## ORDER ESTABLISHING TIME TO RESPOND TO OBJECTIONS TO PROPOSED PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE

Issue Date: April 1, 2008 Effective Date: April 1, 2008

On January 23, 2008, Kansas City Power & Light Company applied for a waiver or variance regarding the rates it may charge certain all-electric and electric heating customers. The Commission has allowed several interested parties to intervene. At a prehearing conference held on March 24, the presiding officer directed the parties to file a proposed procedural schedule by March 31.

On March 31, KCPL, Staff, Public Counsel, and Missouri Gas Energy filed a proposed procedural schedule that would lead to an evidentiary hearing on June 25 and 26, 2008. On the same date, Trigen-Kansas City Energy Corporation filed a pleading objecting to the establishment of any procedural schedule at this time. Trigen explains that it intends to file a dispositive motion by April 18, which if granted would eliminate the need for a further procedural schedule. Trigen also objected to various specific elements of the procedural schedule proposed by the other parties.

Commission Rule 4 CSR 240-2.080(15) allows parties not more than ten days to respond to any pleading unless otherwise ordered by the Commission. Because of the need for a prompt resolution of this matter, the Commission would like act regarding the

proposed procedural schedule at its April 8 agenda meeting. Therefore, the Commission will shorten the time allowed to respond to Trigen's pleading and the proposed procedural schedule.

## IT IS ORDERED THAT:

- 1. Any party wishing to respond to the Proposed Procedural Schedule or to Trigen-Kansas City Energy Corporation's Objection to the Establishment of Procedural Schedule shall do so no later than 1:00 p.m. on April 4, 2008.
  - 2. This order shall become effective on April 1, 2008.
