## ORDER GRANTING INTERVENTION AND APPLICATION FOR LEAVE TO APPEAR PRO HAC VICE

On October 1, 2014, Union Electric Company, d/b/a Ameren Missouri (“Ameren”) filed its 2014 Integrated Resource Plan (“IRP”). The Commission received an intervention request from Converge, Inc.. Ameren did not object.

Commission Rule 4 CSR 240-2.075(4) allows the Commission to grant intervention to a person who has an interest different from that of the general public and which may be adversely affected by a final order arising from the case, or if granting intervention would serve the public interest. Upon review of the unopposed application, the Commission finds that the applicant meets the standard in Commission Rule 4 CSR 240-2.075(4). Therefore, the Commission will grant the application to intervene.

Further, the Commission has received an application for admission *pro hac vice* from Patrick N. Giordano, who wishes to represent Converge in this matter. The applicant designates Thomas Loraine, a member of The Missouri Bar, as associate counsel. A receipt indicating the applicant's payment of the fees required by Missouri Supreme Court Rule 6.01(m) has been filed.

The Commission finds that the application for admission complies with the requirements of 4 CSR 240-2.040(3)(C) and with Missouri Supreme Court rules 6.01(m) and 9.03. The applicant is granted leave to appear.

**THE COMMISSION ORDERS THAT:**

1. The application to intervene filed by Converge, Inc., is granted.
2. The application to appear pro hac vice filed by Patrick N. Giordano is granted.
3. This order shall be effective when issued.
