
- 20 do already have two motions to dismiss their complaint
- 21 before us.
- So, Mr. Skeens, like I noted, if you plan to
- 23 continue -- if Jacor plans to continue with its complaint,
- 24 the Commission wants to know specifically on what grounds
- 25 you believe your complaint survives the motions to

- 2 MR. SKEENS: Okay.
- JUDGE STEARLEY: -- and specifically what
- 4 relief, then, you're requesting the Commission to provide.
- 5 MR. SKEENS: As I've confessed to anybody in
- 6 this case before, at least the opposing parties and
- 7 Ms. Hernandez as well, that for 20 years I've been a
- 8 commercial litigator, but I haven't really practiced much
- 9 before this Commission. This is the first time.
- 10 And so, you know, I have read the rules and
- 11 looked at some of the cases to determine what relief I
- 12 believe that you-all can give and things like that.
- 13 And what I do -- and I'll just ask -- I
- 14 understand that I'm not entitled to any monetary relief
- 15 from the Public Service Commission, at least that's what I
- 16 believe to be indicated from the things I looked at.
- 17 Secondly, what I would be interested in
- 18 continuing on is to have a finding of a violation of 392
- 19 by the Commission. And if you're telling me that that's a
- 20 finding that -- you know, I'm welcome to anybody to tell
- 21 me, no, that's not anything you can still go forward with
- 22 now.
- 23 But if it is something that I can ask that
- 24 Commission to make a finding of, that would be the basis
- on which I would continue this matter, realizing that

- 1 should I want to seek monetary damages, that I'm going to
- 2 have to go to one of the circuit courts here in the State
- 3 of Missouri to do that.
- 4 JUDGE STEARLEY: Okay.
- 5 MR. SKEENS: That's my understanding of the
- 6 lay of the land right now, but I would welcome anybody to
- 7 tell me I'm wrong.
- 8 JUDGE STEARLEY: Okay. And when I leave
- 9 here, Mr. Skeens, you can continue that discussion with
- 10 the parties and perhaps Ms. Hernandez, because that, I
- 11 believe, is the basis of what they're considering a
- 12 separate complaint for, and it may be that the two of you
- 13 can work together with that regard.
- MR. SKEENS: Okay. And just to be clear,
- 15 because I had -- you know, it's my -- I chose not to come
- 16 down there, so it's my issue that I didn't hear real well.
- 17 What I think -- I'm not even sure if it was
- 18 Bob or Carl who was saying this, but the clarification
- 19 they wanted with respect to what we were to do, but that
- 20 is, by this filing a week from today we are to not only
- 21 state what relief we continue to be seeking but also set
- 22 forth whatever opposition we believe exists as to the
- 23 motions to dismiss. Is that correct?
- JUDGE STEARLEY: That's correct.
- MR. SKEENS: Okay. Thank you.

```

- 2 other matters we need to take up at this time?
- Go ahead, Mr. Gryzmala.
- 4 MR. GRYZMALA: Your Honor, I would just
- 5 entertain a discussion on a procedural matter.
- 6 Mr. Lumley and I are to submit a statement
- 7 as to why these can't be handled separately. I noticed
- 8 that that's due on the same day as Jacor's pleading is
- 9 due. I wonder -- and I don't know what Mr. Lumley's
- 10 feeling might be on that, if maybe filing --
- JUDGE STEARLEY: We can give you a couple
- 12 other days.
- MR. GRYZMALA: -- that it might be deferred
- 14 until the uncontested issues of fact on March 30th.
- I'm just throwing this out, because I'm
- 16 thinking, I'm sitting at my desk on March 16th with a
- 17 filing due the same day on which I'm going to hear from
- 18 Jacor. I'm just wondering if maybe we got a week or two.
- 19 I don't know. It's just a thought.
- JUDGE STEARLEY: Okay.
- MR. GRYZMALA: I'm not saying --
- JUDGE STEARLEY: Is it your preference of
- 23 one or two weeks? I can make it March 23rd or we can make
- 24 it March 30th.
- 25 MR. LUMLEY: I think it might be helpful for

- 1 us to have the March 23rd deadline because it would affect
- 2 what kind of facts we might have to stipulate to by the
- 3 30th.
- JUDGE STEARLEY: Okay. Why don't we go with
- 5 that.
- 6 MR. GRYZMALA: Thank you, Your Honor.
- 7 MS. HERNANDEZ: And would you be changing
- 8 our date as well, Staff's date, to the 23rd?
- 9 JUDGE STEARLEY: What date would you be
- 10 seeking, Ms. Hernandez? What would give you adequate
- 11 time?
- 12 MS. HERNANDEZ: Well, I'm agreeable
- 13 with March 23rd. That's fine. If there is going to
- 14 be filings on the 16th by Jacor, I would appreciate the
- 15 time for Staff to review those and then respond on March
- 16 23rd.
- 17 JUDGE STEARLEY: Okay. We'll make your
- 18 deadline March 23rd then as well.
- 19 All right. Anything else we need to take up
- 20 at this time?
- 21 All right. Well, hearing none, we will
- 22 conclude the on-the-record portion of the prehearing
- 23 conference, and I'll leave you-all to your discussions.
- 24 We thank you very much.
- MR. SKEENS: Thank you, Your Honor.

3	prehearing conference was concluded.)
