2	JUDGE MILLS: We're on the record this
3	morning to resume the briefly resume the hearing in
4	Case No. EC-2002-1.
5	The parties have this morning filed a
6	Stipulation and Agreement that resolves all issues
7	with most of the parties. There are at least two
8	parties that are not signatories, that being Kansas

- 9 City Power & Light Company and Laclede Gas Company.
- 10 I've had representations from some of the parties that
- 11 are signatories that neither of those utilities are
- 12 likely to oppose the Stipulation or request a hearing
- on it pursuant to 4 CSR 240-2.110, but, of course,
- 14 that rule does give them five days for that
- 15 opportunity.
- 16 Mr. Fi scher?
- 17 MR. FISCHER: Your Honor, on behalf of
- 18 Kansas City Power & Light Company, I confirm that, as
- 19 far as my client is concerned, we will be making a
- 20 filing saying we neither support nor oppose the
- 21 Stipulation and Agreement and we will waive our right
- to a hearing.
- 23 JUDGE MILLS: Certainly that will help with
- 24 the time if we don't have to wait the full five days.
