- 2 A. My name is Nancy J. Moore. I am Vice President of Customer Services at
- 3 Kansas City Power & Light Company. My business address is 801 Charlotte
- 4 Street, Kansas City, Missouri 64106.
- 5 Q. ON WHOSE BEHALF ARE YOU TESTIFYING?
- 6 A. I am testifying on behalf of KCPL.
- 7 Q. WHAT IS YOUR EDUCATIONAL BACKGROUND AND EXPERIENCE?
- 8 A. I graduated from Central Missouri State University with a Bachelors of Science
- 9 degree in Education in 1971. In 1998, I earned my Masters of Business
- Administration from Rockhurst College. I began my career with KCPL in 1974
- as a secretary in the Personnel Services department. In 1980, I was promoted to
- Supervisor of Training & Development; I became Manager of Corporate Training
- in 1982. In 1988, I was named Assistant Manager of Distribution, Construction &
- Maintenance. I was appointed Manager of Metering Services in 1989, and
- Manager of Customer Services at the F&M/Northland Service Centers in 1991. I
- became the Director of Internal Services & Purchasing in 1998, then Senior
- Director of Customer Services in 1999. I assumed my current position as Vice
- President of Customer Services in 2000.

- Q. WHAT IS THE PURPOSE OF YOUR DIRECT TESTIMONY IN THIS
 PROCEEDING?
- 3 A. I sponsor Section V, and accompanying schedules, of the Organizational Report 4 that is attached to the Direct Testimony of A. Drue Jennings.
- 5 Q. DO YOU SERVE ON ANY OF THE RESTRUCTURING TEAMS
 6 REFERENCED IN MS. LATZ'S DIRECT TESTIMONY?
- 7 A. Yes, I am a member of the Delivery/Customer Services Group, as well as the
 8 Infrastructure & Services Group.
- 9 Q. IF KCPL'S PROPOSED REORGANIZATION PLAN IS APPROVED BY THE
 10 RELEVANT REGULATORY AGENCIES, WILL KCPL DELIVERY BE
 11 OBLIGATED TO PROVIDE DISTRIBUTION AND TRANSMISSION
 12 SERVICES TO CUSTOMERS RESIDING IN KCPL'S CURRENT
 13 CERTIFICATED SERVICE AREA?
- 14 A. Yes. KCPL Delivery will be obligated to provide distribution and transmission services to retail customers within KCPL's current service territory. In fact 15 KCPL Delivery's retail customers will continue to receive electric service 16 17 pursuant to tariffs approved by the Missouri Public Service Commission and the Kansas Corporation Commission. In addition to providing reliable and reasonably 18 priced distribution and transmission services, KCPL Delivery will also be 19 responsible for procuring an adequate and reliable electric supply for those 20 customers that reside in KCPL's current service territory. 21

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5 ADEQUATE AND RELIABLE ELECTRIC SUPPLY.

- A. KCPL Delivery and KCPL Power will enter into a power supply agreement that obligates KCPL Power to serve native load. A form of power supply agreement is scheduled to be filed with the Commission in March, 2001. The charges in the power supply agreement will be based on KCPL's costs of generating electricity. KCPL Delivery customers will have access to the best available rates because KCPL Delivery plans to seek competitive bids for incremental load growth and, to the extent possible, for existing load. In other words, if a wholesale competitor of KCPL Power can sell reliable energy and capacity to KCPL Delivery cheaper than KCPL Power, KCPL Delivery will buy the cheaper power. The benefits of cheaper power will flow to KCPL Delivery's customers.
- 16 Q. PLEASE DESCRIBE KCPL DELIVERY'S CORPORATE STRUCTURE.
- 17 A. KCPL Delivery will be a wholly-owned subsidiary of HoldingCo. The company
 18 will own distribution and transmission assets. KCPL Delivery will provide
 19 distribution and transmission services to retail customers who are currently being
 20 served by KCPL. This will include customer service, credit and collection, and
 21 community relations functions. The company will consist of four core areas:
 22 Manage and Control, Asset Management, Retail Operations, and Support Services
 23 & Administration.

- Q. WILL KCPL DELIVERY CONSIDER TAKING COMPETITIVE BIDS FOR
 SERVICES PROVIDED BY HOLDINGCO?
- As I have stated earlier, KCPL Delivery will be a wholly-owned subsidiary of 3 A. HoldingCo. It has been determined that the services provided by the Corporate 4 Services unit of HoldingCo are critical to the long-term health of HoldingCo and its corporate subsidiaries. Accordingly, none of HoldingCo's subsidiaries will be 6 permitted to bid out these vital services. However, the same is not true for the 7 services offered by the Shared Services unit of HoldingCo. The management of 8 9 KCPL Delivery will carefully scrutinize the quality and cost of the services 10 provided by the Shared Services unit. Under the appropriate circumstances, KCPL Delivery will seek competitive bids for the services provided by the Shared 11 Services unit. 12
- 13 Q. DOES THIS CONCLUDE YOUR TESTIMONY?
- 14 A. Yes.
