On July 24, 2009, Union Electric Company, d/b/a AmerenUE, filed a tariff designed to increase its annual revenues for electric service. The Commission suspended that tariff and established August 17 as the deadline for interested parties to apply to intervene.

The International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers Locals 2, 309, 649, 702, 1439, 1455, AFL-CIO and International Union of Operating Engineers Local 148, AFL-CIO (Unions) applied to intervene on August 13. The Unions are labor organizations that represent a large number of non-managerial, construction, production, and maintenance employees at a variety of Ameren's Missouri and Illinois facilities. More than ten days have passed since the Unions applied to intervene and no party has objected to that application.

The Commission finds that the interest of the Unions in this case is different from that of the general public, and may be adversely affected by a final order arising from this case. Furthermore, the Commission finds that allowing the Unions to intervene will serve the public interest. Therefore, in accordance with Commission Rule 4 CSR 240-2.075(4), the Commission will grant the application to intervene.

THE COMMISSION ORDERS THAT:

1. The Application to Intervene by The International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers Locals 2, 309, 649, 702, 1439, 1455, AFL-CIO and International Union of Operating Engineers Local 148, AFL-CIO is granted.

2. This order shall become effective immediately upon issuance.
