ORDER GRANTING APPLICATIONS TO INTERVENE

On June 20, 2013, Kansas City Power & Light Company ("KCP&L") filed its 2013 Integrated Resource Plan Annual Update. On July 10, Missouri Industrial Energy Consumers ("MIEC") filed an application to intervene. Earth Island Institute d/b/a Renew Missouri filed also filed an application to intervene the following day.

MIEC pleads that its members are large industrial customers of KCP&L and, thus, it has an interest different from that of the general public that may be adversely affected by a final order in this file. Renew Missouri pleads that it has an interest in the environmental, economic, business and health benefits of energy efficiency and, thus, it has an interest different from that of the general public that may be adversely affected by a final order in this file.

Commission Rule 4 CSR 240-2.080(15) allows parties ten days to respond to motions. No party objected to the applications. Therefore, the Commission will take them up unopposed.


Commission Rule 4 CSR 240-2.075(4) allows the Commission to grant intervention to a person who has an interest different from that of the general public and which may be adversely affected by a final order arising from the case, or if granting intervention would serve the public interest. Upon review of the unopposed applications, the Commission

finds that the applicants meet the standard in Commission Rule 4 CSR 240-2.075(4).
Therefore, the Commission will grant the applications to intervene.

THE COMMISSION ORDERS THAT:

1. The applications to intervene filed by Missouri Industrial Energy Consumers and by Earth Island Institute d/b/a Renew Missouri are granted.
2. This order shall become effective upon issuance.
