ORDER GRANTING LEAVE FOR ATTORNEY OF RECORD TO WITHDRAW

On June 22, 2006,¹ the Staff of the Missouri Public Service Commission filed a motion requesting that the Commission establish a case, provide notice, set an intervention deadline and schedule an early prehearing conference for the purpose of determining whether to adopt the Time-Based Metering and Communications Standard established in Section 1252 of the Energy Policy Act of 2005 ("EPAct"). The Commission granted Staff's motion on June 23. Union Electric Company d/b/a AmerenUE ("AmerenUE") filed a timely request to intervene and was granted intervention on August 2.

On November 15, AmerenUE filed a motion requesting that David Kurtz be removed as an attorney of record in this matter and that he be allowed to withdraw. AmerenUE states that reason for its request is that Mr. Kurtz is no longer associated with the firm of Smith Lewis, L.L.P.
