## ORDER SUSPENDING PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE

Issue Date May 23, 2008

Effective Date: May 23, 2008

A hearing on Kansas City Power & Light Company's application for a waiver or variance regarding the rates it may charge certain all-electric and electric heating customers is set to begin on June 24, 2008. The procedural schedule leading up to that hearing requires the parties to file rebuttal testimony by May 30. On May 22, the Staff of the Commission filed a motion asking that the procedural schedule be suspended.


Staff's motion explains that two intervenors, Missouri Gas Energy and Trigen-Kansas City Energy Corporation, have filed motions to dismiss KCPL's application. The Commission has indicated at agenda that it intends to vote on an order granting those motions and dismissing the application at its May 29 agenda meeting. So that the parties do not spend time and resources preparing testimony for a case that may be dismissed before the testimony can be filed, Staff asks that the procedural schedule be suspended. Staff represents that no party objects to its motion.

Staff's motion is reasonable and is not opposed by any party. It will be granted.

**IT IS ORDERED THAT:**

1. The procedural schedule previously established for this case is indefinitely suspended. Specifically, the parties are relieved of the obligation to file rebuttal testimony on May 30, 2008.
2. This order shall become effective on May 23, 2008.
