Dear Mr. Van Eschen:

The 2007 Video Services Providers Act ("the Video Act") requires video service providers that have "more than one million telecommunications access lines" in the state and use telecommunications facilities to provide the service to file an annual report regarding its progress made toward complying with the requirement that it provide access to its video service to at least 25% of the households in its telecommunications service area within three years of the date it began providing video service, and to not less than 50% of such households within six years.¹

The Commission authorized AT&T Missouri to provide video service effective November 16, 2007, in Case No. KA-2008-0112, and AT&T Missouri began providing video service in the Kansas City, Missouri area on the same day. As of November 16, 2014, AT&T Missouri provided access to its video service to approximately 49% of the households situated in AT&T Missouri's telecommunications service area.

¹ However, video service providers are not required to meet the 50% requirement until two years after at least 30% of the households with access to the provider's video service subscribe to the service for six consecutive months.
