ORDER ESTABLISHING TIME TO RESPOND TO MOTION TO FURTHER EXTEND AUTHORITY

In December 1998, the Commission approved a stipulation and agreement in this case that authorized Union Electric Company to manage its inventory of sulfer dioxide (SO₂) emissions allowances issued under the federal Clean Air Act. Subsequently, the EPA issued its Clean Air Interstate Rule (CAIR) that created similar emissions allowances for Nitrogen Oxide (NOx). On October 26, 2011, the Commission issued an order granting Union Electric authority to sell or trade its NOx allowances, anticipating that those NOx allowances under CAIR would expire at the end of this year when it was expected that the EPA's new Cross-State Air Pollution Rule (CSAPR) would be in effect.

On June 13, 2012, Union Electric Company, d/b/a Ameren Missouri filed a motion explaining that the EPA's CSAPR has been blocked by court action and that while it is blocked, CAIR remains in effect. The EPA has issued Ameren Missouri additional NOx allowances under CAIR that the company now seeks authority to sell or trade.

Ameren Missouri requests that the Commission grant it the additional authority it seeks as soon as possible as delay will compromise its ability to negotiate the most favorable terms for the sale or trade of its excess NOx allowances. The company represents that the other parties to this case, Staff, Public Counsel and Kansas City Power & Light Company, support its request for authority to sell its unused NOx allowances, subject to certain conditions specified in the motion.

Since Ameren Missouri's motion represents that the other parties, including Staff, support its request, the Commission will not require Staff to file a formal recommendation. The Commission will however establish a date by which any party wishing to object to Ameren Missouri's motion shall do so.

THE COMMISSION ORDERS THAT:

1. Any party wishing to object to or otherwise respond to Ameren Missouri's Motion to Further Extend Authority for the Disposition of NOx Allowances shall do so no later than June 19, 2012.

2. This order shall become effective immediately upon issuance.
