ORDER GRANTING THE APPLICATION TO INTERVENE OF THE MIDWEST ENERGY USER'S ASSOCIATION

On July 24, 2009, Union Electric Company, d/b/a AmerenUE, filed a tariff designed to increase its annual revenues for electric service. The Commission suspended that tariff and established August 17 as the deadline for interested parties to apply to intervene.

The Midwest Energy User's Association (MEUA) applied to intervene on August 17.

MEUA is an unincorporated association of large users of electricity, some of whom are customers of AmerenUE.¹ More than ten days have passed since MEUA applied to intervene and no party has objected to that application.

The Commission finds that the interest of MEUA in this case is different from that of the general public, and may be adversely affected by a final order arising from this case. Furthermore, the Commission finds that allowing MEUA to intervene will serve the public interest. Therefore, in accordance with Commission Rule 4 CSR 240-2.075(4), the Commission will grant the application to intervene.

- 1. The Application to Intervene of The Midwest Energy User's Association is granted.
